What is the Fun Wagon?

EF&GA is exploring the feasibility of having steel targets on the pistol range for casual shooting. With safety being the primary concern, the concept of using a shielded enclosure to contain fragments was presented at the Dec 7, 2023 Board meeting. The concept received Board approval for initial testing and evaluation. During the initial test phase, the setup will not be available for general membership use, as the configuration will likely be undergoing some adjustments. Assuming safety requirements are met, the system would enter a public evaluation phase and would be open to members who have completed some tailored safety training.

Theoretically, the system will be installed for initial (closed) evaluation the second quarter of 2024, followed by general membership use into the third quarter provided the safety gates are cleared. The initial test system has been fabricated with donated resources at no cost to the Association. Class Description:

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.


Ancestor Life – Hunter's Firearm Intensive 4/17/24 (8 am)


Course Description:




NRA Women on Target 4/28/2024 (8 am – 2 pm) Class Description:



RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello Everyone,

The First Aid Kits on the Pistol Range, Trap Ramada front door, 100 yard range and 150 yard range were removed and thoroughly cleaned. They were then

restocked with new supplies. The combination locks have been removed. If you need to use them please make sure the door is latched and secured when you're finished.

If there are Law Enforcement or Security vehicles parked at the 150 yard range they are there for training. They have been approved by the Board of Directors for training including "Rapid Fire". Please do not approach or contact them to see how they are training. No spectators are allowed.

Members pay attention to your guests. You are responsible for their behavior on the property.

Blue Blinking Lights on or off applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking Lights are on, do not unload firearms or gear. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot. Then you can unload your firearms and gear.

The Green Sheets. If you sign any of the Green Sheets and the Date and Range fields are not filled in, fill in the Date and Range. There are STILL Green Sheets being turned in with no Date and Range information filled in.

All shooters remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area.

Watch for Turkeys and Deer on the range.

Make sure that what you bring with you to the range, you also take back home with you.

Bird Shot on the Trap Range Only

This is a correction to the print version of the March newsletter. The electronic version was corrected prior to posting. Slugs can be shot on the rifle ranges, but not bird shot. If you would like to shoot bird shot, that must be done on the Trap Range. If you would like to pattern your shotgun, we have a patterning stand between the pistol range and the trap pads. There are even instructions there if you're not sure how to use it. No shot larger than #4 is permitted. While most of the Range Rules are there to protect you, a few are there to protect the equipment.



Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- DO NOT Handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep Up Brass Behind the Yellow and In Front of the Red Line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red Line Only

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE




