



clubhouse on the left side wall of the kitchen counter. A new battery has been installed in it. Where it says RESCUE READY the light is **GREEN** meaning it is charged. Please let **Chris Cote** know if the light is **RED**. There are new adult and pediatric defibrillation pads next to the machine.

The **GREEN** sheet: Everyone that enters the gate at Escondido Fish And Game Association must sign the **GREEN** sheet even if you are not Shooting and you are just a spectator. No exceptions. That means **EVERYONE** - The President, Rangemasters/RSOs included.

TRAP CORNER

We have been working to improve and expand 5-Stand with additional equipment and improvements to the infrastructure to make set-up and teardown easier. We are now up to a total of 11 machines to offer lots of variety to the shooters. A large part of that variety comes from the creativity of the people who set up the machines. **Dan Dorman** and **Carlos Torres** have been instrumental in making Wednesday Night Trap a different experience every time. I wish that I could speak more about Tuesday Morning Trap and 5-Stand but, unfortunately, I still have a day-job that keeps me away from it most of the time.

I also want to make a point of recognizing the people who make these events possible. We have a bunch of volunteers who step up and help make Trap, Pot, and 5-Stand possible.

At each event there is someone collecting money, punching cards, setting up squads, and running the events. They also make sure that the events are set up and running and keep track of when to fill the machines with targets. This job usually keeps that person so busy that they rarely get a chance to shoot.

Next there are the people who set up and tear down the equipment. They are also the ones who fill the machines and round up extra people to help with that task. When they get 3 or 4 people to load a machine, the time spent waiting for the next round of Trap is reduced dramatically.

There are also the ones that repair and maintain the equipment. From an engineering perspective, a Trap machine looks like it was designed by Rube Goldberg. With all of the moving parts and bits of broken targets floating around, they seem to magically keep working. The reality is that we have people like *Chris Cote, Tim Hoy, Dave Robertson, Bill Sergent, and Carlos Torres* who keep the mechanical and electrical parts operational.

Lastly, I want to recognize **Dan Dorman** who keeps all of events and people from stepping on each other. I have seen him handle difficult situations with great care and diplomacy. He has also been very cooperative and professional in dealing with the Board of Directors, the Junior Marksmanship Program, and all of the volunteers listed above.

BLACK POWDER NEWS

Muzzleloading Bullseye: The next contest is April 3rd. Start time is 08:00.

Primitive Archery: The next contest is April 3rd following the Bullseye event above,. +/- 10:30.

Muzzleloading Silhouette: The next contest is April 24th. This will start with a Pistol Contest at 08:30. Pistol targets will be at 15, 25, and 35 yds. (Because you can't seem to hit anything further out). In May they move out to the regular range of 25, 50, and 75 yds. Rifle will start at 10:00 +/- after the pistol targets are reset. Rifle is LONG RANGE. Targets are going to be at 100, 125, and 150 yds. This is my favorite contest of the year. You need to know your equipment and be able to read the wind. If you are a new shooter, you may want sit this one out and watch. Not for the weak of heart. Top scores are going to be 10 or 12 out of 18 possible. Hitting our relatively small silhouette targets at this range, (with a muzzle loading rifle), is science, art, and a little luck. GREAT FUN.

Gear you need to compete in this sport:

Part 1: Last month I described the various "Classes" we have for Muzzleloading events at our range. This month lets talk about hardware.

Single Shot Pistol: We shoot a pretty wide variety of single shot pistols. You can spend anywhere from \$300 to \$1500 for a replica. Traditions "Trapper" pistols and Kentucy pistols are popular. A .45 or .50 caliber is required to provide enough energy to knock down steel silhouettes. Single Shot Pistols can be either Percussion or Flintlock depending on how much frustration do you want in your life. (Choose Percussion if you are a new shooter). .32 and .36 caliber pistols can hit the targets, but most often, the target is still standing when the smoke clears.

Revolvers: Here we have a pretty wide selection of firearms to choose from. As an example you could use a Patterson Colt, a Walker Colt, a Dragoon Colt, or an 1858 Remington. Ruger Old Army revolvers are also popular. I shoot a Rogers and Spenser. There are others. Do some homework on Pre-Civil War and Civil War Revolvers. Replicas range in price (and quality) from \$200 to \$1,200+. The key is to find one that fits your hand. You can also use adjustable sights in this class. Here 44 caliber is king. 36 caliber revolvers can be accurate, but lack the "Punch" to knock over steel at range. Basically if it says "Army", it's a .44. If it says "Navy", it's a .36. Talk to someone knowledgeable about what to look for in a percussion revolver before buying a used one. Some of the early "Replicas" from Spain and Italy in the early 1970s and 1980s, are dangerous JUNK. Know before you buy.

Next month we can talk about rifles for Round Ball competition, (what we do at the range). Think SLOW TWIST muzzle loading barrels. Goggle it......

Junior Muzzleloading is alive and well. We just held the first Junior Muzzleloading event on March 13th. One of the girls I coached shot an 8 out of 10 on steel at 25yd. Not bad for an 8 yr old. 
