**Hunter Education Class**

### **Class Description:**

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills, and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved. Firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

# RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

### Frame of Mind – Think Safety at All Times

You may have noticed that many of the newsletter authors frequently write about the rules and incidents on the range. You might even get tired of hearing it at times. That could be why we still have incidents from time to time. The majority of our members and guests shoot responsibly. Oh, there might be slight slips in protocol on occasion, but we usually catch ourselves, or another member gives us a gentle nudge. Remember, "That's their job." We consider ALL members to be RSOs.

BUT.....Also remember that in the blink of an eye, one incident can have devastating consequences. We have recently had a few negligent discharges and dropped firearms. WE WERE LUCKY!! No one was hurt. Someone could have been seriously injured or worse.

If this has happened to you, you're probably not in the right frame of mind to be handling firearms that day. Take a break that day and come back when you can focus clearly on what you're doing. This is too important.

In addition to the risk of personal injury, keep in mind that the EF&GA range is here, in part, because of our excellent safety record. Careless behavior jeopardizes our existence.

So....If you are tired of seeing a list of "DON'Ts", Here is a list of "DOs":

- 1. Know and follow the EF&GA Range Rules. If you forget something, there is a wood bound copy of the Casual Shooting Rules at each range kiosk.
- 2. Shoot your legal firearms in a safe and courteous manner.
- 3. Have fun and enjoy the camaraderie of your fellow



### Guests

Bringing guests to the range is a privilege. Each member is allowed 2 guests. You are responsible for your guests. Make sure they are with you at all times and abide by the rules.

### **House Keeping**

As always, we want to remember to sign the Green Sheets and make sure they have the correct Date and Range information. Remove your targets and take them home with you. Check to be sure you have all of your belongings. # TRAP CORNER

by Mark Baldwin



Have you ever seen the "Trap Straights" in the "Trap Corner" and wondered what it is?

This is where we put the names of people who have shot a "Straight", which is hitting all 25 birds or 26 birds in doubles. Rarely do you see a 5 Stand shooter's name in these columns. I'm not saying that 5 Stand is harder to shoot than Trap, but it is definitely more challenging. We've been asked by 5 Stand shooters if we could put the "top shooter" of the day in the Trap Straights, so starting in April we will be adding the top 5 Stand shooter. If more than one person happen to shoot the same high score, then we will include all their names and scores.

Let me explain some of the differences between Trap and 5 Stand. In Trap you are shooting at one clay pigeon from 16 yards (unless you're doing handicap). With Trap the bird comes out of the house anywhere along a 43° angle. The machine has interrupters in it, so you don't know exactly where the bird is going to be thrown next. With doubles you have 2 birds coming out at the same time, but it's usually coming out in the same spot. In Trap you shoot one shot, then the next shooter shoots and so on until you all have taken your 5 shots at that position and then move to the next position.

One of the reasons 5 stand is more challenging is that we have 11 different machines throwing clay pigeons out at different angles, different speeds, and different elevations. We also have one that runs along the ground called the rabbit. In 5 Stand you take 5 shots from 5 different positions for a total of 25 shots. Your first shot is a single bird. The next is a pair followed by another pair.

So, look for the 5 Stand high scorers in the Trap Straights from now on.

### Be a Boy Scout, Be Prepared:

On your next range visit do your homework. Check the website to see if the range you want to use is available. S#@t Happens. Work will start soon on the 100 yard range, and it may not be available. We also have some scheduled shoots on weekdays like Trap on Tuesday mornings and .22 events on Thursdays. Don't drive out to the range without bothering to check. You may be unpleasantly surprised.

### **Black Powder Range Etiquette:**

Please show a little courtesy to other shooters that share the range with you on practice days. Black Powder shooting is messy, and it smells. If you arrive at a range that is already is use, try to set up on the downwind side of the other shooters. Black powder smoke smells like "freedom" to us; not so much to other shooters that are not used to it. Clean up your mess. Used cleaning patches, spilled powder on the table or ground, and used percussion caps, should be cleaned up before you leave the range. Your mama is not a member here, (unless she is) and you need to clean up your own mess.

Finally, take your own targets home with you. The range can not dispose of used targets, it is your responsibility to take care of your own stuff. It is also kind of obvious when you see a Pig, Chicken, or Ram target with  $\frac{1}{2}$ " + sized holes in them, as to who has been shooting. Be an active member on clean-up days. We shoot hundreds of cloth patches down range every contest. Come out on clean-up days and grab a rake. (The birds that have been using these for nesting material are starting to get addicted...)

### THE COMBAT CORNER

Hello fellow shooters,

We have a few changes to the Combat Match. We are now implementing the same rules to the Combat Match as to other matches and casual shooting. Please do not handle your firearms or bring your gear to the range area while the blue light is flashing. Shooters must remain in the parking area until the Range Master has cleared everyone down range, and has given the OK. I know everyone wants to get their gear ready early but there are people down range painting steel and setting up targets. This is for their safety.

There were two separate incidents of shooters accidentally dropping their guns on the ground. Both incidents occurred away from the firing line. At USPSA sanctioned events this situation is not grounds for Disqualification or DQ. Since the Combat Match is not a sanctioned USPSA event, this falls under EF&GA range rules. This year we addressed this issue and decided that this is too great of a safety concern and it is now a DQ. We're sorry but we have to send you home, with no refund. So, please make sure your holster is properly attached to your belt prior to holstering your gun. If you don't have a gun retention system in your holster, hold on to your gun when bending down to pick up magazines, brass, etc. This will prevent your gun from popping out of your holster.

Please double check your firearm to make sure there isn't a round in the chamber and no magazine in your gun before getting on range property. We don't want any negligent discharges. Remember to always assume your gun is loaded until you check it yourself. Don't just pull the trigger because you saw the hammer was cocked. The last thing we want to do is send anyone home or worse, send someone to the hospital.

We had 90+ competitors three straight months. With more shooters attending, there is always an increased risk of an accidental or negligent discharge. It can happen to anyone, whether you're an expert or a beginner. If you're a new shooter, your chances of having one are even greater. When you're finished shooting a stage, listen to and follow the Range Officers' commands. Keep your finger off that trigger until the RO has cleared you to drop the hammer with your gun pointed down range. This is very important for the safety of all.

In other news, we had another great match. We introduced a plate rack to the Combat Match. I believe this was the first time It was ever done. Everyone seemed excited to get their chance to shoot it. I know It's satisfying to hear the sound of hitting steel, but also seeing it fall. Well, that's just pure fun! If things work out we will have another exciting surprise stage this coming match. So, come join us at the next Combat Match.


