RSO Shout Out





Sheepdog Academy - CCW Tune Up





here still seems to be a lot of confusion on what can be done when the range is Hot or Cold. It is important for everyone to understand and follow these procedures. Please don't make Ed put up another sign!

Cold Range:	Hot Range:
 Blue Blinking Lights ON Can NOT handle Firearms & Equipment Handle Targets Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line 	 Blue Blinking Lights OFF Handle Firearms & Equipment OK to Load/Unload Vehicle Sweep up brass behind the Red line
OK TO GO DOWN RANGE	DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

As an additional safety item we are requesting that all members and their guests start using Open Bolt Indicator (OBI) flags. This is especially true for firearms on the bench before going down range to handle targets. It is an easy way for all parties to see that a firearm has no round in the chamber. We have them for sale at the membership meetings cheap.

I would like to schedule an NRA Range Safety Officer's (RSO) class for early fall. Any EF&GA Rangemaster or Shoot Chair who has not completed the course should register. The class will also be open to the general membership. If you are interested please contact me through email so I can start a class roster. Yes, there is a nominal cost for materials.

I volunteer and am sometimes "volunteered" to assist in the many activities we have at the club. When I look around at the other suckers volunteers it is mostly the same people. This club gives you a wonderful opportunity to give back and not just a place you send in your annual dues. Get involved in some of our programs or even better yet become a Rangemaster!!

July is new member orientation and we will have a significant number of new members joining our organization. When out at the range please take a moment to welcome the new members and HELP them familiarize themselves to our range and our safety rules. If you see something that is not right, calmly explain the proper procedure.

Regarding our safety rules; just a reminder that unsafe firearms handling can/will get you a special invite to the Board of Directors meeting and usually a suspension or expulsion of your membership. Please don't be that person, pay attention and be safe!

As I walk around our range and talk to many of the members and guests, there is one thing the seems to stand out as the largest common denominator. Could it be the support for the 2nd Amendment? You would expect that at a gun range. Is it the love of firearms? Maybe! How about the willingness to help someone that has forgotten to bring hearing protection or some other necessary item? Possibly! But the one thing that really stands out above all else is the patriotism and love of country. From the way that members thank the Marines and Sailors that volunteer their time to work with the Junior Program, to the fact that we start each board meeting and general meeting by reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. The evidence of the patriotism and love of country is everywhere.

More evidence is seen in the way that Escondido Fish and Game displays the flag. Thanks to members like Al Anzelone, Old Glory is always is great shape. Once the flag has become worn, it is quickly replaced with a new one and the old one is retired properly. Additionally, we ensure that the Stars and Stripes are lighted properly at night.

Looking at the flag brings me back to my earliest days as a Boy Scout, learning proper flag etiquette and how to fold the flag, or to my many days in the United States Marine Corps, as a young Lance Corporal that was tasked with raising the flag for morning colors. To this day I consider that one of my best memories and most enjoyed duties. To anyone that has every worn a uniform, the very act of raising or lowering our flag has a very special meaning.

The Junior Marksmanship Program strives to teach not only firearms safety and marksmanship, but also responsibility, patriotism and the love of country that I was talking about earlier. We do this by starting each Junior Marksmanship event with the National Anthem or the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance. We teach them about proper flag etiquette, such as flag placement and that the blue field always leads the way. Have you ever noticed the golden sphere that sits atop a military flag pole? That golden sphere is called a truck. 

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.



While I am sure that this is old news to many of you. I would like to say how proud I am of this program and everyone involved in it. This is an amazing program and a real feather in the cap of the Escondido Fish and Game Association.
