
Special Thanks

Tt's A-Door-Able

I spent the first few weeks of November working with a contractor on the installation and implementation of a new access control system. This system expands on the proximity badge system that we have used for years

to open the gate. Now it is used to open the doors of the Meeting Hall (all 3 entrances and the Pantry door), the Trap Ramada (both entrances), the Restrooms, and the Shed (pedestrian door at the northwest corner).

The Restrooms are unlocked from 6:00 AM – 6:00 PM and when the gate is open for a sanctioned event. When they are unlocked, the badge reader flashes red and green indicating that the door is unlocked. This was done so that members will not need to escort a guest to the restroom during the day or during a sanctioned event.

EF&GA Members have access to the Gate, the Meeting Hall entrances, and the Trap Ramada from 6:00 AM – 9:00 PM. Restrooms are accessible 24 hours per day with a badge in case a member is using the Campground and the restroom doors automatically locked at 6:00 PM.

RSOs and Maintenance staff have access to the Shed door from 6:00 AM – 9:00 PM.

Instructors, Maintenance, and BOD Members have access to the Panty Door in the Meeting Hall Kitchen.


If you believe that you require access to a door that your badge does not open, please contact the Board and it will be handled on a case-by-case basis.





No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

™ Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (1/19/2019)

HAPPY NEW YEAR! It's a great time for beginning to acquire the skills and knowledge to load your own ammunition and not be limited to market vagaries. Although ammo has plentifully come back to the market there are California restrictions (Prop. 63) that have been generated to hinder such purchases both in-store and on-line. The opportunity to learn reloading techniques that will allow you to produce timely, consistent and accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available on 1/19/2019.

The First Part is strictly academic in structure and conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session is 8A.M. on Saturday, 1/19/2019, and will last until approximately 12 noon.

The Second Part is a "Hands On" reloading bench experience. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your personal reloads.

Scheduling the second session will be a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session.

The cost is two tiered: EF&GA members = \$100; non-members = \$110. For those individuals without any reloading supplies (empty cases, powder, primers, etc.) a \$10 surcharge will be applied. Prior registration and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this class.

egretfully we continue to have misunderstandings on what can and cannot be done when the state of the range is Hot or Cold. Most of the people I correct are just not aware of how it works.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- **DO NOT** handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

I will be getting some signs made with this graphic that will hopefully remind everyone. I have also gotten a great suggestion to create a safety video demonstrating Hot, Cold, and Firearm equipment handling to post on our website. Stay tuned -

While it may seem obvious and there are signs — I feel compelled to review the following. Each range has at least the following equipment; First Aid, Brass Bucket, Smokers and DUDS Disposal.

- First Aid Cabinet Bandages for your use if needed Combination is the sticker on your membership card
- Brass Bucket Used Brass that you do not want Please clean up after yourself
- Smokers Disposal GREEN Ash receptacle for Cigars and Cigarettes Please NO AMMO (really)!
- DUDS Disposal Cans RED Metal canisters
 BAD ammo only NOT a BRASS bucket
 Do NOT even think about using it as an ash tray...

This festive time of year is also one of the scariest for the RSO's. It is not due to over-eating, but members who have gotten a gift of a new firearms!

If you are one of the lucky ones to get a new firearm(s) for the holidays please read the manual and get familiar (without ammo) with your new toy BEFORE you come to the range with live ammo. There are also great YouTube videos on just about anything.

New TCS and Saturday Trap Schedules (1/5/2019)

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

Rain Reminder


