



TRAP CORNER

12- Gauge / 20- Gauge / 28- Gauge – What is it?

The gauge (or commonly bore in British English) of a firearm is a unit of measurement used to express the inner diameter (bore diameter) of the barrel. Gauge is determined from the weight of a solid sphere of lead that will fit the bore of the firearm and is expressed as the multiplicative inverse of the sphere's weight as a fraction of a pound, e.g., a one-twelfth pound lead ball fits a 12-gauge bore. Thus, there are twelve 12-gauge balls per pound, etc. The term is related to the measurement of cannons, which were also measured by the weight of their iron round shot; an 8-pounder would fire an 8 lb (3.6 kg) ball.

New Saturday Schedule for Trap

Because the sun sets earlier and the weather is colder at night, we are going to change Saturday Trap to begin at 2:00 instead of 4:00 PM. This will only be until Daylight Saving Time returns (3/8/2020). The good news is that we all get to shoot while it is still warm. The bad news is that we will need to reconsider the Punch Card Shoot and the Century Shoot. This will NOT affect the Pot Shoot, only 16-Yard Trap. Stay tuned for more details.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to <u>newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com</u> and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category - Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title - This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info - This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.


TRAINING CENTRAL

NRA Basic Shotgun (1/12/2020)

The NRA Basic Shotgun Shooting Course introduces students to the knowledge, skills and attitude necessary for owning and using a shotgun safely. Through this course students will learn about shotgun parts and operation, ammunition, gun safety, shotgun shooting fundamentals and activities. The Basic Shotgun Shooting Course will also help prepare the student for participation in other NRA courses. The course consists of classroom discussion and Trap shooting at our range. NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (1/25/2020)

Although ammunition is now plentiful, there are California restrictions (such as Prop. 63, passed, now SB1235) that have since been generated to hinder such purchases both in-store and eliminated on-line. This obstacle can be overcome through acquired skills and knowledge. Presented is the opportunity to learn basic reloading techniques that



will allow you to produce timely, consistent and accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available on January 25th, 2020.

The First Part is strictly academic in structure and is conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session, 8A.M. on Saturday, Jan 25th, 2020 and will last until approximately 12 noon.

The Second Part is a "Hands On" reloading bench activity. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your personal reloads. Scheduling the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session.

The cost is two tiered: EF&GA members = \$110; non-members = \$120. For those individuals beginning and are without any reloading supplies (empty cases, powder, primers, etc.) a \$10 surcharge will be applied. Prior registration and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this class. Registration is necessary and limited.
