

Eulogy for a Turkey

Why I do what I do at EF&GA

A few weeks ago, I started asking some of the people that are responsible for the Junior Marksmanship program, why they do what they do. Some people gave short answers like "I do it for the kids". Others said they do it to give back to an association that has given so much to them.

Ren Everret - It started back 15 years ago in 2005. I was a newly retired Marine, and a newish member of EF&GA. Frank Alessio asked me if I would take over the Junior Rifle program. I said yes, due to most of my time in the Marines was spent either shooting or teaching it. Junior Rifle was a perfect fit and I don't plan on giving it up any time soon. Why I do the other things I do for the Association: BOD - For many years, write the NRA grants and gold medal club sub-

missions and I have served on a few committees when work allowed? I think that when you are part of an Association, life commitments and personal skills dictating, you should do what you can to preserve, improve, and help the Association prosper. I like to think that I have given back to the Association almost as much as I have ever received.

Patric Russ - During my time in the Marine Corps, I was given the job as the local coordinator for Toys For Tots program. It was there that I started to really understand the benefit of giving back to the community. Seeing children that wouldn't normally get a gift for Christmas, receive 3 or 4 gifts plus a stuffed animal and board game and how their faces would light up when Santa visited them was a very heartwarming sight. After getting out of the Marine Corps, I started working at North County Shooting Center where I found out about trap shooting at Escondido Fish and Game. That is where I met people like Kurt Nelson, Ed Migdal, Darrin Eaton and Linda Linaker. I also met Julie Olmstead, someone that I had gone to high school with but hadn't seen in many years. Not long after that I was asked, by Julie, to come help out with the Junior Rifle program. After that first Sunday, I was hooked and I kept coming up to coach. That quickly grew into helping in the armory and working on the firing line with Kurt Nelson. Not long after that, Kurt asked myself and Patrick Watson take over the Junior pistol program. That was about 8 years ago and I have never regretted a minute of it. Now I run the line for both the Junior Rifle program and the Junior Pistol program. I also started the Junior Coaches program with the help of Darrin Eaton. Working with the Junior Marksmanship program has been very rewarding. I firmly believe that I have gotten far more from the program than I could ever give back. Personally, I am very proud to be a part of such an amazing program.

Since this is the holiday season, I would like to remind everyone to give to the Escondido Fish and Game's annual Joy Drive. As I said before, I was a coordinator of the local Toys For Tots program for many years. I can tell you first hand that these toy drives make a differ-



I took the doll and thanked her for her donation. I also thanked her dad as I figured that he had bought the doll for her to give to us. But, the father said that his little girl had wanted to go to the store to get a doll that she had saved her money to get. It was her money and her decision to donate it to another child. When I asked her about it, she said that she could what for Santa to bring her the doll and the she wanted that doll to go to someone else. This little girl understood more about life than most adults that I have known. This happened nearly 20 years ago and I can remember it like it was yesterday.

The Junior Marksmanship Program would like to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a very safe and happy New Year.









RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

For the last few articles, I have spared you from my normal whining about our Safety and Association regulations at the range, but I am back this month with a big pointy stick since they won't give me a taser (yet)...

Critters - I would like to remind ALL members and their guests that the Escondido Fish and Game Association regulations prohibits the killing, harming or harassing of any wild life on the Range. Violation of this will result in suspension or termination of your membership. Depending on the incident you may also be prosecuted by Law Enforcement (California Department of Fish and Wildlife) and will be responsible for any fines and punitive actions.

Cold Range - When the range is COLD (people going down range, blue lights on) you may only sweep brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line. You may NOT be BETWEEN the Yellow and Red lines. You can setup or retrieve your target. You can not be doing anything else with your gear or firearms!!!!!

Unloading/Loading firearms from a case - Please do NOT Unload or Load your firearm(s) from it's case behind the firing line. You will be sweeping the shooters on the firing line and it is a violation of our safety regulations. Take the bag/case to the firing line or bench and remove it from it's case pointed down range. Verify the firearms is unloaded and then action open (chamber flag if you have one).

Guests - You the member are responsible that your guests understand and follow our range rules. You the member are accountable to EFGA for their actions.

Range Trash - The RSO's are not your Mother and are not here to cleanup your brass (unless we want it) or used targets. Please cleanup your

shooting area. And when you bring your target frame back tear off the old shot up targets. Also, please stop dropping live ammunition in the parking lot! At least someone dropped a Cowboy load (45-70 which was used to hunt Buffalo).

Lost & Found - I have enough staplers, spotting scopes, glasses (some prescription) and water bottles. We do have a lost and found, please contact us and we will see if anyone turned it in. Also, PLEASE remember to bring all of your FIREARMS home with you.

Happy Holidays - This time of year is not just for Christmas and I wish everyone a safe, healthy and Happy Holidays. May you find some ammo or primers!

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a fire-

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price - A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info - This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.




