We still have some lack of clarity on the proper protocol for packing and unpacking your firearms. Firearms should be brought to the Firing Line locked and cased. Uncase your firearms at the Firing Line only. Unlocked and uncased firearms should not be handled behind the shooting lines.




#### Wait for the Gate to Close

#### Bow Hunter Education Class 12/9/2023 & 3/9/2024 (7:00 am – 4 pm)

#### **Class Description:**

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature. safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

Cost of this class is \$75 for members, \$125 for non-members Class Requirements: Handgun with mounted red dot sight, 150 rounds of ammunition.



### NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 1/6/2024 & 3/2/2024 (8 am – 12 noon)

Need or want ammo but can't find any? MAKE YOUR OWN!

#### **Class Description:**

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1<sup>st</sup> session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2<sup>nd</sup> session – This is "Hands-On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day. ### RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

As you read the Rangemaster Sound-off each month, you may notice some redundancy. That's because the same infractions continue to occur. If you want to stop reading about them, we suggest you stop doing them. First and foremost, we are ALL RSOs and responsible for keeping a safe range for each other.

We're still being contacted about members and their guests casing and uncasing firearms from the rear seating benches (Pistol, 100 yard range and 150 yard range) and middle tables (Pistol range). Walking around behind the yellow line with an open firearm is a safety hazard. Do not use the rear seating benches or middle tables. Use the firing line shooting benches only. This applies to the Pistol, 100 yard and 150 yard ranges.

Members are allowed to bring two guests to the range. They are your responsibility so pay attention to them. Make sure they understand the safety rules and follow them.

Blue Blinking lights "ON" or "OFF" applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking lights are "ON" do not unload firearms or gear. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for range to go hot (lights OFF). Then you can unload your firearms and gear. The "Cold Range/Hot Range" box to the right in every newsletter is an easy reference guide to help clarify what's expected when the lights are "ON" and "OFF".

When you sign the Green Sheets, please make sure the date and range information is filled in at the top of the sheet. There are Green Sheets being turned in without date and range information.

All shooters are expected to remove their targets from the target backers and take them home. HAZMAT requirements do not allow us to dispose of the targets here at the range. Don't forget to return the target frames back to the designated area.

Watch for Turkeys, Deer and any other wildlife on the range. The range is a wildlife preserve. If wildlife is present, call a "CEASE FIRE" until the range is clear. Shooting at wildlife or shooting to scare it away is unacceptable and grounds for immediate dismissal and may result in loss of membership.

Make sure you pack up all your gear and take it home when you leave. While it's nice of you to donate your hard earned stuff to the range, we pretty much have everything we need already.

Trap is looking for folks to help with set up, take down and scoring on Wednesdays and Saturdays. The trap team will show you what you need to know.



### BLACK POWDER NEWS

by Garth Warner



#### Muzzle Loading Silhouette for December:

Our next contest will be on December 24th, the day before Christmas. If you need to get away from your in-laws or out-laws for a little bit, this will be the contest for you. For this event, if you enter either pistol or rifle, you will receive a FREE raffle ticket. I will be giving away three complete Christmas dinners to include pre-cooked frozen turkey, instant mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce, and a homemade pie. The drawing will be held immediately following the breakdown at the end of the contest. Oh Yeah.....the contest will be a standard short course with cross-sticks. Targets will be at 50, 75, and 100 yards.

You can shoot off hand OR from cross-sticks at all ranges. (No perfect score medallions and no advancement to Master class will be issued for this event as it is a Non-Standard event). If you don't know what a cross-stick is then call me. Starting in 2024 we will be hosting regular cross-stick events so you might want to check this out in December in preparation for the upcoming season.

#### **Ladder Test for Round Ball:**

Last month we talked about experimenting with different ball and patch combinations to determine what works best in your rifle. Once you find a combo you like (smallest group size), here is the next step. You need to determine the velocity "Sweet Spot" for your barrel. To do this set a target out at least 75 yards. From the bench, shoot a group at a powder charge of 50 gns. Measure the group size, and patch the target. Shoot a group at 55 gns. Measure the group size, and patch the target. You should see your group size getting smaller, up to a point, and then starting to get bigger.

As you increase your powder charge the point of impact on the target will start to rise. Somewhere along this journey you will find the "Sweet Spot" where you discover at what powder charge your rifle is most accurate. When you recover your target back to the bench, you can turn it over and look at the back. You should see something like an hourglass shape of climbing groups from large to small to large again. Depending on your barrel twist this may be a "short wide" hourglass, or a "tall thin" hourglass. I have no way to prove it, but I believe that a slow twist barrel is more accurate over a greater span of powder charges than a fast twist barrel (i.e. Narrow hourglass over a Wider hourglass).

I shoot a Green Mountain Barrel with a twist rate of 1 in 70. My very best groups are shot at 70 gns of powder. Butt, Butt, BUTT...The rifle will hold minute of Ram accuracy at 85 gns out to 150 yards, and minute of Pig accuracy down to 50 gns at 25 yards. Specifically my rifle has acceptable accuracy from 50 to 85 gns of powder while still being "Best" at 70 gns. My experience with 1 in 48 twist barrels (TC) has been that they are best at 50 to 55 gns. The groups became unacceptably large above 70 gns of powder (i.e. a shorter wider hourglass on our test target). This might be attributed to spinning an unbalanced round ball at a higher rotational velocity, OR, it could be totally my prejudiced imagination. Your mileage may vary. In any event, you should do your own testing and evaluation, and make up your own mind.


