The different shoots are going well. I get awesome reports on their operations. It seems like the attendees are really enjoying themselves.







How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Category - Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

Suribachi on Iwo Jima. We have all seen the famous image that was taken by Joe Rosenthal, but few people know anything about it. The image has been published millions of times of the years and has become one of the most recognizable images of WWII, the Pacific Theatre, and possibly of all time.

The famous image was of the second flag that was raised that day. After seeing the first flag raised, the commander of the 2nd Battalion, 28th Marines regiment, 5th Marine Division, ordered a larger flag be taken to the top of the mountain and raised.

After seeing the first flag raised, Forrestal remarked to Smith: "Holland, the raising of that flag on Suribachi means a Marine Corps for the next five hundred years".

Over the years there has been a lot of confusion about who actually raised the flag that day. Of the 6 that raised the flag that day, only 3 would survive the battle. Three of the Marines that raised the flag included Sergeant *Michael Strank*, Corporal *Harlon Block* (misidentified as Sergeant *Hank Hansen* until January 1947) and Private First Class *Franklin Sousley* were killed in action over the next few days of the battle. The remaining flag-raisers that survived were Private First Class *Harold Keller* (misidentified as PhM2c *John Bradley* until June 2016) and *Ira Hayes*.

The flag was raised on February 23rd, 1945 but the battle wasn't over. The island was not declared secure until March 26th, 31 days later.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

There are two types of shooting at our range; Casual shooting, which is what I usually write about and Organized shooting activities. The shooting range rules are different between Causal and Organized shooting.

A lot of our rules are directed towards the Casual shooter as they are mostly unsupervised (by range personnel) and we need to make sure that all skill levels are considered.

Organized (match) activities are approved by the Board of Directors and are monitored by the Range Safety Officers. It is a requirement that the Shoot Chair be an EFGA Range Safety Officer (we also encourage NRA RSO certification) and he/she goes through a short training session on what we expect. In addition to the Shoot Chair, there are usually a large contingent of RSO's shooting the match.

As I mentioned, the range rules are different between the two types of activities. For example, there have been times with Junior Rifle that we have so many kids that we put some of them on the Pistol range with Rifles. The Match has permission to do so, but it is not OK for a Causal shooter to use a Rifle on the Pistol range.

While the range rules may be different for matches, there is no change in Safety requirements. I hold the Shoot Chair responsible for the Safety of their match and their shooters. I do stop by and sometimes participate in our matches to ensure that proper Safety procedures are being followed. Just so you know, everyone is treated the same in regards to following our Safety rules and Shoot Chairs and the BOD do not get a free pass (I really get on them)!

As some of you may know my sinister alter-ego is "Rustler" and I am the Shoot Chair for Cowboy Action shooting. I would like to take a moment and describe how our matches handle Safety.

Cowboy Action (SASS) is a four gun sport; rifle, shotgun and a pair of single action revolvers shooting on steel targets (lead ammo only). Our matches are usually 6 stages with usually 10 rifle, 10 pistol and 4-6 shotgun per stage. A match will usually use about 120 rifle/pistol rounds and 25-30 shotgun shells. We also have categories for Black Powder (yeehaaa). We usually have between 30 - 50 shooters at a match.

How do we handle that many shooters, firearms and rounds going down-range safely? We follow SASS (Single Action Shooting Society) rules that govern our sport.

Basic Tenants:

- Cold Range no loaded firearms behind the firing line
- When ready to shoot Bring firearms to the loading table which is monitored by the Loading Officer to insure the proper amount of rounds are loaded in each firearm, especially the Pistols (we only load 5 and require the hammer to be over an empty chamber)
- When the firing line is ready, the next shooter is called by the Timer Operator (RSO). The shooter is now under control of the RSO who is at arms length to stop the shooter if necessary. Three spotters watch the shooter looking for misses, correct target sequence and safety issues.
- After shooting the scenario, the shooter is directed to the Unloading table. The shooter unloads all firearms while the Unloading Officer inspects that all firearms are clear.
- There are harsh penalties and/or expulsion for Safety violations.

By following these rules conscientiously at every match, regardless of the club you are shooting with, has ensured that there have been no major issues that I am aware of in over 20 years of shooting SASS.

Shoot Chairs, it's a new year and I will be visiting your shoot soon.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **ON**
- **DO NOT** handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **OFF**
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE


