Rules Review

I would like to take this time to review a couple of association rules.

First, let's review the RSO rule. The RSO on duty has the final word. If he or she feels that an unsafe condition exists, whatever action they deem necessary to correct that condition must be followed, period. DO NOT ARGUE WITH THE RSO. If you feel the decision is unfair, contact the CRSO, Tim Geiser and he will take whatever action he deems appropriate.

Here's another common mistake. When the range is "cold", NO EQUIPMENT OF ANY KIND WILL BE HANDLED, with the exception of target frames and targets being set up and brought down range. Do not take your shooting things out of your car until the range is "hot". During sanctioned events, the event chair will decide what may be specifically okay or not for their event. In either case, the duty RSO has the final say on matters of safety and property protection.

All firearms should be cased and/or uncased at the firing line. Unused rifles should be placed in the rifle racks, pistols on the shooting bench. No firearms should be placed lying on the work tables behind the firing line(s).



The new laws are complicated

and you really do not want to be out of compliance. I don't want to be the first one that becomes an example while they test it out in County/ State/Federal courts. I plan to communicate closely with reputable firearms dealers who have a vested interest in getting this right the first time. They have legal counsel that specialize in Second Amendment issues and are paid to keep the FFLs from going out of business.





BLACK POWDER NEWS

Per the format that we competed in 2017 we will run contests in the following order: Jan, May, Sept will be Super Short Range. Feb, June, Oct will be Regular Short Range, March, July, Nov will be Mid-Range, and April, Aug, and Dec will be Long Range. The 2017 Top Gun contest will precede the Long Range contest in April. Depending on the feedback I get from the Across The Course contest we held in Nov, I may schedule another one in 2018 - TBD.

January MuzzleLoading Silhouette opens the year with a Super Short Range Contest on Jan 28th.

Special Notice! The January Pistol contest will be a Black Diamond event. Bring a Revolver for this one and be prepared for a special event after the pistol contest and before the rifle contest. The survivors of the Vinyl Zombie Fruit that attacked the range in November may be back... You will need a cap and ball revolver to play.

Practical Black Powder Accuracy Part 4 Patch Lube (continued)

Liquid Lube Pros and Cons: With careful attention to patch and fouling moisture control, my experience has been that liquid lubes are slightly more accurate at range than grease lubes. The con side to this is that it is very finicky to work with. Damp patches have a very narrow range where they can be consistently accurate. Too wet and/or too dry and your accuracy can suffer. That range can change with temperature and humidity. Patches treated with liquid lube MUST be stored in an airtight container for moisture control between shots. The barrel MUST be swabbed between each shot with a damp cleaning patch. (Note that I said swabbed, NOT cleaned). It's all about moisture control in your barrel. Very hot days and/or rain days can affect your point of impact. Overly wet patches can wet your powder charge. Overly wet cleaning patches can also adversely affect the accuracy of your shot. So why bother with it? Well, when it works really, really well.

Over the years I have taken the time to shoot most of the popular lubes through my aperture sight equipped open rifle at long range. For me, liquid lubes have been the most accurate, when properly applied. Like I said, they ARE finicky.

The most common mistake new shooters make is to use too much liquid lube on their patches. I have seen people squirt a good amount on a patch to the point that they had lube dripping off their fingers when they shoved it down the barrel. The resulting shots were poor



How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.





due to a too slick barrel and a damp powder charge. I have rarely seen anybody use too little lube. Somewhere in between is going to be best for you and your rifle. You will have to experiment to find the sweet spot moisture level for your lube set-up. I tend to "wet" my patches 3 days or so before a contest, squeeze them out evenly as best I can, and store them in an airtight container until I pull one out to use. I also use a damp cleaning patch, (also previously prepared in advance), between each shot. On high humidity days, (raining), I may only use a dry patch between shots. On hot summer days I may run two wet cleaning patches down the barrel one after another. The fouling in the barrel and examining your fired patches will tell you what the barrel needs. Again, liquid lube is very finicky, but when it's right, it's really very good. (BTW, Balistol TM is a great liquid lube when thinned somewhere between 5-1 and 7-1 with water. Your mileage may vary. Straight Balistol TM is not so good as a lube.) That's all for this month. Next time we can talk about cleaning your barrel after a shoot.

Improving Your Scores

Many people ask how to get to that next level of Trap greatness. I recommend three habbits of excellence:

- Tip your puller. They put up with a lot of drama and work hard to make the experience smooth and easy for all of us. They appreciate the gesture and will root for you so at least you can buy some moral support.
- 2. Help load the house. Not only does this make the down-time go faster but also you get to see the equipment up close. This can only help your game.
- 3. Show up for a Work Party. This may sound ridicu lous but it worked for me. The day that I shot my hat I had spent the morning doing a Work Party. Perhaps I was too tired to over-think the game but it was a great day for me.

I suppose you could also practice a lot and shoot with people who are better than you to elevate your game but the three habits above worked for me.
