
My New Year resolution is to get more projects done, at home and at the range.



# JUNIOR CORNER

#### **RULES TO LIVE BY**

- **2. Never** point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot
- **3. Keep** your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire
- **4. Know** your target and the surroundings

On December 6th, the Big Guns came out to play in the annual Top Gun competition at The Escondido Fish and Game. The weather was perfect with nice warm temperatures and just a hint of a breeze. Each of the competitors worked hard to earn their invitation to this event. This event is designed to give the best of the best a chance to see exactly who is the best of the best, of the best (Sir). All these scores are out of a possible score of 400 points. I am willing to bet that there are very few people reading this that could shoot these kinds of scores. These shooters truly excel at this sport and they do so across multiple disciplines.

This year's Top Gun Shooters were Daysha Halbert, Sheridan Abrayano, Maria Gonzalez, Michelle Fan, Kestrin "The Hurricane" Walsh, Gia Hubbard, Vanessa Merkel, Brayden Stansel, Austin Ellerby, and Lorena Gonzalez. Now look at that list again. I'll wait.....do you see any patterns? Anyone that thinks that girls can't shoot should take a look at this list. In case you're not paying attention, 8 out of the 10 Top Gun Shooters are girls. Last year 7 out of 10 shooters were girls. The guys had better step it up next year or they will be out completely. Let's hear it for Girl Power!!

Pistol was the first discipline of the day. Going into the match, there were no odds-on favorite as to who was going to take the Top Shot title. This field was thick with great pistol shooters. But after the last shot was sent down range, Brayden Stansel took the title of Pistol Top Shot with a score 390 and 16 X's. Daysha Halbert came in 2nd with a score of 383 with 11 X's and Michelle Fan came in 3rd with a score of 378 and 8 X's. Honorable mention goes out to Austin Ellerby with a score of 365 and 12 X's.

For the first time ever, trap was included in the Top Gun competition. Special thanks to Chris Cote for taking the reins and running a great new program. This event was tough for many of the shooters as a few had only shot trap once or twice in the past. They all shot a great event, but in the end, there is only one Top Shot. This year's Trap Top Shot went to

Daysha Halbert with a score of 320 or 20 hits out of 25. She was followed closely by Sheridan Abrayano with a 304 or 19 out of 25 and Maria Gonzalez with a 288 or 18 out of 25.

Last, but not least was the rifle competition. As with the last two events it was anyone's guess at who would take the Top Shot title. I can tell you that the guys on the scoring table had their jobs cut out for them, as many of these competitors were putting shots right on top of each other. They can put four shots into a group that could easily be covered with a dime and have room to spare. But when the dust settled, it was Daysha Halbert that again walked away with the Rifle Top Shot title. Maria Gonzalez took 2nd place with a score of 396, followed by Michelle Fan in 3rd with a score of 389. Honorable mention goes out to Lorena Gonzalez with a score of 385 and Sheridan Abrayano with a score of 381. Just in case you missed it, that's less than 20 points separating the top 4 shooters.

As you could probably guess, Daysha Halbert took the Distinguished Shooter title for the 3rd year in a row with a score of 1100 out of a possible 1200. Followed by Michelle Fan with a score of 975 and Sheridan Abrayano with a score of 961. Honorable mention goes out to Maria Gonzalez with a score of 931. The Top 5 shooters were girls. Obviously, these girls can shoot.

I would like to give a very special thank you to everyone that made these events happen. Especially Ren Everett who has been doing this for many years. The Top Gun event has been his baby for a long time and I think it's a great way for the Junior Shooters to showcase their talents and prove once and for all who is the best, of the best. We are extremely proud of all our Junior Shooters.

#### New Green Sheets

Every person that is standing on EF&GA soil should be listed and signed in on at least one green sheet. This includes spectators and others who may be present even though they may not be shooting or handling firearms. The concern is that any human standing on the property is a potential liability risk so he/she needs to be documented.

Minors (under 18 years old) must be accompanied by a parent, guardian, or a permitted responsible adult. If a minor is accompanied by an adult that is not their parent or legal guardian (such as a grandparent, uncle, neighbor, etc,...) then the responsible adult MUST have a signed Parent Permission Form printed and available while they are on site with the minor. The Parent Permission Form is available on the web site on multiple pages (Range Info and Junior Marksmanship). This Parent Permission Form is required for both organized events and casual shooting.

We have revised the Green Sheets recently so they will look a bit different. The verbiage has been revised to keep up with modern liability concerns but the more obvious change is in sign-in area.

**The First Column** - is still where you CLEARLY print your name. This has not changed.

**The Second Column** – is where you sign if you are over 18 years old and you are signing in for yourself.

**The Third Column** – is where you sign if you are the parent or guardian of the person specified in the first column on this row.

**The Fourth Column** – is for the Category of the person in the first column on this row. M is for an adult Member of EF&GA, G is for an adult Guest, and MN is for a Minor (under 18 years old).

The new Green Sheets appear to be a little more trouble but the minor changes will reduce our liability and will help to ensure that we are all taking proper responsibility for the actions of ourselves, our guests, and our junior participants.

#### **Work Party (2/16/2020)**

Our work parties are held four times per year. Two of them on Saturdays and the other two on Sundays. The next one will be on Sunday, February 16th and everyone is invited. This is always a fun time with great food and prizes as well as a sense of accomplishment for a job well done. The festivities begin as early as 7 or 8 AM but if you can't make it until 9 or so, you are still welcome to participate.

# How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

**Members Only** are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

#### There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Junior Trap .......760-746-6015

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

**Description** – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

#### **Dress for Success**



Welcome to a New Year and somewhere on your "resolution" list should be "I will be a safe and considerate shooter this year". This is one resolution, unlike going to the gym that you can't decide to drop just because it becomes inconvenient.

It has been suggested that I might be a bit "snarky" in some of my articles and I would have to agree. On some subjects I have to continually repeat the same thing over and over and over...

#### **Cold Range:**

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- **DO NOT** handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line

**OK TO GO DOWN RANGE** 

#### **Hot Range:**

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

**DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE** 

One of those repeated subjects (besides multiple targets on the short pistol range) is the Blue/Red lights and what they mean.

One of the benefits of arriving at the range early when it is still dark is that it is really easy to see the Blue lights still blinking... Please turn the lights off before you leave the range!!!

#### **Green Sheets**

One of the first things we would like you to do is sign in. This gives you the opportunity to see the state of the range (Hot/Cold) and what shooting area is available for your use.

If the range is Hot and you may take your gear directly to a shooting location, but before any setup you must sign into that range.

The Green sheets are used for liability, range use and a way to let us know you were there to return whatever you have may have left with us – remember Cowboy firearms are OK to forget...

This time of year with the rains the range gets green with grass and weeds. The deer and other critters are not afraid of the gunfire and will casually come down the hill and onto the range to enjoy a snack. It is not permissible to shoot by them to scare them off. The range should be go Cold and wait for them to exit the range. If range conditions are permissible they may be "cleared" off the range. Please do not run up the hill especially if other ranges are still Hot…

It is not too late to make another new year's resolution like volunteering at the Range to assist any of the wonderful Junior Shooting and Range Safety programs.

# TRAINING CENTRAL

#### NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (1/25/2020)

Although ammunition is now plentiful, there are California restrictions (such as Prop. 63, passed, now SB1235) that have since been generated to hinder such purchases both in-store and eliminated on-line. This obstacle can be overcome through acquired skills and knowledge.

Presented is the opportunity to learn basic reloading techniques that will allow you to produce timely, consistent and accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available on Jan 25th, 2020.

The First Part is strictly academic in structure and is conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session, 8A.M. on Saturday, Jan 25th, 2020 and will last until approximately 12 noon.

The Second Part is a "Hands On" reloading bench activity. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your personal reloads. Scheduling the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session.

The cost is two tiered: EF&GA members = \$110; non-members = \$120. For those individuals beginning and are without any reloading supplies (empty cases, powder, primers, etc.) a \$10 surcharge will be applied. Prior registration and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this class. Registration is necessary and limited. 
#### NRA Basic Shotgun (1/12/2020)
