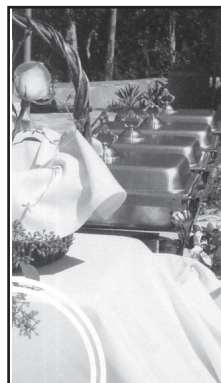

4. **Know** your target and the surroundings

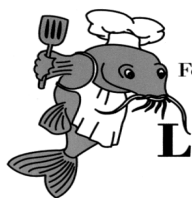

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Welcome to a new year and as the expression goes “May you live in interesting times”, I hope this year will be uninteresting in life and at the range...

Normally this time of year the range can be kinda crazy with shooters who have been “good” getting new firearms and coming out to the range to figure out how to use them. Well, you may have gotten a new firearm, but you had to be “especially good” to find any ammo, powder or primers!

If you were fortunate enough to find and purchase a new firearm, please take a moment and actually **read the manual**, find a YouTube video on how to take it apart and clean it.

If you are one of the 7+ million new firearms owners or just someone that is not a “gun” person and does not shoot very often I would highly recommend you get some formal training. The association hosts several NRA classes in Pistol, Rifle and Shotgun that will give you the basics and correct your bad habits! At the last Pistol class two shooters went away much happier once they learned a better way to shoot their handguns. Since I have done everything wrong at one time or another – I can help you!

If you have a CCW (Concealed Carry Weapons) permit that are several things you should consider since you will have a loaded firearm on your persons. Get a good belt and holster made for your handgun, don’t cheap out. Become intimate and practice with the firearm(s) you will be carrying.

I am not a lawyer, or a police officer just a regular redneck cowboy, but I have stayed at that famous express hotel and one important item to consider is CCW insurance. Remember every round down-range has a lawyer behind it...

Besides just carrying a firearm, do you have “Self Defense Awareness” as defined by Jeff Cooper (google him if you are not familiar).

- In **White** you are unprepared and unready to take lethal action. If you are attacked in White you will probably die unless your adversary is totally inept.
- In **Yellow** you bring yourself to the understanding that your life may be in danger and that you may have to do something about it.
- In **Orange** you have determined upon a specific adversary and are prepared to take action which may result in his death, but you are not in a lethal mode.
- In **Red** you are in a lethal mode and will shoot if circumstances warrant.

Cooper's Color Codes for self defense awareness

WHITE

- Relaxed
- Unaware
- Unprepared

Example:
Walking and texting

YELLOW

- Relaxed
- Alert Mindset
- Aware of Surroundings

Example:
Aware of where exits are

ORANGE

- Heightened state of alertness
- Something doesn't look or feel right

Example:
Someone wearing a ski coat in July

RED

- High potential for a threat
- Concerned for your survival

Example:
Run. Hide. Fight.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **ON**
- **DO NOT** handle Firearms & Equipment

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE







Hot Range:

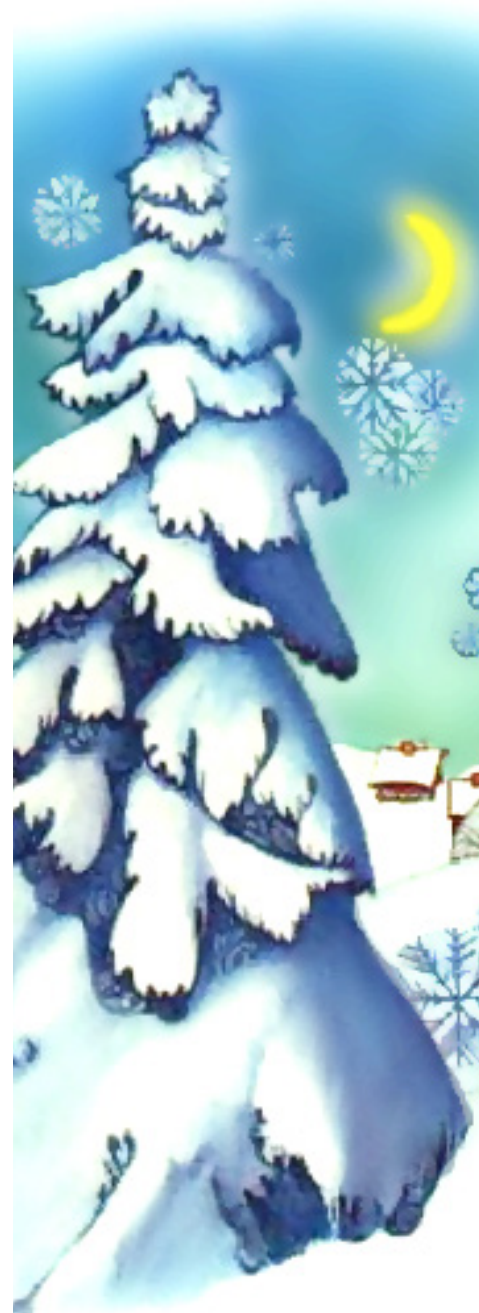

Covid 19 Update: Muzzle Loading Silhouette, Muzzle Loading Bullseye, and Traditional Archery contests are still scheduled at this time for 2021. Please check the EF&GA website/calendar for updates before each contest. Masks and Social Distancing are mandatory at these events. Our facilities are modified as needed to separate shooters in both the loading areas, and on the firing line. Masks can be removed on the firing line when you shoot, but must be back on your face when you step away from the line. Because moving all of the "furniture" in the range house is labor intensive, (as well as setting up the steel targets), volunteers are welcome in the early AM from 0630 until we start at 0800. Volunteers are also encouraged to stay and help clear the range of targets, and/or put the range house back together from noon until 1:30 PM. My aching back thanks you.

January 3rd Muzzle Loading Bullseye Contest: This year our first paper punching contest will start with two 50 yard targets. You get 13 shots at each target. Your best 10 count for score. The entry fee is \$10 for SPAR members, (Society of Primitive American Riflemen), \$15 for non-Spar EF&GA members and \$20 for non-Spar and non-member invited guests.

January 3rd Traditional Archery Contest: We will be starting the year with a short plates course of fire. The contest starts at 1100 in the Campground.

January 24th Muzzle Loading Silhouette Contest: This will start our yearly cycle of different distance steel silhouette shoots for the year. January will be a Super Short Range. Feb will be a Standard Short Range. March will be a Mid Range and April will be a Long Range. As always, in the event of a rain day, we will change the setup to Super Short Range and shoot from under the eaves of the range house. Single Shot Pistol and Revolver will start at 0800. Rifle will start between 0930 and 1000. Fees are \$1 for Pistol / Revolver. Rifle is \$5 for EF&GA members and \$10 for non-member invited guests. (Note: We shoot replica muzzle loading rifles shooting patched round ball only. We offer an Open and Primitive category. We also offer a black powder Cartridge Rifle category. On the Super Short Range course we add a Trade Gun category for the flintlock smoothbore guys.

November 22nd Contest Results: This was our National Bison Day Contest. We had a good turnout for this one as the offer of prizes brought people out to play. Ray Bucholz had about \$500 in prizes in the form of gold coins and art work. After the contest we shot a novelty "post shoot" with balloons tied to a wooden flag pole at 20 yards. Alex Luz Olson won the event after multiple shots chipping away at the pole. We did a drawing to give away 3 complete Turkey dinners. These included a Precooked Turkey Breast, Pouch of instant Mash Potatoes, Can of Cranberry Sauce, and a homemade Pumpkin Pie.

You will find that TWO shooters shot perfect scores this time around. Steely eyed concentration for nine perfect shots over 90 minutes.

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
