DARRIN'S DOSSIER

Independence

This year the 4th of July will seem very different for all of us. The fun and tasty barbecues with friends and family followed by awesome fireworks displays are off the table this year. Stay at Home Orders and social distancing have made the

barbecues and such impossible. Most of the major fireworks displays have been cancelled to prevent social gatherings. Rather than sitting around complaining about what I can't do this year, I decided to read more about how and why we have the tradition of celebrating the 4th of July.

Before the Revolutionary War, people who lived in the 13 Colonies did not consider themselves as Americans. They were colonists of the New World and considered themselves British subjects. As subjects of the crown, they had an annual tradition of celebrating the king's birthday with the ringing of church bells and celebrating in the street. After the 'Shot Heard Round the World' on April 19th, 1775 at Mariam's Crossing, the world of the colonists changed. When the Declaration of Independence was approved and signed by the Continental Congress on July 4th, 1776 they were too busy working on winning our independence to have time for celebrations. However, by the summer of 1776, colonists began celebrating the birth of a nation by holding mock funerals for King George III as a symbol of the end of the monarchy's reign over America.

Philadelphia held the first annual commemoration of independence on July 4, 1777, while revolutionary troops were still occupied with the ongoing war.

For the first two decades after the Declaration of Independence was written, people did not celebrate it much. It was too new and too many other historic events were happening in the young nation.

But there were some early celebrations.

It was reported that General George Washington issued double rations of rum to all his soldiers to mark the anniversary of independence in 1778. He did the same in 1781, several months before the American victory at Yorktown — the last major land battle of the revolution.

Before we all complain that we can't celebrate the way that we used to do it, we should all reflect on the sacrifice that the early Americans made so that we can govern ourselves and decide how we choose to celebrate today.

New Rules of Engagement

The State and County requirements for outdoor activities have been complicated to decipher and like the rules for bars, restaurants, and other businesses, they can change at any time. The COVID-19 Committee has been working closely with the shoot chairs and instructors to iron out a set of procedures that will work for our events and/or classes without compromising safety. As of this writing, the rules look like this:

- 1** - The Shoot Chair will identify a Health Compliance Person who will monitor the event. While he/she is on-duty, he/she will NOT participate in the event. If an event has multiple relays, this duty may be handed off to another person so that there is always someone identified with the task of overseeing the COVID compliance for the event.
- 2** - As required by the County guidelines, participants will be at least six feet apart to accommodate Social Distancing.
- 3** - Each Shoot Chair will define and describe the face mask requirements for their respective event. The Health Compliance person (item 1 above) will monitor and council participants of the event to make sure that the event maintains proper compliance.
- 4** - Temperatures of people acting as staff will be taken (per County requirements, staff includes volunteers). We have purchased proximity (touchless) thermometers to make this as easy as possible. Temperatures will NOT be recorded to prevent HIPAA violations. Anyone tested with a fever will be directed to pursue medical attention.
- 5** - Hand sanitizer dispensers have been installed at each Range and in the Meeting Hall. The Shoot Chair will announce and point out the location of the closest hand sanitizer. Hand washing can be done in the rest rooms as usual.
- 6** - The Shoot Chair must have the proper County-required documentation on-hand during the event.

These rules and requirements could change at any time. The County of San Diego is constantly adjusting the Health Order in response to changing statistics and directions from the State of California as well as the CDC.

In order to minimize disappointment and wasted efforts, please be sure to check the web site for up to date information. The Shoot Chair of your favorite event would also have the latest information for their respective event(s).

Next Contest: July 26th - This contest will be a Super Short Range event with a couple of twists to enhance social distancing. Please read the contest outline below. Face masks **WILL BE REQUIRED** for the duration of this contest. If you feel that you cannot wear a face mask for the required period of time, or for the activities involved, you may want to sit this one out. This is **NOT** negotiable. If you feel the need to discuss this, please call me in advance of the contest. My contact information is on the club website under "Shoot Chairs"

Covid-19 Changes to Operate: Muzzle Loading Silhouette / Contests

Protective Equipment: All participants will be required to wear a face masks and/or such other protective gear as required by state and local ordinances on the date of the contest. Hand sanitizer will be available at the green sign in sheet location. Soap and water are available in the main restrooms for hand washing.

Sign In: The Shoot Chair will enter the names of all participants on the scoring sheet. Entry fees will be deposited in a provided steel cash box. For the July contest, ONLY EF&GA members may enter the contest. To minimize contact, it is recommended that you have EXACT CHANGE for the entry process. \$1 for Pistol, and \$5 for rifle.

Number of Participants Restricted: Total participants will be restricted to 18 mixed class shooters and up to 2 Primitive Class Shooters. (Only 18 benches on the 150. Primitive Class shooter do not load from a bench). (two club rifle racks for Primitive Class shooters to stack their rifles between relays). Time permitting, we can run a second relay group after the first group clears the range house. (i.e. the first group shoots the whole contest and departs before the second group shoots)

Bench Setup: Benches will be set up herringbone fashion with 9 benches at the front edge of the range house and 9 benches setup at the back of the range house, spaced equally. Only one shooter setup per bench unless members of the same family household.. All other tables and chairs will be moved out to the rear of the range house. The area 15 feet behind the range house will be considered NOT part of the controlled contest area.

Firing Line: The firing line will be established with rope and/or cones 5 yards out from the front of the range house. (This allows 15ft of walking space the width of the range to reach your firing point from your bench). Shooters on the line will maintain a minimum 6ft separation at all times.

If conditions do not allow 6ft separation on the line, shooters will be required to maintain their spacing and wait behind the line until a space becomes available. IE: Take turns. No tables or reloading support equipment will be allowed in front of the range house. (i.e. Pistol Reloading tables). (Targets will be set up 5yds further down-range to compensate)

Scoring: All participants will verbally report their scores to the Shoot Chair at the end of each relay. The Shoot Chair will enter all data on the scoring sheet. Participants will not touch the scoring sheet. Scores will be read off to the participants at the end of the contest. The Shoot Chair will monitor the Firing Line and the Range House for safety compliance.

Set Up Between Relays: The Shoot Chair will designate 3 people, (on a rotating basis), to reset the steel silhouettes between relays. Gloves must be worn to reset the steel targets. Targets, (rough cut steel/ painted on one side), will be in direct UV sunlight/heat during the duration off the contest. This is deemed sufficient to sterilize the targets during the contest.

Personnel Requirements: The contest will be run and administered by a Shoot Chair / RSO AND a designated Health & Safety Officer. The H&S officer will be monitoring contestants for compliance with PPE and Social Distancing requirements.

Best Mask Award: There have been a number of manufacturers selling a variety of Non-Medical face masks of late. I am not qualified to determine their usefulness or practicality from a medical standpoint. From a humor or aesthetic standpoint, some of these are outrageously funny, disgusting, or frightening. If you think you have the best mask in any of the preceding categories, then bring it to the contest and we can have a group vote for the best one. There will be a small prize involving something alcoholic, (after the contest).

InterClub at Lemon Grove (7/11/2020)

With the suspension of our Trap events, we have not had a lot of time to practice for competitions. Perhaps the lack of shooting will help us forget our bad habits so that we can do well in the InterClub at Lemon Grove Rod & Gun Club in Alpine on Saturday, July 11th.

Social distancing will be practiced. Masks will be worn in the sign up building and when not social distancing. Masks are not required while shooting.

The match begins with two rounds of Trap from 16 yards. Your total score determines your handicap yardage. After lunch, two rounds of Handicap will be shot with a squads shooting from a similar distance. A total of 100 targets will be shot by each participant.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
