

**Covid-19 Update:** For the interim we will continue with Members & Invited Guests. We will also shoot from the 8 yard line to provide ample free space to move across the range during the shoot. 

## NRA Basic Metallic Cartridge Reloading Course

Class Schedule – 1st Session (8 am – Noon) (7/3/2021, 8/7/2021 & 9/25/2021)

### **Class Description:**

Who figured this existential event would affect us so seriously? Need or want ammo but can't find any and mailing is not an option? You're left with an old American skill; self-sufficiency and creativity...Make your own!

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

### The class is structured in two sessions:

**1st session** – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall from 8 AM until noon.

**2nd session** – This is "Hands On" Training held at the reloading bench scheduled for a mutually agreed upon time and date. You will reload your own cartridges and produce ammunition that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (cases, primers, projectiles, powder) they are available for a \$10 surcharge. Prior registration and a \$20 deposit are required to secure a place in this class. Registration is necessary and limited.

### Trap Straights - Why We Do It

Shooting a trap straight is breaking all 25 targets in succession thrown for an individual by a trap machine during a single squad with an "official" score keeper. Breaking ALL 25 of them for the first time is more than just fun, it can be the fulfillment of a long and (often) agonizing path to personal success in a chosen, competitive sport/ discipline. Every one of the people who are listed in our Trap Straights column have achieved a significant goal, but for those listed as FIRST 25 – SHOT HIS/HER HAT!!, it is the achievement of a pinnacle, a very memorable "first time in your life" moment that will never be repeated. This gets a little more complicated when you achieve a straight in other games. In Doubles, there are 13 pairs (26 birds) and that is a particularly challenging feat to accomplish. Getting a 25 in 5-Stand is almost impossible but every so often, someone does it. Just as rare is a 25 from Handicap (27 Yards behind the Trap machine). If you look at the list of Straights every month, you might notice some patterns emerge. We have some really good Trap shooters in our Association. If you want to improve your scores and perhaps even shoot your hat someday, it's easy to figure out who to ask for pointers.

Last month was unique in that we shot 3 hats, had a Straight in 5-Stand, two straights from the 27-Yard Line, five 75 Straights and even one 100 Straight. Congratulations to all of you that have shot so well.

I want to make a point of congratulating *Austin Cote* for finally shooting his hat. He has been helping out for years as a Puller by helping to set up and tear down events, filling the machines, and keeping score. While doing all of that work, he has not had much time to practice shooting but he finally shot his First Straight while I was standing next to him on the line. I had the honor of sharing in the joy of shooting his hat. He has definitely earned every bit of that joy and it is a pleasure and an honor to shoot with him.

Stop by any scheduled Tuesday, Wednesday or Saturday Trap event and see what the fun is all about.

# **RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF**

I would like to welcome all the new members to our association and ask our current members to assist them in acclimating to our range and its safety rules.

Please remember to uncase/case your firearms on the shooting line and **NOT** on the tables or benches **behind** the firing line.

In the last few years in California and especially San Diego County it has become possible for mere mortals to obtain a Concealed Carry Weapons (CCW) license. I have been asked what our range policy is regarding CCW.

We operate a cold firearms range, no loaded firearms off the firing line. If you are carrying a licensed concealed firearm the key word is "Concealed". Please do not remove your loaded firearm from its holster to show your friends.

If you want to practice with your CCW firearm, bring it in your range bag. It is **NOT** permissible to draw your concealed loaded firearm from your holster, practice with it, load it back up and holster it again. Please remember for casual shooting our rules are stricter than for supervised events.

Just because you are licensed to carry a firearm does not necessarily mean you know how to holster and use it properly. I encourage you to get training and join some of our friendly competitions to become comfortable with drawing and holstering a firearm safely. Keep your booger hook off the trigger!

If you are interested in obtaining your CCW license here is some information to help you.

One important point to remember especially as a CCW holder is "every round down range has a lawyer behind it". Get CCW insurance!

Know how to use your firearm (muscle memory). Know the laws. You do not have the same indemnity as law enforcement. Know whether or not you can actually pull the trigger if you need to. It is a big responsibility to protect your family and your safety.

The range is starting to get back to "normal" operation with organized shoots getting ready to open back up to the public. We are always looking for volunteers to help with the organized shoots especially the Junior programs.

The Association is in need of Range Safety Officers (RSO) to help keep the range safe. Please contact me if you have time to volunteer, and you get a cool Red Hat and Shirt!

## As-issued Military Rifle Match by Jim McKim, Shoot Chair

Collecting and shooting vintage military service rifles is a popular sub-hobby for many firearms enthusiasts. Competing in a match with those rifles can add yet another level of enjoyment. One way to do that is to participate in the As-issued Military Rifle (AIMR) match held at EF&GA on the morning of the first Sunday of each month. This match is a multi-stage, multi-position high-power rifle match conducted per the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Games Events rules that puts competitors on a fairly even playing field by shooting vintage U. S. or foreign military service rifles that were, or could have been, carried by military personnel in combat operations in WWII or prior conflicts. The match honors "those who served" and carried these rifles while on military duty and also strives to preserve the traditions of military marksmanship in a structured competition.

This event, which was previously and incorrectly referred to as the "John C. Garand Match" and held only every other month, has been gaining popularity recently and is now held every month following the NMC event. Shooters are showing up with an interesting array of rifles, including not only US M1 "Garands" but US M1903s and M1 carbines, British Lee-Enfields, Swiss K31s, Russian "Mosin-Nagant" M1891s, and possibly soon a Japanese Arisaka or two. The variety is part of the fun. That, and knowing you won't be out-scored by someone with a tricked-out or high-end rifle, as all rifles must be in "as-issued" configuration. The 3-stage, 30-round match includes a rapid-fire stage, requiring shooters to perform a reload, so they need a clip or magazine appropriate for their rifle. Other than that, not much else is necessary, although a spotting scope is useful for checking your sighter shots, and a mat of some kind makes the prone stages more comfortable. A sling appropriate for your rifle, and knowing how to use it, can greatly improve your accuracy in the prone position. Though not reguired, that kind of dedication to authenticity certainly added another level of enjoyment for the other match participants.

## How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title - This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
