100 yd Range Remodeling

Escondido Fish and Game will soon begin the remodeling project on the 100 yard range, pending a vote of all voting members. The Board has proposed a remodel of the existing structure not to exceed \$75,000. Per our By-Laws, any expenditure greater than \$50,000 requires a vote of the entire

membership to approve or reject the proposed expenditure. The letters were mailed in June. Please return your completed ballots by 8/15/2022. Don't forget to include postage on the return envelope.

The remodel will include replacing the overhead and extending it by 15 feet making room for 4 more shooting benches. The plan will extend the existing concrete slab to the west by the same distance. All of the aprons will be removed and replaced to eliminate trip hazards and additional lighting will be added.

Vote for By-Laws Revision

The By-Laws Committee has completed its proposed revision of the Escondido Fish and Game Association By-Laws. The prospective revision with recommended changes was sent to the entire membership in June. All members present at the August $11^{\rm th}$ Membership Meeting will vote to approve or reject each item.

NRA Membership Renewal Through EF&GA

Escondido Fish and Game Association is a National Recruiter for the NRA. In that capacity we get a rebate on all renewals that go through us. Those rebates represent part of our annual budgeted income. In fiscal year 2021-2022 we received \$2275 in rebates from the NRA for our membership renewals. Additionally, the renewal through EF&GA is less expensive for you at \$10 annually or \$45 if you want the magazine. Once you have renewed your NRA membership through EF&GA you can disregard the solicitations from the NRA.



New Member Volunteer Hours Allowance

EF&GA values membership involvement. To that end, volunteer hours are required for all new members. Six hours are required the first year of your membership and 4 hours are required for the next 4 years.

The previous policy required the primary member to complete the required volunteer hours. Secondary members were encouraged to participate, but their hours were not considered for meeting the membership obligation. Going forward, any volunteer hours completed by the primary member or the secondary member will count toward satisfying the requirement.

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 7/2/2022, 8/6/2022, 9/24/2022 & 11/5/2022

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

 ${f 1^{st}}$ session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed to time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (ie: cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$15 surcharge.

Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this limited class.

Bow Hunter Education Class 7/9/2022, 9/10/2022, 12/10/2022 (7:00 am – 3 pm)

Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills, and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more.

Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.



Hello Everyone,

Last month for some odd reason, there was .223 brass on the 100 yard Rifle Range halfway downrange in the drainage ditch aligned with the steel targets. Casual shooting is not allowed in front of the (Red) firing line on any range. If you are shooting at the steel targets during casual shooting, you are only allowed to shoot from the last three shooting benches on the far right hand side of the shelter.

When unbagging your handguns on the Pistol Range, bring your handguns up to the shooting bench and unbag them there. When unbagging your rifles on the 100 yard and 150 yard ranges, bring your rifles up to the shooting benches and unbag them on the bench. Do not unbag your firearms from the seating benches behind the yellow line.

All shooters: Remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area.

Make sure that what you bring with you to the range, you also take back home with you. There are still items being left at the range, like range boxes with ammo.

The new Casual Shooting Rules are now posted on the EF&GA Website and in binders at each of the range kiosks. These rules supersede all previous rules and signage on the range. We will be updating the signs in the near future. Please go to the web site and review the updates. All members and guests are responsible for knowing and following the new Casual Shooting Rules.





TRAP CORNER

Most of the Trap shooters have met **Chris Cote**. He has served two terms (four years) on the Board of Directors and is heavily involved in all of the Junior Marksmanship events. BLACK POWDER NEWS

2022 Rendezvous: Was held on June 11th and 12th. Steely Eyed veterans of the 1830s Rocky Mountains Fur Trade met to "shoot it all" over two days. Most contestants elected to wear "period" clothing from head to toe. Saturday opened with contestants shooting a rifle "walk thru" with two shots each at 10 targets. All targets were at "unknown" distances. Mutual spotting was required to determine "hits" as the heavy steel we use does not move much. (And most of us are too deaf to hear it if we do hit it). After rifle, we retired to the campground to run a knife and hawk throwing contest. A brief interlude for refreshments and lunch, and then it was back to the 150 to shoot a (single shot), pistol "walk thru'. Following the pistol contest we again retired to the campground for a discussion of the day's event, and more fluids. (It was pretty hot that day.)





On Sunday we redistributed the targets, (moved them in closer), and shot Trade Gun (Smoothbore Flintlocks- front sight only). We then exercised our sledge hammer skills, removing all the targets on the 150 and opened it back up to the general membership.

Primitive archery was next on the schedule. This year we ran archery on the archery range, rather than the campground. When the archers finished and recovered we moved back to the campground and held a "fire starting" contest. (Flint and Steel, no Bics) Despite some singed facial hair, the winner had a fire going in seconds, while the longest time was just under 2 minutes. We dragged Tuck's hose over and made sure everything was OUT.

We moved on to the Blanket Prizes. Contestants that chose to participate, were required to bring a \$25 value Mountain Man themed prize to place on a blanket. Names were drawn from a hat. AIMR NEWS

by Jim McKim, Shoot Chair

At the June match we had the usual showing of shooters and their M1s, M1903s, Arisaka and Lee-Enfield, but what was different was the closeness of some of the scores. We had a clear winner at 265-1X (out of 300 possible) but an almost-tie for second at 260 and another almost-tie for third at 250. Those "almosts" were broken by the shooter with the highest number of Xs. In both cases, one shooter had one more X than the other. If the number of Xs had been equal, then the tie would have been broken by the shooter having the highest score (including Xs) in the stage with the most difficult shooting position (offhand) and if necessary, progressing through the stages to slow prone.

The historical discussion for the month was a report on the new book, Against All Odds - A True Story of Ultimate Courage and Survival in World War II by Alex Kershaw, given by yours truly. It highlights four highly decorated individuals in the U.S. Army's 3rd Division, from fighting in North Africa, to the invasions of Italy and Southern France and the push up along the Rhone, through the Colmar Pocket in the harsh winter of '44- '45, and on into Germany. The four individuals were: former pro footballer Capt. Maurice Britt, Pvt. (later 1st Lt.) Audie Murphy, Keith Ware (who went from a draftee to lieutenant colonel in WWII and later major general), and Michael J. Daly (a West Point dropout who landed on Omaha Beach as a private and then joined the 3rd Division and finished the war as a captain). For their acts of valor and heroism, all of these men received the Medal of Honor, all but Daly the Distinguished Service Cross, all one or more Silver Stars, all the Bronze Star, and 2-4 Purple Hearts each, among other awards, making them some of the most highly decorated soldiers in history.

Britt lost part of his right arm at Anzio and returned to the States to promote war bonds and went on to become Lieutenant Governor of Arkansas. Murphy joined Company B, 1st Battalion, 15th Regiment, 3rd Division in early 1943 and served in that company for the remainder of the war, accepting an officer's commission only if he could remain with B Company. He was wounded badly in the hip and later in both legs. Ware went on to an Army career, instructing at West Point and then volunteered to serve in Vietnam, where he landed during the Tet Offensive. Later he, his command group and helicopter crew came under heavy fire and were killed in the ensuing crash. Daly was shot through the face in Nuremberg, Germany, less than three weeks before VE Day. He survived his wounds and went on to a business career and served as a director and trustee of a hospital for thirty years.

Although I didn't particularly care for the author's style, I found the subject matter very interesting, especially because it covers aspects of the war that have not received nearly as much attention as the Normandy invasion and battles in the Pacific, and the exploits of those four men are nothing short of truly awe-inspiring. And as is so typical, all four said they only did what anyone would have done and that the true heroes were those left behind.





The Gremlin (or what's going on??)

One of the most common complaints I overhear in the smallbore field is, "I had this zeroed yesterday. Why isn't it today?" Same ammo right? Nothing has changed....or has it been changing right out of the box?

One of the things I constantly yammer about is how finicky the 22 caliber rifle is in regards to its ammunition. Not all brands are accurate in all rifles. A rifle should be matched to a brand it fires best.

One factor of that ammunition is its CONSISTENCY in production. CCI, Eley, SK, RWS and Aguila brands among others, all have different price and quality product lines of 22 LR ammo. One of the differences of these product lines is their rigid manufacturing quality control tolerances. When matched to a particular rifle the ratio of accuracy is increased.

In referencing this article I used a fresh box out of a fresh brick of a well known brand of 22 rimfire ammunition. Everyone seems to feel this is a good brand. This ammo is standard velocity (1070f/s), 40gr 22 long rifle. Here is what I found in a box of 50 rounds:

Bullet diameter:

32 @ .223 18 @ .224

Cartridge OverAll Length

(SAAMI calls for a standard COAL of .996"):

1 @ .996, 2 @ .995,

6 @ .994, 6 @ .993,

6 @ .992, 7 @ .991, 7 @ .990, 6 @ .989,

5 @ .988, 4 @ .987

The combination of these physical parameters would also produce ballistic variances.

So the question now becomes, "Which combination did you zero with?" There are shooters with abilities and excellent quality rifles on our lines who are handicapped because of this inherit rifle sensitivity due to manufacturing strategies.

In closing, different brands will give different results. The rifle will tell you which one it enjoys best.

Description – This can be a few sentences but no more than a paragraph. Abbreviations are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price - A specific dollar amount and any qualifiers.

Contact Information – This should be a name AND a phone number and/or an e-mail address.
