Patriotism

So, I started writing this on Flag Day, thinking about what to write for the July newsletter. My first thought was about Independence Day. While many think about barbecues and fireworks, I think about my own family history. The family lore that has been passed on through the generations is that long ago a man named **Lewis Eaton** was an officer in the British Army in the early 1770's. There was no further information about him until a year or two later when he appeared as an officer in the US Navy during the Revolutionary War. My great-grandmother liked to tell us stories about how he was a turncoat during the war, who raised a family in the Ohio Valley after the war. My guess is that those stories may have been only partially true, but it was always fun to hear my uncles, aunts, and cousins talk about them.

I enjoy seeking out books, stories, and any other information about how our ancestors lived, fought, and survived during the Revolutionary War. I am not only interested in the firearms of the day but also what they ate and how they survived in the wilderness without conveniences like Gore-tex, Bic lighters, or dehydrated food. With all of those obstacles, they kept their powder dry so that they could continue to fight for our freedom. I am truly grateful for their sacrifices, determination, and tenacity.

100 Yard Remodel

We are moving along with the 100 Yard Remodel project. During the June General Membership Meeting, **Jack Starlin** presented drawings and photos of similar structures made by the same manufacturer. There were many questions asked and answered and the general consensus is that we are proceeding on the right track. I plan to provide that same information on the web site in the form of a document so that we all know what to expect.

We are working with the manufacturer to narrow down the delivery and installation schedule so that we can minimize disruption of the existing 100 Yard Range. We plan to remove the existing structure so that we can salvage materials (2x6 lumber, plywood, etc..) for the new structure (concrete forms) as well as other projects around the Range. There may be temporary pop-up type shade structures while the project is under way and for a short period of time. We will also need to move the firing line downrange a few yards, but we are working hard to minimize that sort of inconvenience to the Membership.

100 Yard Range Remodel

As many of you know we are off and running on the 100 yard range remodel. At this point we have decided to use a prefab metal building. The manufacturer will install this building on our foundation. **Dave Robertson** has agreed to be in charge of the demo and excavation and is already proceeding. We will need volunteers to disassemble the old structure to salvage materials.

I still need someone to be in charge of the concrete/ foundation portion. We will need volunteers for the forming, drilling and epoxy of reinforcement to the existing slab, and the placement of the rest of the reinforcement. I would like to have some experts volunteer to assist with pouring the new slab. We are planning to hire professional finishers to make sure that the slab is as perfect as it can possibly be.

Once the building is set, I will need volunteers to install the rigid insulation and the finish ceiling material. This portion will just require people that are handy with basic carpentry skills. NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 7/1/2023, 9/2/2023 & 11/4/2023 (8 am – 12 noon)

Need or want ammo but can't find any? MAKE YOUR OWN!

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands-On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (e.g., cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$15 surcharge.

Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this limited class.

Hunter Education Class 7/8/2023, 8/12/2023 & 10/14/2023 (7 am – 4 pm)

Class Description:

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.



NRA Basic Rifle Class 8/26/2023 (7:30 am – 3 pm)

Class Description:

This course teaches the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude necessary for the safe use of a rifle in target shooting. The course includes classroom and range time learning to shoot rifles. Students learn NRA's rules for safe gun handling, rifle parts and operation, ammunition, shooting fundamentals, range rules, shooting from the bench rest, prone, sitting, standing and kneeling positions, cleaning and continued opportunities for skill development.

Bow Hunter Education Class 9/9/2023 (7:00 am – 3 pm)

Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello everyone,

Birdshot

Someone is shooting shotgun birdshot at targets on the rifle range. Not allowed. You can only shoot shotgun slugs on the rifle range.

Chambers Empty?

When you are finished shooting on the Pistol Range/Trap Range/100 Yard range and the 150 yard range, and before you walk off the firing line make sure your firearm is empty and no rounds are left in the chamber. Sounds simple, but it has happened that there is a round in the chamber and it gets discharged back behind the firing line. Pay attention.

Guests

Members pay attention to your guests.

Unloading Gear

Blue Blinking lights on or off applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking lights are on, do not unload firearms or gear from your car. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go "hot" and then you can unload your firearms and gear.

The Green Sheets

If you sign any of the Green Sheets and the "Date" and "Range" is not filled in, fill it in. There are Green Sheets being turned in with no "Date" and "Range" information.

Clean up your Target Frames

All shooters remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. This is your range. Respect it and your fellow members.

Wildlife

Watch for Turkeys and Deer on the range. Call a "Cease Fire" if wildlife is present.

Hello Shotgun Shooters,

We have had some wonderful weather as of late and more shooters are blessing us with their presence. On that note, we have a couple things we need to review.

Range Lights: We have added some additional blue cold range lights to the trap light poles. This is to help with cold range notification. When the cold range lights are on, as you know, we are not to handle our shotguns. If you are approaching the trap range from the parking lot, please stop and wait for the light to be turned off. Bagging or unbagging guns must be done during a hot range. You must practice muzzle discipline. Please do not muzzle your neighbors.

Shotgun Handling: At the Escondido Fish and Game Association we do not move with loaded shotguns to and from the line or in between stations. If you are asked to confirm you are unloaded by the puller or a fellow shooter, please oblige and confirm. Remember safety first. If you have a break action gun you must break it open when moving. If you have a semi-auto or a pump, the action must be open and facing out when moving. Semi-auto and pump action must never have the muzzle pointed at your toe. The semi-auto and pump must be muzzle up when moving and up or down range when at the line.

Leaving the Range: We must remember our belongings, and to clean up after ourselves. Week after week we seem to have debris left around the trap ranges soda cans, water bottles, hulls and - YES - guns and ammo. Members, this is your range. Please take a moment before you leave and look around. Have you cleaned up your stuff, packed your equipment? Guests, this is not your range. Being on it is a privilege. Make sure you have cleaned up after yourselves.

The August InterClub will be held at our range on August 12. We always seem to have the biggest event with shooters coming from 5 different clubs in the area. I believe it is because we have the best place to shoot. If you are interested, please come and check it out. AS-ISSUED MILITARY RIFLE MATCH NEWS

Czech vz.24

Rifles and cartridges used by the participants in the June match were: US M1 and US M1903-A3, .30-06; Czech vz.24, 7.92x57mm (8mm) Mauser; Japanese Arisaka Model 38, 6.5x50mm; and British Lee-Enfield No. 4 Mk I, .303 British.

The "show and tell" this month was the Czech vz.24 rifle, presented by yours truly. The vz. 24 rifle is a bolt-action carbine designed and produced in Czechoslovakia from 1924 to 1942. The rifles were manufactured by Zbrojovka Brno, which is still in existence as part of the Colt-CZ Group. In Czech, "Zbrojovka" means "armory", and Brno is a city in the southeast of the Czech Republic. Those of us who own modern CZ rifles such as the smallbore 452-455 models might consider the vz.24 as the granddaddy of our newer models.

Czechoslovakia emerged as an independent state following the fall of the Austro-Hungarian Empire after WW I and needed small arms for their new army. Their first effort was the vz. 98/22, a derivative of the German Gewehr 98, even though with a 740 mm (29.1 in) barrel it was known to be too long and cumbersome for trench warfare. Shortly thereafter they developed the vz. 23 and then the vz. 24 which is based on the Karabiner 98AZ with a 590 mm (23.2 in) barrel . Even though the vz. 24 resembled the Karabiner 98k, it predated it by more than a decade. But even as a "carbine" of the era, it was 1,100 mm (43.3 in) long and weighed 4.2 kg (9.2 lb).

The vz.24 had a Mauser-style action with a straight bolt handle and a tangent rear sight graduated from 300 meters to 2000 meters. It was primarily chambered in 7.92×57mm (8mm) Mauser but was also chambered in 7x57 Mauser and 7.65x53 Argentine for export. It featured a five-round, fixed, internal magazine that could be fed with stripper clips. The stock had a semi-pistol grip, upper hand guard, and sling swivels on the rear barrel band, the bottom of the butt and the side of the grip. A cleaning rod was stored under the barrel.

Use of the vz. 24 was not limited to Czechoslovakia by any means. Exports were sent to numerous South and Central American, European and Asian countries. Some of them even made it to Vietnam via Lithuania>Germany>Soviet Union to equip the Viet Cong and were captured by American forces in the Vietnam War! One of the larger export number recipients was Romania, which adopted the vz. 24 as their standard infantry rifle in the 1930s. By mid-1943 they had received 445,640 rifles, all marked with an "R" as part of their serial number, ranging from "AR" to "ZR". My rifle is an "XR", a later production unit that does not include the Romania crest on the receiver.

The 7.92×57mm (8mm) Mauser is a rimless, bottlenecked cartridge that in its day was one of the world's most popular military cartridges, used by both Axis and Allied powers during WW II. The "standard" military rifle version of Germany, the s.S Patrone, was loaded with a 197.5 gr spitzer bullet but other versions ranged from 153 to 225 grs. Surplus ammo from Yugoslavia, Iran and other countries was readily available ten years ago, but not anymore. Surplus ammo generally has corrosive primer salts that are easily mitigated with a water flush of the barrel prior to cleaning. Current 198 gr 8mm Mauser is produced by Prvi Partizan.
