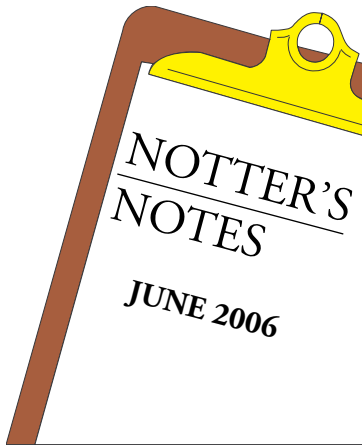

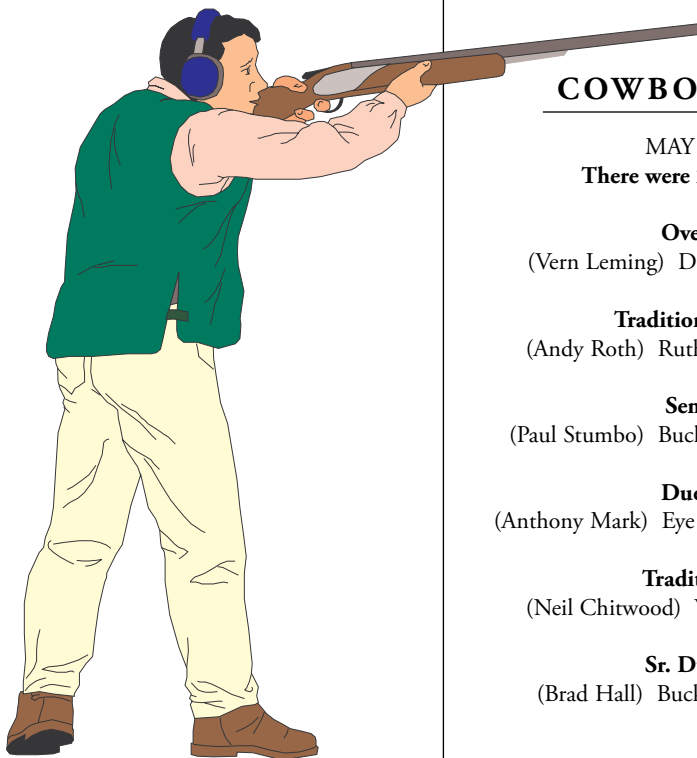

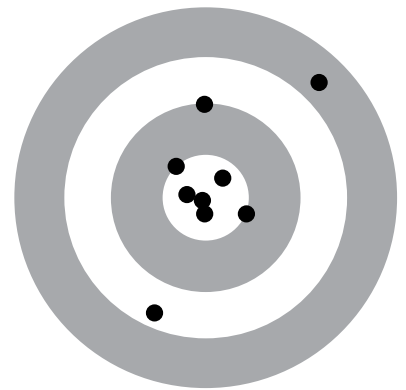

**CALIFORNIA LEGISLATION
AB 2714**

Summary: NRA opposes this bill.

Issue: AMMUNITION SALES (Torrico)

Description: This bill would provide that no ammunition or reloaded ammunition may be delivered pursuant to a retail transaction unless the purchaser personally presents clear evidence of his or her identity and age to the seller of the ammunition. Violation of these provisions would be an offense punishable by imprisonment in a county jail for a term not to exceed six months, or by a fine not to exceed \$1,000, or by both imprisonment and that fine, with increased penalties for second or subsequent violations.

Latest Info: 05/19/2006 - AB2714 may come up for a vote on the Assembly Floor on Monday, May 22nd.

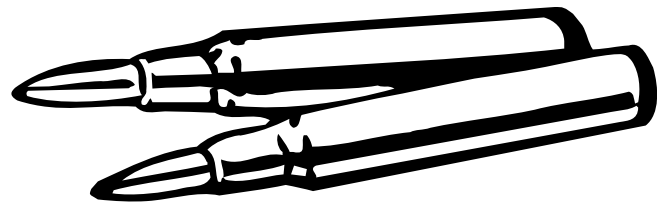
SB 1192

Summary: NRA supports this bill.

Issue: GUN LAW STUDY (Hollingsworth)

Description: This bill would require the California State University at Sacramento to conduct a study of the impact of various firearms laws on violence and crimes involving firearms. The study would be reported to the Legislature no later than January 1, 2008. The study would be funded by grants and private contributions. The bill states findings and declarations of the legislature in regard to studying the impact of firearms legislation on violence.

Latest Info: 04/23/06 - SB 1192 is currently assigned to the Senate Public Safety Committee. April 4, 2006 hearing was canceled by the author. Standby for new hearing date.

NRA to Host 10th Youth Education Summit; \$30,000 in Scholarships to be Awarded

The National Rifle Association's Youth Education Summit (YES) program is preparing for its 10th year of hosting outstanding high school sophomores and juniors who are striving to learn more about the U.S. government. A weeklong educational experience is in store for 42 students, chosen through a competitive application process, who will be in the Washington D.C. area from June 19-25. YES is an expense-paid, seven-day event that encourages participants to become active and knowledgeable U.S. citizens. Emphasis during the week is put on the significance of the Constitution and the Bill of Rights, developing an understanding of federal government, and learning the importance of active participation in civic affairs.

Commenting on last year's YES visit, 16-year-old Ryann McGough of Livermore, Colo. said, "It was the coolest thing I've ever done in my life. YES gave me an awesome opportunity to learn about our country's capital and discuss many aspects of government with people my own age."

Activities on this year's schedule include:

Guest speakers and research time at NRA Headquarters and the National Firearms Museum.

Competitive debates with other high school students from across the nation.

Informative tours at historic sites and monuments in and around Washington, D.C.

Traversing an obstacle course at the Marine Corps Base in Quantico, Virginia.

In addition to the week in Washington, D.C., YES participants compete for \$30,000 in college scholarships. The first round of awards totals \$10,000 and is given at the conclusion of the YES program. Participants are judged on their initial application, on-site debates, and participation during the week's activities. Multiple students receive scholarships in the first round and the total number of students selected dictates how much each student will receive.

The second round of scholarships, called grand scholarships, is comprised of \$20,000 and involves a second application, available to the participants after they go through YES. Since the program's inception in 1996, over \$140,000 in scholarships have been awarded.

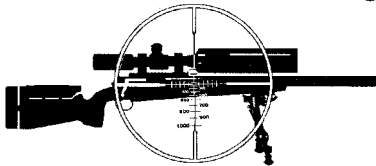

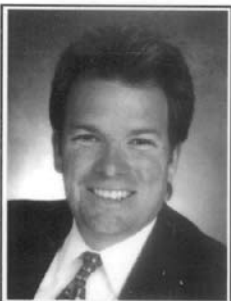
