COVID kicked us in the teeth, with having to shut down for so long. I won't miss the masks! We are opening up our programs and I hope that we will be up and running by July with everything.


Our 75th anniversary barbecue was great. Lots of smiling faces, good games, great food, in spite of the rain. Hopefully, next year no "liquid sunshine".

Steel Targets!

Well, we have been talking about them for a long time and they are finally here. This is a prototype enclosure for steel targets on the 100-Yard Range. The enclosure is for the four shooting positions (two benches), on the far right side of the Range. If this works well, we plan to expand it to the next four shooting positions as well. The enclosure is designed to contain the splatter from rifle rounds hitting the AR-550

steel targets. This is designed for use with 30 caliber and smaller rifle rounds.

We should not have to repeat this again, but steel in any projectiles is still NOT permitted. Besides the fire hazard, steel in the projectiles will damage the targets. If the steel targets are torn up too quickly, we will be forced to remove them entirely. If you see someone next to you with questionable ammunition, politely inquire and offer to test their ammo if you have a magnet handy.

At the time of this writing, the targets are suspended by steel cables. We are testing various methods of hanging the targets to find out what will be easy to maintain and effective.

I want to take this opportunity to publicly thank *Dave Robertson* and *Gary Fukuda* for the time and effort that they have put into this part of MOAPL (Mother Of All Project Lists). People keep telling me about how much they like this new feature of the Range but I can't take credit for much of it. Dave and Gary did all of the heavy-lifting on this one.

MOAPL Update

We are coming down to the home stretch of the MOAPL (Mother Of All Project Lists). I wanted to throw in a quick update on the status of the big items on that list.

5-Stand Improvements – The concrete and electrical work has been completed. We are waiting on the shipment of the plastic Trap machine covers for the permanent machines (#1, #2, #4, #7). At the time of this writing, I received tracking information for the common carrier shipment leaving Kentucky this morning.

Trap Safety Lights – The fixtures have been painted with rugged bed-liner paint and the electronics should go in this month. We still need to do more painting of the Trap bunkers so if you want to pitch in, please let me know. Pistol Short-Range Extensions – The GREEN target slots are in place and operational with matching GREEN target frames. The new alcove for the target frames is also in place and operational.



Well House Conversion – The old well has been legally and properly decommissioned and the old well house has been improved with a new concrete floor, new electrical, and a cutout for a new soda machine.

Air Compressor – The equipment is installed and bolted to the floor. At the time of this writing, the plumbing from the compressor to the target-turners is missing a short segment and that should be completed this month. The electrical/electronics of the controller are also being tuned and simplified as well.

75-Yard Target Slot on the 100-Yard Range – The concrete work has been completed and it has been received well by the membership.

Steel Targets on the 100-Yard Range – As stated above, the Prototype is progressing well and people are loving it. As we tune the design to work with our geography and our membership, we plan to expand this design to more of the 100-Yard Range as well as the 150 and Pistol Ranges in the future (under a separate version of MOAPL).

Bottom Line – After the extended Range closure that made the MOAPL possible, we are cleaning up the loose ends now. The extended Range closure was due to the lead reclamation project on the back of the Trap Ranges. After the recycling contractor has been paid, the revenue from the reclaimed lead will pay for at least 80% of the entire cost of this MOAPL. We should have a more accurate accounting of this in the July newsletter. When it comes to bang for the buck, this is hard to beat. None of this would have been possible without a tremendous MOAPL Committee. I plan to summarize this better and recognize the MOAPL Committee more next month.





InterClub (6/12/2021)



If you have not been to the range in a while there have been several enhancements. One of the more popular ones is the expansion of the 5, 7, and 10 yard distances across the entire length of the Pistol range. No more crowding and trying to see how many shooters can fit in the old area!

One of the projects that still needs to be completed is permanent steel on the short Rifle range (100 yard). This will be AR550 steel, which is strong enough for just about any normal cartridge. BUT, and I know you are thinking it, don't try and put holes in them! Don't shoot the stand, Don't shoot the chain holding the target. I want to come out and shoot my Sharps (45-70) before they get destroyed. Don't abuse them please!

On the short Rifle range (100 yard) you are allowed to shoot a Pistol at 50 yards+. We are now allowing Black Powder Pistols to use the same range at 25 yards+. This only applies to Black Powder Ball Pistols.

Spring is here, the plague is ending and some of you still have ammo! This is a good time to come back to the range for casual and organized matches. We have many excellent shooting opportunities that can keep your shooting skills current.

If you are looking for training we have great instructors for Pistol, Rifle, Shotgun and Reloading. Take a class or contact the instructors for one-on-one instruction. The range is looking for volunteers for the Junior programs which will be opening up again and I am always looking for qualified Range Safety Officers to help manage the facility and keep everyone safe.

- **DO NOT** handle Firearms & Equipment

- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:


Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
