NRA Basic Shotgun Class 6/12/2022 (8 am – 5 pm)



Class Description:

This class covers firearm safety and basic skills of Shotgunning. It is also designed to train the student with the proper skills required to hit a moving target. The NRA Certified Shotgun Course teaches stance, gun ready position, swing to target, trigger pull and follow through. The class consists of classroom exercises and hands on instruction including live fire exercise through which students will learn and demonstrate safe and proper shotgun shooting procedures and technique. NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class

7/2/2022, 8/6/2022, 9/24/2022 & 11/5/2022

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st **session** – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed to time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

Bow Hunter Education Class

7/9/2022 (7:00 am - 3 pm)


Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills, and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more.

Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

RANGEMASTER SOUND-OF

Hello everyone,

I would like to address some issues with targets this month. At no time during Casual Shooting is shot allowed on the pistol, 100 yard or 150 yard ranges. If you need to pattern check your shotgun, there is a pattern stand at the end of the wall between the Pistol Range and the Trap Field. When shot is used on the ranges it damages the target frames. A lot of time and effort goes into maintaining the target frames and backers, not to mention association funds, which could be used elsewhere. Also, to the person using blue tape, the association rules are do not leave your targets in the trash cans. Take them home with you and dispose of them in your trash cans. I would ask that all shooters remove your targets from the target backers so the next person does not have to.

If you are the last person on one of the ranges make sure the "Blue Blinking Lights" are turned off.

Make sure that what you bring with you to the range, you also take home with you.



You Need These Items:

Round Balls: 20 balls minimum for each Silhouette contest. Don't leave your balls at home. We will tease you endlessly..... **Percussion Caps:** or priming powder (spare Flints if you're one of "those guys").

Flintlock Priming Tool: Even if you don't shoot a flintlock this is handy to clear dry-balls.

Adjustable Powder Measure: (because you NEVER pour powder directly from the can into your firearm)

Powder Can, Powder Horn, or Flask of Black Powder: Containing a minimum of 1600 gns.

Shooting Patches: (pre-lubed by you if possible). Minimum 20 patches per Silhouette contest. Add a Patch Knife if you're cutting your own patches as you load.

Patch Lube: Your choice, liquid or grease. (Whole different discussion topic)

Cleaning Patches: (not the same as above) (Rec Pro-Shot 2-1/2" round cotton)

Cleaning Solvent: (not really cleaning, just softening the fouling between shots. Clean it at home.)

Ramrod/Cleaning Rod: You can use the one that came with your gun or buy a separate cleaning rod. (Makes life WAY easier). **Short Starter:** (to start the ball/patch down the barrel).

Burlap Bag, Possibles Bag, or Tackle Box: to carry all this junk in. (If it is too heavy to pick up, then you have too much junk). C-Clamp and wooden "fork": to secure your rifle upright to a bench for loading. Not needed if loading from a bag. Small carpet sample to rest the butt of the rifle on the ground if bench loading.

Pistol Loading Stand: If pistol is your thing, one of these will help in loading and/or securing the pistol between relays.

A couple of old towels: to wipe your equipment and your hands between shots. BP shooting is MESSY.

Percussion Nipple Wrench or Flintlock Pick/Brush/Knapping Hammer: for when you need to clear an ignition problem. (And you WILL)

Nice to Have Item:

Dedicated Loading/Cleaning Rod: Yes I know, I listed it twice. Buy one longer than you need so you have some room to get a grip on it. These are also available with "T" handles.

Extra Cleaning/Loading Jags: Yes, they come unscrewed down in your barrel and you will have to shoot it out.

An Extra Powder Horn: One for 2f rifle powder and one for 3f pistol powder. Mark which is which.

A small powder funnel: Nothing is more fun than trying to fill a 1/4" flask or horn opening from a 1" powder can opening. Screwon spouts are also available for powder cans.

A small Dial Read Micrometer: For measuring patch material thickness. Also works with ball diameters if you make a mistake and dump two different ball sizes into the same box by mistake. Harbor Freight carries cheap mechanical ones from China. Do NOT buy the battery powered Micrometer as the batteries will ALWAYS be dead when you need to use it.

A Snail Type Percussion Capper: Or make one out of leather, (see homemade ones at the field). Tie it to a thong around your neck and never misplace it. (Bend the clasp on a snail capper to prevent dumping your precious caps out on the ground.) (Forget to put it away and drive home with it around your neck.)

A decent "dedicated" Tackle Box/Tool Box: To carry all this stuff. Not too big, Not too small. Clean it out periodically to get rid of the "stuff you don't need" items.

Spotting Scope or Binoculars: For the Bullseye (paper target) contests, and for sighting in at range. Being able to see where you hit, shot to shot, is a pretty big advantage. Whatever you use must be able to "See" $\frac{1}{2}$ " holes at 100 yards. Buy something nice if you can afford it. The resale value on glass is high.

Extra Patch Lube and/or Cleaning Solvent: Balls, Caps, and Powder- Rule of Thumb: You will always run out in the middle of the contest.

That's all I can think of for now. If I forgot something, I am sure that somebody will point it out to me after reading the newsletter...... Your preferences may vary.

Trap Projects at the Work Party

At the Work Party on May 14th we got a lot of jobs done. With the number of people available, things moved quickly. Besides cleaning up the broken clays, we cleaned out all three of the Trap bunkers.

After cleaning the bunkers, we decided to power wash and paint the bunkers. Unfortunately, the power washer died but that didn't stop us. We marched on and got it done. It's amazing how much a coat of paint improves the appearance of the bunkers.

We also replaced some rollers on the #3 Trap House to make the lid open and close more easily. There is another plan to make that even better but at the time of this writing, it is still in the research and purchase parts stage.

The other feature that we worked on was the Downrange Safety Lights. The electrical parts were assembled and tested. **Dave Robertson, Gary Fukuda** and **Darrin Eaton** completed the project the following weekend. We now have blinking blue lights on all three houses connected to switches on the light poles (up-range) so that the Range will be Cold BEFORE people walk downrange to service the target machines. **Dave Robertson** engineered the switch system to be simple and effective. Also, while the lights are flashing, the release mechanism is disabled on the three Trap machines. This means that targets won't be launched while the Range is COLD. This does NOT include the 5-Stand machines. This introduces a new safety feature to the Range without making its operation more difficult or inconvenient.
