
We have managed to complete two major projects at the range and are on track for a couple more. Don't forget to send your ideas for improvements.



JUNIOR CORNER

RULES TO LIVE BY

- 1. Treat every firearm as if it were loaded
- **2. Never** point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot
- **3. Keep** your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire
- **4. Know** your target and the surroundings

On February 23rd, 2020, we had our first Junior Pistol Event of the 2020 season. Due to the recent rains it was a bit on the chilly side but still a great day for shooting. Despite the chilly weather we had 23 highly motivated shooters. Being the first event of the new year, we wanted to set the tone for the rest of the year. We started with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by an outstanding safety brief by one of our newest Junior Coaches.

Wanting to start out on the right track, I was looking for bad trigger discipline. Try as I might, I couldn't find anyone putting their finger on the trigger before they were ready to fire. My plan was to find a shooter, or two, with bad trigger discipline, call a "Cease Fire" then go over trigger discipline with everyone. I watched every shooter. If I saw anything that was even close to poor discipline the coach would jump on it before I even had a chance to say anything. This was especially evident with the Junior Coaches. These young adults never cease to amaze me. I attribute the overall success of this event to the safety briefs as well as the outstanding coaching.

After the formal event, we decided to hold a fun shoot for the kids. Here we set up targets at different distances as well as the dueling tree. We also invited the parents to come out and shoot. For many of the parents this is one of the first opportunities they have had to see what their kids do at

these events. It also gives them a greater respect for the skills needed to shoot some of these amazing scores. It was great to see the Junior Coaches step in to help some of the adults. As usual, I was extremely proud of our Junior Coaches as well as our Junior shooters. This is what a future leader looks like.

Additionally, I want to give some recognition to Austin Cote. For those that don't know, he is a Squad Leader for the Junior Coaches. Over the years, I have seen him come a long way.

That has been very evident during the last few months. Many times, when a person is put into their first leadership role, there tends to be a lot of "bossy" behaviors, but not with Austin. He leads by example. He's never disrespectful. He gets the Junior Coaches to work as a team to get things done around the range. He also looks out for the new shooters, many times putting their needs above his own.

I like to say that this is what a future leader looks like, but Austin has been proving that he can be a leader today.

The Junior Marksmanship program would like to wish everyone a Happy St. Patrick's Day. Everyone is Irish for the day. Be safe!

TRAP CORNER

Check the Web Site

Many of us have a long drive to the Range. I drive out from Oceanside and on Wednesday nights after work, the traffic is usually pretty bad. Even without traffic, it is a long drive. Occasionally there are reasons to cancel an event like rain, power outages, equipment problems, etc... When this sort of thing happens, the shoot chairs call me and I change the web site to show it as [CANCELLED]. This process takes me about 2 minutes and I can do it from my smartphone. The point of this is that before you make a long drive to the Range, it would be a good idea to check the web site to make sure that the event that you are going to is not cancelled for some reason. I recommend this over calling the shoot chair because the shoot chair can only handle so many phone calls at once.

Time Change (3/8/2020)

Daylight Saving Time begins on Sunday, March 8th and we set our clocks ahead an hour. This means that we will have more sunlight later in the day. This also means that regular Saturday Trap will begin at 4 PM instead of the winter start time of 2 PM. Because of the warmer weather and more sunlight, Saturday Trap will run until 9 PM as long as we still have people that want to shoot. Because of the later start, we will be starting up the Trap Card Shoot (1st Saturdays) and the Century Shoot (2nd Saturdays) at 1 PM. Check the web site under Events for more information.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Our Casual Shooting Rules are not just guidelines, they are Rules for how to act and shoot at our range and just because a specific use-case is not described in the rules does not mean it is OK to do it. Remember, I have talked about using Common Sense.

It is **NOT OK** to shoot behind the yellow line; especially if people are shooting in front of you on the actual firing line!

It is **NOT OK** to drive your vehicle down range to change your target; especially if you have not notified the other shooters!

It is **NOT OK** to park your vehicle in the Fire Lane or in front of a Shooting range. Unload your vehicle and park it properly.

It is **NOT OK** to sweep other people with your firearm(s) and the excuse, it its unloaded, is **NOT OK**.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- **DO NOT** handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

DO NOT GO DOWN

It is **NOT OK** to leave the Blue range lights on when you leave the range – Please turn OFF the lights!

It is **NOT OK** to ignore our range rules just because no one else is on the range with you.

If you believe you have a "special case" that warrants an exception, please contact me to discuss it, before I find you, and we discuss it...

As I have mentioned before we are all Range Safety Officers regardless of the Red Hat. If you see something that is not right speak up or at least get the details and let me know.

I have had several individuals come up to me to discuss range safety issues with no names or weeks later. I really don't like to hear that several people and RSO's witnessed an issue and did nothing about it. NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (4/25/2020)

Although ammunition is now plentiful, there are California restrictions (such as Prop. 63, passed, now SB1235) that have since been generated to hinder such purchases both instore and eliminated on-line. This obstacle can be overcome through acquired skills and knowledge.

Presented is the opportunity to learn basic reloading techniques that will allow you to produce timely, consistent and accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available on April 25th, 2020. The First Part is strictly academic in structure and is conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session, 8A.M. on Saturday, April 25th, 2020 and will last until approximately 12 noon. The Second Part is a "Hands On" reloading bench activity. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your personal reloads. Scheduling the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session.





The cost is two tiered: EF&GA members = \$110; non-members = \$120. For those individuals beginning and are without any reloading supplies (empty cases, powder, primers, etc.) a \$10 surcharge will be applied. Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades" **Contact Info** – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

Fortunately, Chief Massey's wishes are a reality for the youth at EF&GA.




