Darrin's Dissertation

Back to Basics

Recently, I have had a few members express concerns about getting everyone on board with practicing the same safety habits. Complacency is at the core of most firearm accidents and none of us ever wants to see any accidents at any time with firearms involved. The way to minimize risky situations starts with good habits. If we start with these routines, we can eliminate the risk of bad things happening:

Sign in before unloading your vehicle – If you are at the sign-in kiosk you will be able to see the condition of the range. If the range is COLD (blinking blue lights ON) then you know that you need to wait until the range is HOT before bringing your firearm cases from your vehicle to the range.

Uncase firearms safely – All rifles and pistols must be uncased on the firing line, not on the target frame tables, not on the benches behind the firing line. Nobody wants to have someone behind them messing with a firearm with the muzzle pointed God-Knows-Where.

Practice the 4 rules of safety – If you ask any of our Junior Coaches about the rules of safety, not only can they rattle them off, they can also give you the how and why of each rule:

1. **Treat** every firearm as if it were loaded.
2. **Never** point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot.
3. **Keep** your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire.
4. **Know** your target and the surroundings.

If any of us needs to remind someone else to follow these rules, it should be done politely with a positive attitude. Remember that you will get more bees with honey than with vinegar.

Flagpole Status

We finally got the top half of the flagpole installed and the lights are operational. Just before I wrote this, I learned that the building inspector completed the final inspection, and our permit is now complete. Now we just need to schedule a dedication ceremony and we will call this job complete. Many thanks to all who have contributed time, talent, and treasure to make this happen.

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class

3/4/2023, 5/6/2023 & 7/1/2023 (8 am – 12 noon)

It seems as if the ammo drought is starting to decrease slowly. Even so, it is still on a limited scale. Need or want ammo but can't find any? You're left with the old American skill; self-sufficiency and creativity...MAKE YOUR OWN!

Class Description: This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8 am until noon.

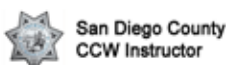

Hunter Education Class

Class Description: The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills, and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

Case and Uncase Firearms on the Firing Line Benches Only

Last month a member reports that he was "Muzzled" twice by other shooters. "Muzzling" is when someone points or sweeps the muzzle of their firearm in the direction of another person while handling their firearm. This most often happens when a shooter goes to Case or Uncase their firearm while standing at the middle bench/table or seating bench behind the firing line. This occurs frequently and is a violation of our safety protocols. An accident would have devastating consequences. Always take your case to the Firing Line Benches to Case or Uncase your firearm.

The first scenario was at the pistol range. The member observed another member putting his handgun away when he rotated 180 degrees with his handgun and took it to the middle bench/table behind the yellow line to put it in its case. The magazine was still in the handgun, too. In the second scenario, multiple members on the 100 yard range were recasing their rifles on the back seating benches, muzzling each other and anyone else that may have been on the range.

ALWAYS Case and Uncase your firearms on the Firing Line Benches Only.

Target Clean Up:

When you are finished shooting, please remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames to the designated area. Please take your used targets home with you. Current hazmat guidance does not allow us to dispose of them here at the range.

Did you leave anything behind?

Before you leave the range, double check that you have everything you brought with you.

Responsible for your Guests:

Members are responsible for their guests. They must be with you at all times and abide by the rules.

The Green Sheets:

Sign the Green Sheets as soon as you arrive at the range, before you unload your equipment. Make sure the "Date" and "Range" information is filled in.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **ON**
- DO NOT Handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep Up Brass Behind the Yellow and In Front of the Red Line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **OFF**
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red Line

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE



Trap Range/100 Yard Range Etiquette

In case you do not remember or were not paying attention during your walk through for membership, during casual shooting the trap range (trap pad 1 and 2) and the 100 yard ranges are both open. On the trap range you can either use the permanent hand thrower, or provide your own hand thrower, or mechanical thrower. On the 100 yard range you can shoot out to the steel targets provided.

So, it has been brought to my attention that there may be some confusion on the etiquette between the Trap range and 100 yard range. Here are the rules of engagement that should be followed.

If you are on the 100 yard range and you would like to go put out or retrieve a target beyond the 25 yard line, you must communicate with the Trap range before proceeding further down range. If you are on the trap range, you must go cold and place all guns unloaded in the rack while the 100 yard shooters are down range.

Like all cold range rules no one should be holding guns while someone is down range changing targets, no exceptions.

Retrieving Birds Down range

We have had another issue with the Trap/100 yard range. If you are using the trap range during casual shooting remember that you have 2 hot ranges on either side of you (pistol and 100). It is not acceptable to go down range to gather unbroken birds to shoot again.

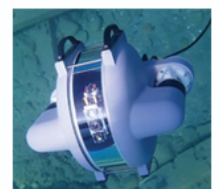

BLACK POWDER NEWS

Upcoming Events in March

Muzzle Loading Bullseye: On March 5th there will be a Long Range Rifle event. Paper targets at 50 and 100 yards. 13 shots at each and your best 10 count. Start time is 08:00 on the 150 range. Contact **Patrick Watson** for details.

Pistol starts at 08:30. Rifle starts at 10:00. As a reminder, we shoot from the 150 range house in the rain at Stupid Short Range, so no excuses not to attend should it rain. When Something Changes.....

Most of you know me as the black powder guy. In my secret life before black powder, I also reloaded metallic center fire cartridges. (And yes “GASP”! Shot shells). In fact I still reload infrequently for a variety of pistol and rifle cartridges.

I learned a long time ago to only make incremental changes when reloading center-fire rounds. Changing a primer type or brand, a different powder lot, or even a different make of brass case can result in a significant difference in accuracy, and even safety when reloading. It should be no surprise that the same is true for Muzzle Loading firearms. The only difference is that in Muzzle Loading we reload the round in our barrel each time we get ready to shoot.

For Muzzle Loading barrels the different considerations when loading include things like ball size, patch thickness, patch lubrication, Black Powder grade, powder fouling in the barrel, and sometimes, the weather (humidity). Over the years most of us have experimented with all of the above and have a “recipe” for each of the rifles that we shoot. This “recipe” does not change significantly over the life of the rifle. As an example, for one of my rifles I use a .495 ball with a .22 cotton patch on top of 70 gns of 3f Goex powder. I lube the patch with Hoppes #9 Black Powder solvent, into each bottle of which I add one cap of Ballistol lubricant. I also swab between each shot. I may increase or decrease the dampness of the cleaning patches depending on how hot or humid the day is at the range, to control the moisture of the fouling in the barrel. It had worked well for me for YEARS, until it didn’t.....

Mid season last year I started getting inexplicable flyers. I generally start my shooting sessions by firing off the bench to verify my zero before moving on to offhand practice. Out of 5 shots at 100 yards I was getting one or two that were significantly outside of my normal groupings. I went through my normal check process of verifying my ball size, patch thickness, and powder type. Nothing seemed to have changed. My groups from the bench started getting bigger. Now I started experimenting with different patch thicknesses, and powder brands. Nothing seemed to help. After a couple of months of frustration chasing this problem, I finally switched to my backup rifle.

At first, as I used up my pre-lubed, (sealed), patches everything was better. As I started cutting and lubing new patches things started to go south again. After sitting down and thinking on the problem, it seemed the only thing in common between the two rifles was the lubricant I was using on the patches and the cleaning swabs. I then had an Epiphany (Greek for a red neck head banging moment). When I had prepped my current bottle of Hoppes #9 Black Powder Solvent, I had taken a nearly empty can of Ballistol and poured it into its own cap, OVER the mouth of the Hoppes bottle. Two problems with this trick. One is that Ballistol separates if not shaken vigorously before use (which I didn’t do), and two, I spilled an excess amount into the mouth of the Hoppes bottle when I overfilled the cap. I was definitely not having a good day. Now understand that I buy a case of Hoppes #9 black powder solvent (12 bottles), every couple of years. I should have just poured it out, but I’m a cheap B\$%#@. I just mixed it with another partially full bottle I had on hand. I then proceeded to lube all the shooting and cleaning patches I had been using on my primary and back up rifles since mid season.

What could go wrong??? Obviously in retrospect, the lube had separated and I had not shaken it, I put too much in the mix, and I failed to dilute it back to an acceptable level. The result drove me crazy for a couple of months and seriously impacted my shooting scores. The moral of the story is that when something changes, you need to sit down and evaluate what’s going on. Details matter in our sport, so pay attention.....

I have since opened new bottles of solvent and lube and have mixed up new batches to lube my shooting and cleaning patches. Things seem to be getting back to normal. (Still can’t hit anything but now it is due to lack of practice).

That’s all for this month. I’ll try to think of something entertaining for next month’s article. The problem is, after my recent illness, I am only half as witty as I use to be.... or so I am told.
