Rain Issues

For the past couple of months, we have had lots of rain. This has caused many inconveniences, but we have had minimal damage so far. All three of the Trap bunkers have flooded and we have had to replace numerous sump pumps to keep up with the elevated water table causing water to pour in through the walls of the bunkers. The Mom's Creek drainage route has eroded the driveways by the Pistol Range and the Trap Ramada. With all this nonstop water flow, none of our above-ground structures have had any issues so far. We did have a few vehicles stuck on the 150 Range (including a riding mower and a tractor), but we got them all out eventually and nobody was injured. Over the next few months, we will continue to improve how rainwater is routed and accommodate a higher water table.

Range Improvements

If you have been to the Pistol Range recently, you probably noticed two major improvements. The switches for the flashing lights are much better and the newly installed LED light fixtures on the eves are much better and way more effective.

The Board just voted to add the same improvements to the 150-Yard Range next. The improved button system makes it so that you can use any switch to turn the lights off instead of requiring you to use the exact switch that turned them on.

At the time of this writing, I just received the new signs that read NO FIREARM HANDLING WHEN LIGHTS ARE FLASHING. The signs are designed with a space in the middle to mount a flashing light fixture. These signs will be placed at each Range facing the parking lots. The intention is to make people pay attention before they get out of their vehicles.

I have had numerous people comment on the new lights and switches and try to give me kudos for the cost-effective and dramatic safety improvement that these lights provide. I can't take much credit for this. It was the brainchild of **Dave Robertson**. He implemented the system along with **Carlos Torrez** who mounted the fixtures and conduit to protect the cabling. If you see either of these guys, be sure to thank them for their contributions to the Association.

Work Party and Barbeaue

As usual, we will have a Work Party on May 20^{th} in preparation for the Annual Barbecue on May 21^{st} . If you need volunteer hours or just want to be part of something great, be sure to attend either or both days.

At the Work Party we will be doing many jobs that need to be done. Some of the tasks are the usual maintenance and cleaning tasks. Some are infrastructure improvements. There are outdoor heavy-lifting jobs as well as indoor light-duty tasks. The food is always fantastic and the no-cost raffle after lunch is always fun.

100 Yard Range Project

It appears that most of the rain from the wettest season on record is finally past us. With that in mind I would like to "Jump Start" the 100 yard range remodel/addition.

To get going I need individuals who are qualified for the work to be "in-charge" of each portion, as follows:

- 1. Concrete demo: minor site work (2 block high Key-Stone type walls around the 2 trees at the East end of the range), footing excavations, installation of forms and reinforcement and the epoxy dowels from the existing slab to the new concrete.
- 2. Concrete placement and finishing: I think we will need to hire this out so that it is done correctly.
- 3. Framing: both demo and installation of new beams and new framing as occurs.
- 4. Roofing: both demo and installation of new roofing for the entire range roof.
- 5. Plumbing and electrical.
- 6. Pressure wash and painting.

Part of being "in-charge" of these assignments will be to determine any equipment necessary to rent to accomplish that portion, assist me in developing a final materials list and the number of volunteers needed to accomplish that portion.

Once we have the 6 people (team) assembled we will have a "kick-off" meeting to help determine a schedule that we all can commit to.

It is my hope that we can start the project no later than June 15 and that we can finish in 6 to 8 weeks depending on weather.





The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Negligent Discharges and Dropped Firearms

Negligent discharges and dropped firearms are serious infractions. These are more likely to occur during sanctioned events where activities (like changing magazines and holstering during the Combat Shoot) are permitted that are not permitted during casual shooting. Any occurrence, however, is dangerous and highlights that you are not in the right frame of mind to be handling firearms at that time. You will be sent home.

We are implementing practices at sanctioned events to eliminate these problems and make the events safer.

- 1. There will be 2 RSOs on each squad.
- 2. Follow your RSO's directives exactly.
- 3. There will be no shooting or changing magazines while moving.
- 4. We will be having RSO Training Days:
 - A. To determine skill sets
 - B. To make sure everyone understands the range commands exactly the same way.
 - C. To make sure we are watching the shooter, not hits and misses.
 - D. To reinforce that "Reholstering" is an administrative task not a tactical task.

Muzzling

Be aware of where your muzzle is pointing at all times. Your muzzle should always be pointed down range. If you hear the command "Muzzle", you or someone near you has pointed their firearm in the direction of another shooter, possibly YOU. You are also authorized, even expected, to shout out the command if you observe it.



On the Range



BLACK POWDER NEWS

by Garth Warner

Last Month Recap: Ode to Spring, the field is wet...... really wet. Our April contest was scheduled to be a Mid Range with targets at 75, 100, and 125 yds. We set up the Pigs (smallest targets) at 75, and found the 100 and 125 lines were literally underwater. So....we set up the Bears (bigger targets) at 50 yards and the Rams (Biggest Targets) at 25. This is bass-ackward from how we normally shoot. Apparently this was interesting enough to draw 5 non-club shooters to try their luck in the slush and goo. Note: Black Powder Cartridge Rifle rounds are pretty hard on the Silhouettes at short range. We had to weld up 6 silhouettes after the contest. I am a novice welder and somehow manage to not burn myself too badly every time I try.

Next Month: Our May contest will fall on the 28th. This will be a Super Short Range contest for new shooters. If you have the gear and have been waffling about coming out to shoot, this contest is for **YOU**.

Rendezvous: Will be coming up on June 17th and 18th. This will be a two day event held on the 150 yard range. For those of you that have not done this before, the contest is a "Walk-Thru" format, with steel targets at an "Unknown" distance. Categories will include Muzzle Loading Single Shot Pistol, Muzzle Loading Rifle, and Muzzle Loading Trade Gun. You can load from a bag (preferred) or from a bench. Traditional clothing is preferred, but not required. Sorry guys, there will be NO revolver or BPCR classes in the Rendezvous. We WILL have a Hamilton/Burr Duel contest format as introduced by Tom Arendell recently. We will also have a Tomahawk Contest. If you don't have a Hawk I will provide club hawks for the Pilgrims. More details next month. If you want to help set up and run this please contact me. Gwarner@cox.net. I am old and feeble. I will need help.

Moisture Control: At every contest I run, there are a certain small percentage of shooters that consistently have hang fires, or flat out failure to fires. More rarely we also have the infamous smoking patch shooters in the summer. Both of these issues can be identified as a lack of Moisture Control.

If you have been practicing good muzzle loading cleaning technique then after each shooting match, you have cleaned the bore and breach of your rifle with hot soapy water. After running some drying patches down the bore, you followed up with an oiled patch down the bore to keep it from rusting. Maybe you even gave the breach plug a little spritz of oil as well. Prior to shooting your first contest round you snapped a cap or two (or flashed a pan) to blow the oil out. This is followed by a dry patch down the bore to sop out the last of the oil. Now you get ready to load your first contest ball for the match. If you swabbed the oil out, and did not go crazy on the patch lube, that first round goes bang with the first trigger pull. Life is sweet!

Subsequent loads don't seem to be as consistent. If your patches are not moist enough (grease or liquid lube) loading a ball down the barrel becomes very difficult. When you do shoot the load, the patch can be seen smoking 15' to 20' beyond the muzzle. Your patches are too dry.

The reverse of this is the guy that saves all his spare saliva in a mason jar for a month, just to make sure that his patches and cleaning swabs are going to be moist enough to get the job done. Generally this guy is a fan of 1800's sea faring battles where the ship's gun crew swabs out a barrel with a sponge from a bucket of water. While a little bit of moisture is a good thing, excess moisture tends to become wet gruel in a bore. Trying to clean (or load) the bore this way, pushes the gruel into the flash channel in the breach. This blocks the spark from the next shot from reaching the chamber. Excess moisture can also soak into the black powder loaded for the next shot, making velocities inconsistent.

So how do we prevent this? First of all, take the mason jar of spit out of the equation. Shooting patches should NOT be so wet that you can squeeze a drop of fluid from them. DAMP OK, WET NOT OK.

Treat your shooting patches with lube 3 or 4 days before an event and keep them in an airtight container. This allows the moisture to be distributed equally through ALL of the patches. Remember damp, not wet.

I have less experience with grease patches. Again, an even application of grease is the key to consistent performance. You should not have enough grease on each patch to grease your car, your lawn mower and your hair in one day. You should be able to rub your fingers over the patch and tell that it is greased. If you're leaving fingerprints on the patch, you're using too much.

BUT I HAVE TO CLEAN THE BORE! Yes you do. Sort of. Sometimes....... The products of combustion from Black Powder include a variety of chemicals. The biggest component is Carbon (charcoal). If left untreated in your barrel, it tends to build up into a hard dry coating that makes loading difficult to impossible after a certain number of shots. This is true regardless of the type of patch lube you use. I am a big believer in swabbing between shots. I use a DAMP, but not WET patch. I leave my Mason jar of saliva at home for other projects. (Wet sanding wood with figure in it).

The idea here is to remove some of the built up carbon (charcoal) and DAMPEN what remains so that your rifle will load and shoot consistently from shot to shot. How wet is damp? You will have to experiment with YOUR rifle and patch combination to find out. If you are consistently getting hang fires and/or failure to fires, try drier. If your patches are smoking on the ground after you shoot, try wetter. Now, just to mess you up some, on very hot and dry days you may need to use a wetter cleaning and/or shooting patch. On damp, humid or rainy days you may need to use a drier cleaning and/or shooting patch. The reason for this is that black powder will absorb moisture out of the air. On wet days, I have been known to use a damp patch immediately followed by a bone dry patch in the bore. Your mileage may vary. Be cautions of running a dead dry patch down a fouled dirty barrel during most hot conditions. It will grab the carbon in the barrel and be a real chore to get out.

Thus is the joy of black powder muzzle loading. Learn, Adapt, Improvise and Overcome. The Marines figured it out. You can too.

Muzzle Loading Silhouette Contest Results for March 26th 2023

This was scheduled as a Mid Range contest with targets from 75 to 125 yards. Due to extensive flooding on the left side of the field, and anywhere beyond the 75 yard line, we elected to make this a Super Short Range contest with targets at 25, 50, and 75 yards. Due to flooding on the left side of the field the targets were set up in reverse order. Pigs on the right were set up at 75 yards. Bears were set up at 50 yards in the center, and Rams were set up at 25 yards on the left side of the field. Even with this modification, fallen targets had to be "excavated" and wiped free of mud when reset. Conditions were otherwise clear and cool. (34 to 63 degrees).

Note: We had 5 non members compete for the first time, or almost the first time. They made the usual beginner mistakes and we kept them shooting. Almost everybody hit something in the rifle event.
