


I would not be arrogant enough to tell you how to vote but I do want to passionately request you all to participate in our democracy and make your voice heard at the ballot box.






Mewsletter Changes

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

he primary job of the Range Safety Officer (RSO) is to make sure that the range is safe and that members and guests are following our safety rules. It is really frustrating to continue to see these types of issues – Folks I need you to start paying attention!

I arrived at the range and parked at the 100 yard and immediately noticed that the COLD Blue lights were On and blinking. We ALL know that means you do not handle any firearms or equipment! Much to my surprise there was someone shooting on the range while the COLD lights were On. We had a discussion...

Walked over to the Pistol range and there were three shooters on the 10 yard line. Target One – Good, Target Two – Good, Target Three – Bad (Ed they had more than one target on the frame). Shooter Three; Yeah I noticed the sign that says only one target after I put it up. So why didn't you fix it? Well the shooter before me had more than One target! We had a discussion...

Walked over to the 150 yard range and noticed several rifles in the rack. Shooter is that a fixed magazine in your AR? No, so please remove it. We had a discussion...

Headed back towards the club house and noticed the Blue lights were blinking at the 100 yard range as I got closer there was no one there!

The default state at the range is HOT (lights Off). Turn OFF the lights before you leave.

As some of you may know I am also the Match Director for Cowboy action and I arrived very early for setup for our match. As I was driving towards the 150 range through the mist and semi-darkness what do I see but the Blue COLD lights blinking that someone left On ALL night.

The default state at the range is HOT (lights Off). Turn OFF the lights before you leave.

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Blue Blinking Lights ON DO NOT handle Firearms & Equipment Handle Targets Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line Blue Blinking Lights OFF Handle Firearms & Equipment OK to Load/Unload Vehicle Sweep up brass behind Red line

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

Next day I park by the storage doors and hear shooting on the 100 yard range. As I turn the corner what greats my eyes, if you guessed the Blue COLD lights were On, you would be correct. We had a discussion...

Later that day at the Pistol range Blue COLD lights On and a group were packing up handling firearms and equipment. We had a discussion... BOD member had a discussion... Stay tuned....

I am going to need therapy...

It is time to schedule a First Aid/CPR class which is taught by Marshall Goddard our "Fire Guy". It is a great class and you need to pre-register so we can order materials. Please send me an email if you are interested.

We are still looking for more Rangemasters to help with managing the range. If you are interested please contact me by email.

BLACK POWDER NEWS

November is upon us and Turkeys are infesting our range. You can find out how big a turkey you are this month by entering the November Muzzle Loading Contest. This month we will shoot the dreaded "Across The Course" shoot. Each range line from 25 to 150 yards will be set with three silhouettes on a single frame. You have three balls to knock down three targets. Whatever is ON THE GROUND at the end of the relay will be your score. One Point per target. There will be six relays. You will need 18 round balls. I will outline a more detailed description at the range. This will be a TIMED EVENT. You will have a maximum of 10 minutes to shoot 3 balls. If we have more shooters than frames we will hold a blind drawing from all classifications for shoot order.

Pistol will be held at the normal ranges and will start promptly at 08:30. Rifle will start as soon as pistol is concluded. November is the 5th contest of a six contest series in our Black Diamond Silver Challenge cap and ball revolver contest. Ray Bucholz is providing a silver presentation Pietta cap and ball revolver to the person that has the top cumulative score over a six contest series. We will find out in December who wins. Ray is also willing to provide awards for a new pistol class called Cap and Ball Dragoon Pistol. (Walker Colt or replica saddle pistols). The hitch in the git-along here is that there has to be a minimum of three contestants for the awards to be presented. As always, the pistol contests are held at ranges of 25, 50, and 75 yards.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
