Linda's Lines


November is here with cooler temperatures and shorter days. We have a number of things going on here at the range.

creates a safe environment. There are other concerns such as proper eye and ear protection. Another area of safety that many people seem to forget is clothing and footwear. Wearing proper clothing and footwear can be a vital part of keeping yourself and others safe while on the range. For safety reasons it's a good idea to avoid low cut t-shirts and blouses with large opening that can catch hot brass. The same thing goes for shorts and dresses. Anything that exposes the skin to potential burns from hot brass should be avoided. A hat with a brim extending over your eye protection can prevent brass from falling between your glasses and forehead (don't ask how I know.) Footwear is another area of concern, sandals and flip-flops do not protect the feet from hot brass or the many biting critters, insects, and arachnids that we have around the range.

Here's to 244 years of protecting and serving this great nation.







InterClub (10/19/2019)

The InterClub events are always great fun and more of a social event than a blood-and-guts angry competition. At the last event we went to Lakeside Sportsman's Club in the middle-of-nowhere outside of Boulevard. This remote location is right up against the US/Mexico border fence. The terrain and unusual wind changes make the targets do a little dance that will frustrate the most seasoned Trap shooter. With a background of scrub brush and boulders, you never know if you are shooting too high or low, or what. The high score for the day went to John Kinum from Maywood with an 89. I came in 3rd with an 85. It was a tough course of fire but a fun event for all of us.

Turkey Shoot (11/23/2019)

No, we do not encourage people to shoot at live turkeys on our range, the turkeys are frozen. It's not easy getting them to fit in the target launching machines, but it's worth it. Actually, we shoot regular Trap with a twist. There are 10 people on the line and the top score (out of 10 clay targets) wins a frozen turkey. If there is a tie, then there is a shoot-off for the bird. Second place wins a box of stuffing or some cranberry sauce.

This annual event is always a lot of great family-friendly fun. The shoot will take place starting at 8:00 AM and will continue until the turkeys are all gone. Compete to win a frozen turkey or stuffing from 3 different disciplines – 16-yard trap, 20-yard wobble, and 25-yard handicap. Tickets are \$5 per round or 5 tickets for \$20.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price - A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

A reminder to our membership that practicing good gun range etiquette isn't just good manners—it's good sense! Gun range etiquette is a blend of common sense, courtesy and safety. A day at the range is supposed to be fun, and good gun range etiquette makes it even better and keeps my blood pressure down!

These three rules are ALWAYS appropriate:

- 1. **ALWAYS** keep the gun pointed in a safe direction.
- 2. **ALWAYS** keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
- 3. **ALWAYS** keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- DO NOT handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

Cease Fires

Don't touch any firearms or equipment during a cease fire!

If the range isn't hot, don't touch your firearms or equipment. Leave them be until it's time to shoot again. During a cease fire, you may have others doing tasks such as changing targets. The last thing anyone wants to see while they're down range is someone playing with a firearm at the line. Don't do it.

Loading and Unloading Pistols

When you are on a shooting line, there are going to be other shooters next to you. For this reason, it is of the utmost importance that the **muzzle never points to the right or left of you.**

Take extra care when loading and unloading your firearm, making certain to keep the muzzle pointed downrange. If you need more leverage to manipulate the slide, turn your **BODY** sideways (versus the gun). This enables you to keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction, as opposed to pointing it at the person next to you.

Don't give unsolicited advice to others on the range.

If they wanted your help, opinion, or oracle-like knowledge of everything relating to firearms, they'd have hired you before they arrived. This bad habit, especially prevalent among men shooters, is one reason more women don't come to the gun range alone; they know as soon as they show up to shoot a few practice rounds and work on their technique, some "Bubba" type with a hand cannon (try this one) and a desire for a dinner date will begin telling her what she's doing wrong. In reality, she doesn't want to hear anything except the report of her gun. So keep your nose to your own lane.

It's good etiquette to leave the range better than you found it. Picking up trash, cleaning your firing station, and obeying all of the range rules are not only good gun range etiquette—they're good manners! Would your mom let you leave that mess...

Have FUN! You're at the range to ultimately have a good time doing what you love to do. Embrace it and enjoy it...safely.


NRA Basic Personal Protection in the Home Class (12/29/2019)
