Darrin's Dissertation

It has been a busy month and a lot has happened around the Range. We have lots of projects and issues that are all getting addressed with great care and attention to detail.

Bylaws - At the General Membership Meeting, we voted on the Bylaw modifications, and it went very smoothly. The few items that had multiple opinions were discussed in a very respectful and civil manner. There was no malice in the room, just a great group of Association Members discussing and cleaning up minor issues with the wording of the document. The revised bylaws are posted on the web site under Range Info-> About Us.

Flagpole Monument – More progress has been made on the new Flagpole Monument. At the time of this writing, the concrete structure has been poured, the lower half of the flagpole has been set in place and the first round of skim-coat has been done. A crane operator has been scheduled and if all goes as planned, the top half of the flagpole will be in place by the time that you read this. We still need to apply a few coats of sealant and finish before the plaques are mounted on the faces of the concrete structure. Finally, low-voltage LED lighting will be installed to illuminate the flag at night.

100-Yard Remodel – The project has been pushed back a couple of weeks so that we can complete the Flagpole Monument project before starting another major project. With that in mind, we are still proceeding with the applications for the proper permits from the County so that we can do it all by-the-book. If you want to volunteer to help with this project, please send an email to 100Remodel@escondidofishandgame.com and we will include you in status updates as well as notifications of work schedules.

AB2571 – Well, the law is still in place despite a motion to issue an injunction to suspend enforcement of it. However, while the courts are battling this out, AB-160 was passed and (finally) signed into law. This places an explicit exemption of programs like ours. This amendment adds the following language to Section 22949.80 of the Business and Professions Code:

22949.80.(a)(3) This subdivision does not apply to a communication offering or promoting any firearm safety program, hunting safety or promotional program, firearm instructional course, sport shooting event or competition, or any similar program, course, or event, nor does it apply to a communication offering or promoting membership in any organization, or promotion of lawful hunting activity, including, but not limited to, any fundraising event, youth hunting program, or outdoor camp.

This means that we can resume our Junior Marksmanship Program. The limitations that remain have to do with corporate sponsorship that includes advertising. Our Shoot Chairs for the Junior events are aware of those limitations and will have no trouble running the events with those restrictions.

100 Yard Range Project VOLUNTEER HELP NEEDED

The start of the 100 Yard Range Project was postponed. We still need volunteers with construction skills and experience to begin the project. If you have construction, painter, roofer, framer, electrician or concrete finishing skills, volunteer

to be part of the team. E-mail your interest, skills and contact information to 100Remodel@escondidofishandgame.com. For those of you that have already volunteered, Thank you for your interest and commitment.

The team was trying to find an EF&GA member to be in charge of the project. With no one being willing to take on that role, **Jack Starlin** arranged his work schedule so that he could lead the team. Jack contacted the volunteers that had responded to come up with a schedule that everyone could commit to. Jack would very much like to get started by the first week of November so that we might be completed by the end of the year.

The following is a preliminary schedule of necessary activities:

- 1. Move the current shooting benches to the 25-yard line, install or provide "pop-ups" to shoot under.
- 2. Demo the existing concrete aprons (leave the shooting slab)
- 3. Demo the existing roofing and cut back the front of the existing overhang on the downrange side.
- 4. Fabricate the new "saddles" for the new support beams.
- 5. Excavate and install the 2 new "pole footings"
- 6. Form and install the epoxy dowels for the new slabs.
- 7. Place and finish the new slab.
- 8. Review all of the existing framing to determine a final lumber list.
- 9. Remove the existing support beams and replace with the new
- 10. Install the new framing over the new shooting area and replace any other existing framing that needs to be replaced.
- 11. Install the new roofing.
- 12. Install new concrete "collars" around existing wood poles and new pipe columns.
- 13. Pressure wash and paint entire structure and slab.
- 14. Move all the shooting benches back to the correct positions.

Many of the above activities may be performed concurrently but that will mean determining a schedule that we all can commit to.

National Bison Month

In 2015 the 114th Congress passed S.2032, the National Bison Legacy Act, which established and adopted the North American Bison as the national mammal of the United States. November is National Bison Month and the first Saturday in November was declared National Bison Day by Presidential Proclamation.

In 1973 the San Diego Zoo gifted 14 North American Bison to the Camp Pendleton Marine Base. The herd has grown with estimates ranging from 119-150 members. These animals can weigh up to 2000 pounds and run as fast as 35 miles per hour.

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills, and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello everyone,

This month we are talking about Rangemaster/RSO authority. Any member can challenge an on duty Rangemaster/RSO. The on duty Rangemaster/RSO for Casual Shooting has the final word. If the member is not satisfied with the Rangemaster/ RSO's final word they can contact the Chief Range Safety Officer for more clarification. If that is not satisfactory, they can bring the issue to the Board of Directors. For any Sanctioned Events the rules for Casual Shooting and Sanctioned Events may be different. Shoot Chairs for the Sanctioned Events have authority to use different procedures than for Casual Shooting. Training Instructors also have the authority to use different procedures than for Casual Shooting. The on duty Rangemaster/RSO does not have authority to override the Shoot Chair or Training Instructor of a Sanctioned Event. Any disagreements with any Rangemaster/RSO, Shoot Chair or Instructor must be discussed offline, away from the event. We do not want to have any animated discussions while holding firearms in our hands.

Members bringing guests need to have the guest(s) with them at all times except for when using the restrooms.

The Green Sheets - If you sign any of the Green Sheets and there is not a Date and Range filled in, can you fill in the Date and Range? There are Green Sheets being turned in with no Date and Range information filled in.

All shooters remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area.

Make sure that what you bring with you to the range, you also take back home with you.






