# NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 11/4/2023 (8 am – 12 noon)

Need or want ammo but can't find any? MAKE YOUR OWN!

# **Class Description:**

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

# The class is structured in two separate sessions:

**1<sup>st</sup> session** – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

**2<sup>nd</sup>** session – This is "Hands-On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

# Hunter Education Class 11/11/2023 (8 am – 4 pm)

# **Class Description:**

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

# Bow Hunter Education Class 12/9/2023 (7:00 am – 4 pm)

# **Class Description:**

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and guiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

# RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello Everyone,

We have several safety and house keeping reminders for you this month. You may have seen a few of them before, but they seem to be recurring issues. Remember — Everyone is an RSO and we are all responsible for keeping a safe range for each other.

# **Hole in the Fascia – 150 Yard Range:**

Last month someone shot a round through the inside of the 150 yard hanging fascia between shooting positions 4 and 5 just a couple of inches above the conduit for the Blinking Blue Lights. It exited out the front sheet metal leaving a large hole. Does anyone have any information about this?

# **Members Are Allowed Two Guests:**

I have received information about members bringing more than the allowed two guests. A member's comment was that it has not been a problem before. The rule is, if you want to bring more than two guests you must get approval from the Association Secretary. Your request must be confirmed by the Secretary via an email. Print out the confirmation and bring it with you when you and your guests come to the range. Members- pay attention to your guests. You are responsible for their conduct on the range.

# **Casing and Uncasing Your Firearms:**

Do not use the rear seating benches or middle tables to uncase (and recase) your firearms. You must use the firing line shooting benches only. This applies to the Pistol, 100 yard and 150 yard ranges. We want to avoid handling firearms behind the yellow line.

# **Cold Range:**

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- DO NOT Handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep Up Brass Behind the Yellow and In Front of the Red Line

**OK TO GO DOWN RANGE** 

# **Hot Range:**

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red Line Only

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

# **Blinking Blue Lights:**

The Blinking Blue Lights "On" and "Off" protocol applies to all ranges. If the Blinking Blue Lights are "On", do not unload firearms or gear. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot (lights "Off"). Then you can unload your firearms and gear. When the Blinking Blue Lights are "On", no one should be between the yellow and red safety lines.

## The Green Sheets:

We still have Green Sheets being turned in with no Date and Range information filled in. If you sign any of the Green Sheets and the Date and Range information is not filled in, please fill it in.

# **Take Your Targets Home:**

Targets can not go in the trash at the range. This is a HAZMAT requirement. All shooters remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames to the designated area.

# Watch for Wildlife on the Range:

Watch for Turkeys and Deer on the range. Call a "Cease Fire" immediately if they wander onto the range or slope. The "Cease Fire" can only be lifted once the visitors have cleared the range.

# **Did You Pack Everything Up?**

Make sure that what you bring with you to the range, you also take home with you.

# **Next Muzzle Loading Silhouette Contest:**

Will be on November 26th. This will be our annual **Neil Pisk** Memorial contest. The contest will be open to Single Shot Pistol, Cap and Ball Revolver, Trade Gun, and Rifle, with targets at a variety of distances. Providing that we have enough personnel present to change the course of fire, pistol targets will be set at 15, 25, and 35 yards. The course will then be reset for rifle distances once the pistol competition has concluded. Pistol Safety Briefing will be held at 08:15. Pistol will start at 08:30. The Rifle Safety Briefing will be held at 09:45, with the rifle contest starting at 10:00. You MUST be present at the safety briefings to compete in that event. If you show up late, you're a spectator.

# Two Types of Accuracy:

AKA....how to drive yourself insane and waste powder and shot. Let me "mansplaine" this.... First let's start with the physical rifle. Round Ball rifles have a slow barrel twist compared to Conical Bullet rifles. Conical bullets require a faster twist rate to stabilize in flight and provide consistent accuracy. Round Balls need some twist (but not too much) to be consistent. Unfortunately, round balls generally have sprues (casting pour cut off points) that can leave them unbalanced. This, and differences in bore and groove diameters between rifles (even of the same make and model) can make finding the perfect "accuracy" load for your rifle somewhat challenging. If you're an Olympic quality shooter, and your rifle is not set up to be accurate, you're unlikely to do well. Conversely, if your rifle shoots like a laser off the bench, but you can't hold within 50 MOA at 50 yards, then you're also not going to do well.

# A Way to Move Forward:

Training yourself to hold accurately is a positive goal that you can practice for the rest of your life. Start now and be patient. Results for this are incremental. You get out of it what you put into it. (Topic for another discussion). I would suggest starting with your rifle. You can make it as accurate as is physically possible for that particular piece of hardware. Note that there are limitations with your hardware. A 1 in 18 twist barrel is NOT going to be as accurate as a 1 in 66 twist barrel, when shooting Round Ball. Most replica Black Powder rifles will have a compromise twist rate of 1 in 48. Not sure what your twist rate is? It SHOULD be stamped somewhere on the barrel. If it is NOT, then start looking on the internet for more information on your make and model. You can also join the The Muzzleloading Forum and ask the question. Note that free advice is worth what you pay for it... (including this printed drivel that I write).

# https://www.muzzleloadingforum.com

Once you have a rifle that will group well off the bench, with repeatable accuracy, then you can see the results of your holding improvements over time.

Next month we can discuss how to determine your rifles ultimate accuracy... It involves some testing from the bench.


