#### **Final Notes**






If you want to get started in traditional archery, or improve your skills for that elusive Robin Hood shot, come join and get in on the fun.

# RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Ver the last few months some of the RSOs and I have participated in the New Members Orientation to a large and eager group of range "newbies". I don't necessarily mean new shooters, but new members at this range who need to learn our rules and regulations. Some have gone blind trying to read all of our signs...

So what I am asking all of you (remember you are all RSOs) is to assist our new members and your guests with learning our procedures. If you see them doing something incorrect, please introduce yourself and help them understand how not to get hollered at and tasered (one target on the short pistol range)!

I actually had someone read my article last month and he had a question regarding the Hot/Cold procedures and why I wanted the Lights Off (am I just cheap and don't want to pay the electric bill).

The default state at the range is HOT (lights Off) – just like any firearms is always loaded until you verify otherwise.

It is an exception when the range is COLD (lights On) and everyone at that range should be cognizant that there is a cease-fire and no handling of firearms and equipment.

Cold Range:	Hot Range:
<ul> <li>Blue Blinking Lights ON</li> <li>DO NOT handle Firearms &amp; Equipment</li> <li>Handle Targets</li> <li>Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line</li> <li>OK TO GO DOWN RANGE</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Blue Blinking Lights OFF</li> <li>Handle Firearms &amp; Equipment</li> <li>OK to Load/Unload Vehicle</li> <li>Sweep up brass behind Red line</li> <li>DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE</li> </ul>

# **BLACK POWDER NEWS**

October will usher in our next standard Short Range silhouette contest. Targets will be at 50, 75, and 100 yards. This is an excellent opportunity for another "Possible", (perfect), score for those that have refined their skills over the summer. It is NOT impossible, but can be very, very, challenging with a muzzle loading rifle. We have a special medallion to award if you can do it. We have only handed out a few of these over the years.

October also marks the 4th contest of a six contest series in our Black Diamond Silver Challenge cap and ball revolver contest. Ray Bucholz is providing a silver presentation Pietta cap and ball revolver to the person that has the top cumulative score over a six contest series. We will find out in December who wins. Ray is also willing to provide awards for a new pistol class called Cap and Ball Dragoon Pistol.

(Walker Colt or replica saddle pistols). The hitch in the git-along here is that there has to be a minimum of three contestants for the awards to be presented. As always, the pistol contests are held at ranges of 25, 50, and 75 yards.

For the remainder of the year the rifle contests will follow this course of fire. November will be an "Across the Course" contest. #### **Volunteers Needed**



# How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to <u>newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com</u> and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

**Category** – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

**Description** – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

**Price** – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

**Contact Info –** This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

The Junior Marksmanship program, at the Escondido Fish and Game Association is comprised of many different parts.
