Junior Trap is Back

Chris Cote has stepped up to work with Curt Summers and get Junior Trap going again. The format of the event has changed so that it is more tuned for the game of Trap and more in line with Junior Rifle and Junior Pistol.

During the first relay the Beginners are in the Meeting Hall for a classroom session to learn the basics of shotguns as well as the game of Trap.

On the Trap Pad, Intermediate (Relay 1) and Beginner (Relay 2) shooters migrate to each of the five positions and shoot at the targets with a coach following them to each position for safety and instruction.

When a shooter has demonstrated proficiency and proper safety habits, he/she can qualify to move on to the Advanced group to shoot with Curt Summers and his crew. On the Advanced Trap Pad they shoot at targets that are launched from multiple machines in different directions. This is a truly challenging course of fire and the kids have a great time doing it.

In order to keep this event going, we need to main resources – Coaches and ammunition. If you want to help coach, please contact Chris Cote and he will work with you on scheduling. If you don't know how to coach, we will happily teach you. There is also a great Coaches Course on October 20th (see Page 3). If you want to help in the ammunition department, the new ammunition laws are making this difficult. To make it easier, gift cards from Walmart, Big 5, Turners, or cash donations can give us the resources to purchase more ammunition to keep this great program going.

Junior Rifle (9/15/2019)

On September 15th, we had another great Junior Rifle event. The weather was warm, but not hot with a gentle breeze starting about noon. We had approximately 70 kids. TRAP CORNER

Let There Be Light

If you have been to the Range to shoot Trap on a Wednesday or Saturday night in the past few weeks, you probably noticed that we have new lights on the Trap Ranges. The new fixtures are LED and consume about half the electricity compared to the old ones. They also appear much brighter because the light is focused downrange instead of having much of the light cast into the sky (light pollution.)

I worked with a local vendor and found the replacement fixtures for a reasonable price. Then we contracted with Kats Electric (a licensed and bonded electrical contractor and a member of EF&GA) to install the new fixtures properly and professionally. Now there is a lot less flex conduit exposed and the new fixtures no longer require 15 minutes to warm up when they are turned on.

The main difference that I noticed is that while shooting 5-Stand, the high birds no longer disappear into the darkness before reappearing when it's almost too late to shoot them. This gives me one less excuse for having a lousy score at 5-Stand.

The bottom line is that we have better light that uses less electricity. SDG&E is doubling the price of electricity from 4-9PM so we have minimized the impact of the rate increase with the bonus of better lighting.

InterClub Results (8/24/2019)

We had a great InterClub event last month as it was our turn to host the event at our Range. The winning Club Score was EF&GA with a Club Score of 95.20%. The fact that we had 20 shooters participating improved our score as well. The high individual shooter was Rich Davis. Neil Pisk is our range CRSO responsible for the First Aid Kits and has a message to the membership regarding the kits.

“As you already know, there is a first aid kit at each of the ranges: Pistol, 100 Rifle, 150 Rifle and Trap (on the outside wall of the Trap Ramada). There are also first aid items in the drawer in the kitchen (It has the RED + on it).

Each first aid kit has a laminated card inside with a photo of the way the kit items should be laid out, plus a listing, on the backside, of each item and where it belongs in the kit.

These first aid kits are there for the protection and safety of our members and their guests. If you are injured or ill, please feel free to use any of the items for your relief and comfort. However, these items were not purchased for you to take to fill your personal first aid kits at home or in your vehicle. Each time an item is removed from a kit for personal reasons, it takes away from a member or guest who really might need it at the range.

I (Neil) am the designated Emergency Disaster Preparedness CRSO. Part of my job is to re-supply the first aid kits as needed. Please feel free to notify me if you discover any items missing from the first aid kits.

Thank you for your cooperation in this matter”

I would like to let you know that there has been a rash of thefts of items in the First Aid Kits, especially the blood clot powder which may be need by YOU. If/when we catch you I can guarantee your membership will be suspended or revoked!

When you come to the Range you usually have a check list of what to bring: firearm(s), ammo, eyes, ears, etc. and sometimes you forget some of those items. While not life altering, it can be a real annoyance and may curtail your range activities depending on the item forgotten.

When leaving the Range, you need to use the same check list. Most importantly, the number ONE item to check is; “do I have my firearm(s)”. This will be a life altering event for you if someone else takes possession of that firearm and uses it!

It is YOUR responsibility to not leave your firearm unattended and in your possession at all times. Before leaving, confirm that you have the same number of firearm(s) that you left home with. If you are going to leave your firearm on the range, at least make it a Cowboy gun so I can have some fun with it...

At our annual RMAD (Range Master Appreciation Day) I had the honor of presenting the RangeMaster of the Year award and this year’s winner is “Dave Olmstead”. Please thank him for his service when you see him on the range.

If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidoofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:**

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.


