
Don't forget that we are collecting toys and diapers for Camp Pendelton again this year. We always help the families of our service men and women through our donations.

More COVID Crud from the County

For the past few months I have described how we have been staging, testing, and operating events in the *Crawl*, *Walk*, *Run* method. Our shoot chairs have done an outstanding job of stepping up to the plate and working with the new

requirements so that their participants can get back to something closer to *normal*. Each shoot chair now needs to do additional paperwork, coordinate a Health Monitor to scan temperatures of participants and enforce masks and social distancing. This is so that the shoot chair can be prepared to be inspected by a County official at any time. All of this extra effort is done to comply with the County requirements as they are handed down from the State of California with the intention of stopping the spread of COVID-19.

Earlier in the spring, the State created a *phased* reopening plan for the State where each County is classified as being at a specific phase based on the number of positive test results, hospitalizations, and COVID related deaths. When the County of San Diego transitioned from phase 2 to phase 3 we thought that there was light at the end of the tunnel. We could eat indoors at a restaurant (at reduced capacity) and even go to the gym (at reduced capacity). I didn't go to the gym but I do enjoy eating indoors again.

Perhaps the State was concerned that too many people could understand the Phase system so they decided to redesign the system and make it all more complicated. Now there is a color-coded map on the California State web site. Each color represents a different level of infection, percentage of positive cases, etc. Purple (Widespread), Red (Substantial), Orange (Moderate), and Yellow (Minimal) are the stages identified by the State of California. As of this writing, San Diego is in the Red (Substantial) level. There was recently a concern that a spike in infections from the SDSU campus could push the County into the Purple (Widespread) level but so far that has not happened. I expect the State to change the rating system again soon and go to Disney characters instead of colors just to keep us on our toes. Hopefully, we will stay in the Little Mermaid stage and avoid falling into the Cruella DeVille stage. I would expect Sacramento to be in the Pinocchio stage for a while.


What does all of this mean to EF&GA and your favorite events? Hopefully, not much. As we have been slowly working each event through the Crawl (Members Only) and Walk (Members & Invited Guests) modes of running the events, we have learned a lot from all of the shoot chairs. We have standardized the Wellness form and devised a scheme to make sure that each event has a standardized supply of disinfectant, hand sanitizer,

RANGEMASTER SOUND OF

Are you a new gun owner? If so, please take time to educate yourself on firearms safety. The rules that you learn may well save a life, perhaps your own! The below information comprises what I believe are the absolute minimum

safety rules and practices for the new gun owner. What is presented below is in no way comprehensive; being a gun owner is a life-long learning process with regards to both firearms safety and proficient handling. All gun owners should endeavor to take ongoing firearms training courses on a regular basis and train independently with their firearms.

BASIC RULES OF FIREARMS SAFETY

There are two widely respected sets of firearms safety rules. The NRA Gun Safety Rules:

- ALWAYS keep the gun pointed in a safe direction
- **ALWAYS** keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot
- ALWAYS keep the gun unloaded until ready to use

The other set of firearms safety rules are generally referred to as the Jeff Cooper Rules of Gun Safety:

- All guns are always loaded
- Never let the muzzle cover anything you are not willing to destroy
- Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target
- Be sure of your target and what is beyond it

READ THE MANUAL THAT CAME WITH YOUR FIREARM

The most important step for a new firearm owner is to read the manual (or a YouTube Video) that came with their firearm. If you purchased a used, surplus or other firearm that did not come with a manual, you should attempt to find an electronic copy of the manual by searching the internet.

The manual will explain the specific *manual of arms* (i.e., how the action of your gun functions) for your firearm. It should also give a detailed set of instructions on how to perform a *field strip* (i.e., disassembly of

your gun for cleaning and other purposes). Read through the entire manual and make sure you understand all aspects of the operation of your firearm. Most firearms *accidents* occur during administrative handling

One of the more important aspects to firearms safety is to always be aware of whether your firearm has a cartridge chambered (i.e, the gun is *loaded*). This is especially important when performing *administrative tasks* such as cleaning your firearm or handing your firearm to another person.

BECOME PROFICIENT WITH YOUR NEW FIREARMS

The last thought I will leave you with is to come out to the range and **PRACTICE** with your new firearm(s). To be comfortable with your firearm you need to practice and learn muscle memory! A great way to do that is attend some of the competitions that are offered at the range which are open to all levels.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **ON**
- **DO NOT** handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **OFF**
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

Last Contest - Was held on Aug 23rd. More people showed up for this one with 6 pistol entries and 10 rifle entries. We were socially, morally, and ethically distant. By the end of this contest, we were mostly sweaty, and limp. The temperature at the field was 109 F. Due to the temps, a number of people were shooting a bit high and rifle barrels were almost too hot to hold. See below for the top three scores in each category. A sincere **THANK YOU** to everyone who stayed to help me break-down the gear. It was a real lifesaver.

Covid-19 Update - We are still operating under Covid restrictions as published in the July Newsletter. Tables are separated in the shoot house, and the firing line is moved 5 yards forward outside of the shoot house, etc. These rules have been amended to allow Invited Guests to shoot the contest with you. Up to 2 guests per member are allowed. They will be your responsibility to admit to the range, and your responsibility to monitor during the contest. The only other change will be that personal shooting, (reloading), tables will be allowed for pistol reloading, when we are set up for the mid and long ranges courses.

Next ML Silhouette Contest - Is scheduled for Oct 25th, This will be a Long Range Shoot with targets at 100, 125, and 150 yards. (**Special Note:** Those of you paying attention to the field layout. Under the Covid setup, the Firing Line has moved 5 yards forward of the concrete apron on the shoot house. The concrete apron extends 3 yards from the **RED** firing line marked between the poles in the Shoot house. At the 150 yard line, I can **NOT** move the targets back any further because the bank is in the way. So... its going to be less than 150 yards. Considering that Round Balls have the ballistics of a Wiffle Ball, you should **DO THE MATH** for the real distance)

Next ML Bullseye Contest is the ML Congress - The date is Oct 4th. This is a pistol, rifle and trade gun shoot with individual and overall awards. Contact Patrick Watson for details.

November is National Bison Month - Ray is pawing the ground, and assembling prizes for this special event. Ray tells me that the grand prize is going to be worth approximately \$500. I am reasonably sure it is not a Buffalo Calf... reasonably sure... maybe... pretty sure... He wouldn't say... If Ray shows up driving a stock trailer then you're on your own. RULES TO LIVE BY

- 1. Treat every firearm as if it were loaded
- **2. Never** point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot
- **3. Keep** your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire
- 4. Know your target and the surroundings

The Junior program prides itself on being extremely safety conscious. Ask any of our Junior shooters what our first and most important priority is, I bet they'll say "safety is our first priority". The reason for this is simple. We do detailed safety briefs before each relay of each event. It doesn't matter if there are 20 shooters or just 1, the safety brief is done the same way, every time. We do this to combat the two main causes of firearms accidents,

Ignorance: (Lack of Knowledge)

• Ignorance of Rules for Safe Gun Handling

• Ignorance of the Proper and Safe way to Operate a firearm **Complacency:** (Poor or Improper Attitude)

• Failure to Apply the Rules for Safe Gun Handling

• Failure to Observe Proper Procedures for Safely Operating a Firearm The first one is easy to understand, but still not acceptable. We all know that if you don't understand how something works, don't touch it. Hopefully, these people have the correct mindset, before they touch a firearm. That mindset would be knowing that they lack the knowledge to safely handle a firearm. Hopefully, they have surrounded themselves with good people that are willing to teach them the proper way to safely handle the firearms. This is something that I am proud to say that I see a lot at Escondido Fish and Game. This can be seen when a new shooter comes up to shoot trap or shoot in a new event. Personally, I'm seeing it as I learn the art of black powder shooting. I saw it when I wanted to try pot shooting. The generosity and willingness to help is one of the many reasons our range is so outstanding.

The second is not as easy to understand and it's one that really gets under my skin. I've seen this a lot over the years, not just at our range but many ranges, especially in the military. It usually starts out with someone that has been shooting for many years and thinks he knows everything. He'll do stupid things like resting his finger on the trigger or he'll make a comment like "Don't you trust me?" when you check a firearm that he just unloaded and checked. These are the ones that think that it won't happen to them because they know it all. They do not have the right mindset. Safety is not their highest priority. Safety comes second to their own ego. I can tell you from experience that these are exactly the people that should be avoided at all costs. Where these people go, accidents are sure to follow. They are one of the main reasons that safety briefs are given before each relay of each event. The Junior program strives to make great shooters that will never fall into these two categories. By continuously stressing proper safety practices and the shooting fundamentals, I believe that we are accomplishing our goal. If you don't believe me, I invite you to come to an event (When it is opened up again) and see for yourself. Better yet, come be a part of the program, we are always looking for motivated coaches that want to help us achieve our goal.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
