Seriously?




Make Time to Attend a General Meeting

A Voice from the Past



Attention Veterans

To commemorate and preserve the personal wartime and military experiences of US veterans for history, the Folklife Center of the Library of Congress has created the Veteran's History Project. This project is maintained and funded by the Library of Congress under Public Law 106-308 and is administered locally by the Veterans Museum in Balboa Park.

The goal of the project is to provide a video record of the activities of US veterans on behalf of our country. The video record is produced at no cost to the veteran and maintained in a publicly available repository by the US Government. All video tapes are filed with the Library of Congress. A copy of the video tape is provided to the Veterans Museum in Balboa Park and a copy is provided to the Veteran.

The program is available to all male and female veterans of any US war or conflict, and is also available to civilians who have been engaged in activities that support the US military. Personal wartime engagement is not a pre-requisite to participate in this project. A veteran's recollections and experiences will be recorded by a professional videographer and a copy provided to the participant for personal use. A second copy will be filed with the Veterans Museum in San Diego, CA and a third copy will be filed with the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C. for later generations to

The Range Safety Officers and other members are not your "Mother". It is not their job to clean up after you!

I found the Range Blue (Hot/Cold) Lights turned On at the Pistol and Rifle range and no one was around. "I am not your Mother", make sure they are off before you leave.

A member was packing up his gear on the Pistol range and I reminded him to sweep up his brass. He acknowledged and said yes, next thing I see is him getting into his car and getting ready to drive away with the brass still on the ground. I needed to remind him "I am not your Mother!" and clean up his brass (still need the taser).

If you have several targets deep stapled to the target backing board. when you are done shooting remove them and throw them away. The next shooter is not your "Mother" whose job it is to clean up the target before using.

Please tidy up after yourself – "I am not your Mother..."

FIRST AID KITS

As you already know, there is a first aid kit at each of the ranges, Pistol, 100 Rifle, 150 Rifle and Trap (on the outside wall of the Trap Ramada). There are also first aid items in the drawer in the kitchen (It has the RED + on it).

Each first aid kit has a laminated card inside with a photo of the way the kit items should be laid out, plus a listing on the backside of each item and where it belongs in the kit.

These first aid kits are there for the protection and safety of our members and their guests. If you have a minor injury or feel ill please feel free to use any of the items for your relief and comfort, however these items were not purchased for you to take to fill your personal first aid kits at home or in your vehicle.

Each time an item is removed from a kit for personal reasons, it takes away from a member or guest who really might need it at the range.

I am the designated Emergency Disaster Preparedness CRSO. Part of my job is to re-supply the first aid kits as needed. Please feel free to notify me if you discover any items missing from the first aid kits. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

BLACK POWDER NEWS

September marks the return of our Super Short Range silhouette contest. Target ranges will be 25, 50, and 75 yards. (The following is a Shameless Contest Promotion).

NOW IS THE TIME! If you have a muzzle loading firearm in you closest or safe, it's time to blow off the dust. Find your round balls, patches, caps/flints and powder. Get out to the range and shoot a couple of practice shots. This upcoming Super Short Range contest is designed for those guys who are waffling about shooting a muzzle loading pistol or rifle in competition. This is absolutely the easiest contest of the year. The range is short, (see above), we shoot from the 150 range house, (in the shade). We will help you get started and walk you through the steps of the contest. This is not a timed contest. You're not going to be pushed to keep up. If you foul or dry ball we will help your clear it. See the event categories on the EF&GA website for details. You have no excuses left, pilgrims. This contest is for you.

Note that the September Super Short Range contest also offers a Trade Gun category.

September also marks the 3rd of the 6 contest series in the Black Diamond Silver Challenge. This is a cap and ball revolver series to determine top overall cap and ball revolver shooter over a six contest series. The prize is a presentation revolver provided by Ray Bucholz. 

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

The Challenge

Anyone that has spent time in the military or knows anybody that has been in the military knows that the military is big on tradition. From the blood stripe on a Marine's trousers to the way that ships are christened before launch, the military runs on tradition.

One of the traditions is the challenge coin. They have been an American military tradition for over a century, meant to instill unit pride, improve esprit de corps and reward hard work and excellence. The coins represent anything from a small unit

to the offices of top leaders, such as the defense secretary. There are also coins made for special events, anniversaries and even non-military leaders.

Many service members and veterans proudly display challenge coins at their desks or homes, showing off the many missions that they've been on, the top leaders that they've met and the units for which they've worked.

How did the tradition start? A quick search of the internet reveals numerous possibilities. The one that was told to me by a Marine Corps Sergeant Major (SgtMaj) was that it started back in the Civil War. At that time only officers received medals, so when an officer wanted to show appreciation, to enlisted personnel for a heroic act or a job well done, they would cut the medal from the ribbon and give it to the enlisted person. Another story tells of a wealthy Army Lieutenant of World War I. The Lieutenant wanted to give a memento to each person in the unit so he had several coin sized, bronze, medallions minted with the unit's logo.

The challenge states that the Marine or soldier initiating the challenge will call for a coin check, holding up their own coin. Anyone found to not have their coin on-hand buys the round, but if everyone produces their coins, the person who issued the challenge better have more coins than just their challenge coin, they are buying. Many units have their own traditions. At one unit in particular the Sgt Maj. would stop Marines throughout the day and ask to see their challenge coin. If the Marine was able to quickly retrieve it from his pocket, the Sgt Maj. would bestow some reward such a getting a long weekend or a unit shirt. If a whole platoon was able to present a coin, the whole platoon would get a long weekend or would get out of weekend duty. If the Marine was not able to present a coin, the SgtMaj. might give the Marine a particularly nasty task such cleaning the restrooms (Heads) or some other extra duty. Needless to say that every Marine kept some extra challenge coins with them, just in case. I believe that the challenge coin tradition not only taught us to appreciate military tradition, but it also taught us to be detail orientated. The smallest item could have a big impact on the unit. Many Marines and former military members will continue the tradition well after their military careers are over.

Over the years I have received many coins, each with their own story. I have gotten them from commanding officers, Sergeant Majors, and celebrities such as R. Lee Ermy. You will rarely, if ever, catch me without a coin. A couple of the coins that I am most proud of were given to me in the last year. Both were given to me by Frank "Coach" Allesio. They represent units that he served in during his time in the Army. One is from the 2nd Infantry Regiment "Ramrods" and the other is from the 3rd Infantry Regiment "The Old Guard". For those that don't know, The Old Guard is the unit that guards the Tomb of the Unknown Soldiers. This is arguably one of the most prestigious units in the United States military.
