Darrín's Dissertation

The 100 Yard Range Remodel project is coming along nicely. As I write this, the concrete has been poured, the steel structure has been installed, and the shooting benches have been moved back to the new structure.


We have come a long way on this project and there were many people who have contributed many hours of effort to get it done. Ordinarily, I like to list off the specific people who contributed to a project but there are so many, and I only have one page to fit this article in.

There was a lot of effort put into the planning and engineering of the project as well as the adjustments made along the way to make it a first-class project. Volunteers spent many hours tearing down the old structure and salvaging materials that were later used for making the concrete forms and making the temporary firing line more stable during construction. Numerous truckloads of road base were delivered, spread, and compacted to make a solid foundation to set rebar and build forms for the new concrete slab. The rebar was laid out and wired together and the pier forms were set up and suspended. We hired a team of finishers to get the concrete slab poured and finished properly the first time and it all went according to the plan. When the installers delivered and ready in just two days.

As it stands today, there are a few remaining tasks to be done. We need to paint the Firing Line (red), Safety Line (yellow), and Spectator Line (blue). The installation of the electrical systems (outlets, overhead lights, and blinking blue lights) needs to be done as well. The Fire Lane (between the parking lot and the concrete slab) needs some grading and finishing and there are a few other tasks along the way that need to be done as well.

Now there is light at the end of the tunnel. Hopefully, that light is not an oncoming train. As this project is finally coming to an end, I think that we all have a lot to be proud of. I'm looking forward to bringing my grandson there to shoot someday and telling him all about how it came together because of an excellent team.



Bow Hunter Education Class 9/9/2023 (7:00 am – 4:00 pm)

Class Description: The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and guiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

Hello everyone,

New Signs

New and updated signs for Range Specific Rules and Administrative Rules have

been placed on the Pistol, Trap, 100 and 150 yard ranges. Read them and make sure you and your guests understand them and follow all the rules.

Guests

Members are allowed to bring two guests. Pay attention to your guests. You are responsible for them. Make sure they understand our rules and adhere to them.

Blinking Blue Lights

Blue Blinking lights on or off applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking lights are on, do not unload firearms or gear. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot. Then you can unload your firearms and gear. Firearms must be uncased at the firing line.

The Green Sheets

Everyone must sign the Green Sheets, even if they are not shooting. When you sign the Green Sheets please make sure the date and range fields are filled in. We are still getting Green Sheets turned in without the proper date and range information.

Target Disposal

Remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. Do Not Dispose of your targets in the trash. Take Them Home. This is, unfortunately, a Hazmat requirement.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- DO NOT Handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep Up Brass Behind the Yellow and In Front of the Red Line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red Line Only

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

Where is my EAR and EYE **Protection?**

Wildlife

Watch for Turkeys and Deer on the range. If wildlife of any kind wanders onto the range, call a "Cease Fire". Wait for the wildlife to leave before you resume shooting. There are no circumstances in which shooting the wildlife is acceptable.

Take Everything Home

Take a look around you before you leave the range. Do you have everything you brought with you?



InterClub Shoot



In the Junior Marksmanship Program we pride ourselves on providing the best shooting events, but we can't do it without great coaches. The funny thing is that shooting is just one aspect of what the Junior Program teaches. In a world that often says that they are too young, or they can't be trusted, even ignored or belittled, especially when they ask about firearms, this is a huge confidence booster to these kids. I've seen it many times, when a child gets done with a Junior Marksmanship event, they walk taller, they smile more, they are more engaged in what is going on around them. They want to be that trustworthy person that they were just shown that they could be. Some even start to get better grades in school because they don't want to be that dummy with a firearm. The idea that they are being allowed to do something that for many people is forbidden is very exciting to many kids. The discipline and focus that marksmanship requires, combined with the stigma of firearms, can not only bring a new level of self-confidence, but it can also improve the bonds of trust between the child and the adults around them

The Junior Marksmanship program strives to make every event a learning opportunity. We do this by constantly **"Coaching Up"**, by focusing on the good and working to strengthen the weaknesses. Because we Coach Up, we have many kids that return month after month. They want to learn. They want to have fun and be a part of the program. These kids are not just a number, they are participants. Many of them ask me how they can help. They help set up and tear down the range. They are happy to help because it is their program. I want to thank all of the coaches that come out every month and work tirelessly to give our kids these opportunities.









Last Contest: Was on July 23rd. This was scheduled to be a "Mid-Range" event with targets to 125 yds. Mother nature stepped in and the forecast was for a heat advisory and "you're all going to melt" warnings.

In deference to our more "mature" shooters (me), I decided to make this one a Super Short Range to keep everybody under the range house and minimize long walks in the sunshine. True to form the weather dawned clear and hot. By the time the contest started it became cloudy. By mid-way through the rifle contest it started to sprinkle...... Consequently most shooters did well. We even had two perfect scores for the first time in recent memory. I really need to stop making these contests too easy.....

By the time this is posted in the Newsletter we will have completed the Annual Top Gun Contest. Results will be published next month.

Next Bullseye Muzzle Loading Contest: Will be on Sept 3rd. This will be a "3 Gun" event for Pistol, Rifle, and Trade Gun. 
"Cant", synonymous with "tilt", is the angle of something relative to a reference. For a shotgun, it is the angle between the buttstock and the receiver and barrel(s) and is intentional to aid in pointing when the gun is mounted naturally (and quickly) to the shoulder. High-end target rifles will have adjustable buttplates that can be canted relative to the rest of the rifle so that the sights will be directly above the bore, i.e., a line drawn through the bore and the line of sight will be vertical when the shooter is holding the gun in a natural position. Those rifles will also have a bubble level to indicate to the shooter that the gun is oriented properly. This "perfect" orientation is shown on the left in Fig. 1 below. An extension of the elevation reticle line passes right through the center of the bore and the rifle is held such that that line is vertical. Elevation adjustments will be true, say 1/4 MOA per click, as will windage adjustments, and there is no windage error regardless of distance.

Most rifles don't have an adjustable buttplate, and it is easy for a shooter to tilt, or cant, the rifle one way or another relative to vertical, especially if the background in their field of view is not level. For a right-handed shooter, the most likely direction is counter-clockwise, a natural result of anatomy. This places the sights, whether they are open sights or a scope, to the left of the bore, as shown in Figs. 2 & 3 below. If the sights are zeroed at a particular distance and all shooting is done at that distance AND the gun is canted the same every time, then no problem- zero will still be zero (where the line of sight and trajectory cross). But at any other distance than that, there will be a windage error and potentially an elevation adjustment error.

Fig. 2 shows a canted rifle with a scope "uncanted" such that its reticle and adjustments are truly vertical and horizontal. This is what you might get by mounting and aligning a scope by eye. (An extreme version of this is an M1C or M1D, the scope being offset mounted to allow top loading with an en bloc clip.) Elevation adjustments will be true, as will windage adjustments, but there will be windage error relative to the zero at any other distance. This is shown in the "HORIZONTAL PLANE" portion of Fig. 2.

If the scope was mounted using alignment tools so that the rig looks like Fig. 1 when leveled but is held like Fig. 3 when shooting (exaggerated for illustration purposes), then more errors creep in. Not only will there be the windage error at any non-zero distance as above, but elevation and windage adjustments will be off, and induce a cross-coupled error in the other axis as well. If the cant angle is "A", the adjustments will be multiplied by the cosine of "A" (always less than 1) and the cross-coupled error will be the adjustment times the sine of "A".

How much of this matters? Classic engineering answer: it depends. It depends on the cant angle, the distances you are shooting, and how much you care about being off. Obviously, for long range precision shooting, critical. For plinking away at 50 vs. 100 yards, probably not noticeable unless you're way off. I never worked out the math for a representative example, but I hope you find the theoretical aspect good to know and useful.
