Hunter Education Follow Up Course 4/12/2026 & 5/10/2026 (7:30 am – 12 noon)

The online course, alone, is NOT a qualification for a hunter education certificate. Once you have completed an online course, you will still need to attend a 4-hour follow up class with a certified Hunter Education Instructor. Access is permitted to the 4-hour follow-up class only after a student has completed the written Home Study or Online component of the class.

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 5/2/2026 (8 am – 12 noon)

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

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Honoring Ray Bucholz and Pamela Tucker: The Heart Behind the EF&GA Rose Garden

The Rose Garden

There are gardens that simply bloom—and then there are gardens that tell a story. The rose garden at the Escondido Fish & Game Association (EF&GA) is one of those rare places where every blossom carries history, devotion, and decades of loving care. At the center of that story stand two remarkable individuals: **Ray Bucholz** and **Pamela Tucker**.

A Vision Rooted in Love

The beginnings of the EF&GA rose garden are grounded in something deeply personal. A conversation at **El Plantio Nursery** with nurseryman **Sean Peer** revealed a touching detail about Ray's original inspiration. Ray wanted to plant roses beginning in 2008 with only three plants as a living memorial to his mother's life. Those three plants grew to between 300-400.

He negotiated a special price and, little by little, purchased the roses over time until he reached that meaningful number. What began as a son's tribute gradually blossomed into something far greater—a garden that would be enjoyed by an entire community.

Expanding a Dream

By the time many of us first encountered the garden, Ray and his longtime friend Pam had already been expanding and nurturing it for years. In May of 2018, Ray and Pam invited the San Diego Rose Society to include the EF&GA rose garden as a stop on their field trip. Approximately 40 members visited that spring, enjoying picnic lunches surrounded by more than 200 flourishing rose bushes.

The impression was immediate and lasting. The blooms were spectacular. The garden was meticulously cared for. It was clear to everyone that Ray and Pam had chosen each variety thoughtfully, cultivating not just quantity, but beauty and diversity.

Pamela's Lifelong Dedication to Roses

Pamela Tucker brought to the EF&GA garden a wealth of experience. For many years she was actively involved with the rose garden in Balboa Park before discovering the EF&GA rose garden, which was much closer to her home in Valley Center.

Her knowledge of rose varieties, pruning techniques, fertilization routines, and garden design has been invaluable. Pamela will soon be sharing a detailed map of the EF&GA rose garden that identifies every rose by name—a resource that will allow members and visitors to deepen their appreciation of the collection.



Guidance from Master Rosarians

Ray's commitment to doing things right led him to seek advice from respected rosarians **Bob** and **Donna Martin** of Escondido, who were well known in both San Diego rose circles and the American Rose Society. With their guidance, Ray established sound fertilization and care routines that helped the EF&GA roses thrive. The Martins also donated the landscape shed located between the shotgun and 100 Yard Ranges.

Even as health challenges made it more difficult for Ray and Pam to maintain the garden personally, the strong foundation they created allowed others to step in and continue their work.

A Community Effort

A few years after that memorable 2018 visit, one member shared that when her husband wanted to join a gun club, she insisted on EF&GA—because of the beautiful rose garden. That says something powerful about what Ray and Pam built. The garden is not an afterthought; it is part of the club's identity.

As Ray and Pam gradually became less able to perform the physical labor required, other EF&GA members stepped up. Volunteers began helping more regularly, ensuring that pruning, feeding, planting, and maintenance continued. Many members and volunteers have worked to keep the garden growing and thriving, honoring the legacy that Ray and Pam established.

Continuing Commitment

Ray's dedication has never wavered. He continues to hold fundraisers to support the garden's needs—often raffling firearms from his own collection to generate funds for fertilizer, plant replacements, irrigation improvements, and other essentials. Through his ongoing generosity, the rose garden remains vibrant and sustainable.

More Than a Garden

Today, the EF&GA rose garden stands as a living testament to multi-decade devotion. It began with three roses planted in memory of a beloved mother and grew into a collection of hundreds of blooms admired by visitors, rose society members, and Association families alike.

Every rose has a name. Every planting has a story. And behind it all are **Ray Bucholz** and **Pamela Tucker**—whose vision, love of roses, and perseverance created something enduring and beautiful for all of us to enjoy.

As we walk through the garden and pause to admire a bloom, may we also remember the decades of care, sacrifice, and passion that made it possible.

Editors Note: In their humility, **Kathleen** and **Paul** did not boast of all the hard work that they and **Barbara McFadden** have done in the past couple of years to revitalize and maintain the Rose Garden. It has been a continuous act of devotion.
