NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 7/4/2026 (8 am – 12 noon)

Class Description:

This class will provide the knowledge to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above date from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is “Hands-On” training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

Cost: \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. Supplies (e.g., cases, primers, projectiles and powder) are available for a \$15 surcharge if needed.

Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 nonrefundable deposit is required.

Hunter Education Course 7/11/2026 & 8/8/2026 (7:30 am – 4 pm)

The Hunter Education Course is nationally approved. Topics include basic firearms nomenclature and safe loading/unloading practices, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and more. The certificate issued is valid in all states and several foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved.

Hunter Education Follow Up Course 7/12/2026 & 8/9/2026 (7:30 am – 12 noon)

The online course, alone, is NOT a qualification for a hunter education certificate. Once you have completed an online course, you will still need to attend a 4-hour follow up class with a certified Hunter Education Instructor. Access is permitted to the 4-hour follow-up class only after a student has completed the written Home Study or Online component of the class.

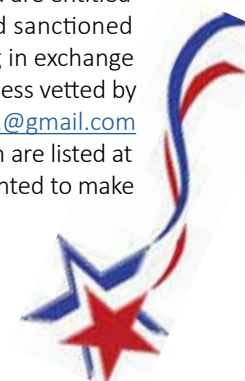

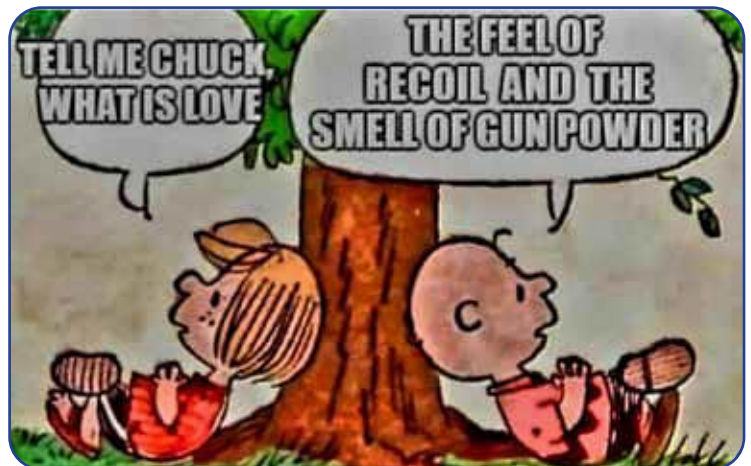

Here's to Your Health

Summer is here. It's getting warmer. Stay cool and stay hydrated. Be alert to signs of over-heating. Look out for your fellow shooters, too. Let's make sure we all have a fun day at the range and go home safe and healthy.

Manual Hand Thrower on the Trap Range – 2 Man Operation

As mentioned in Mark's Remarks, use of the manual thrower on the Trap Range is a 2 person operation, but it's worth repeating. One person operates the thrower while the other person shoots. Under no circumstance should the shooter be operating the thrower and shooting at the same time. Creative work arounds are not permitted. Try the old fashioned work around. **Bring a friend.**

Going Down Range when Adjacent Ranges are Active

The Trap pads are adjacent to the 100 Yard Range on the West and the Pistol range on the East. If anyone is going down range beyond the fence line, it is essential that you coordinate with shooters on the adjacent ranges. That adjacent range must "Go Cold", too, before you can go down range. The 100 Yard Range has a bell mounted to the end of the fence to be used to get the attention of any shooters on the Trap pad.



Show Membership ID When Asked

All members are required to show their member ID upon request. This is for the protection of our members and the Association. Any member may ask to see your ID, since all members are considered to be RSOs (Range Safety Officers).

Updating Fire Extinguishers and First Aid Kits

We are in the process of replacing the fire extinguishers and first aid kits around the range.

Shooting Slugs on Rifle Ranges Only

Shooting shot gun slugs is restricted to the rifle ranges. Please refrain from shooting slugs at the patterning board or down range between the Trap and Pistol ranges.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **ON**
- DO NOT Handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up Brass Behind the Yellow and in Front of the Red Line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **OFF**
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red Line Only

Trap Scoring Tips

Our trapshooting sessions depend on volunteer scoring and house loading. Here are some guidelines to follow when scoring American trap.

Lost Bird

The shooter cannot call their own target broken. If you, as the scorer, have a question, ask the squad. Did anyone see a piece come off the target? If not, it is a lost bird. If only the shooter says they saw the piece, then the target is lost. For a dead target there must be a visible piece coming off the target. Dust does not count as a lost target.

Broken Target

If a target comes out of the house broken, you don't have to shoot at it. You will get another target. If you shoot at it and break the target, the ATA (Amateur Trapshooting Association) rules would make you shoot the target again. If you shoot at a broken target and miss it, you get to shoot another target. If anything comes out of the house with a target it is considered broken. ATA rules say you must shoot at another target.

These are the same rules that the InterClub shoots follow so it would make sense to use the same rules at our shooting sessions.

Loading the House

Most targets that come out broken are caused by improper loading. The targets are like handling eggs. If they get dropped in the machine, they will crack and when the arm throws them, they will come out broken. Set them in the machine with care and we will have fewer broken targets. This also helps keep the cost down.

The boxes set outside the house for reloading need to be inside the corners of the house. A box flap blowing in the wind will cause distraction. Make sure the boxes are not visible from the shooting area.

As a side note, there is no DROS or waiting period on Muzzle Loading rifles or pistols. If you win one at the meeting, it goes home with you. If you are lucky enough to win one or more of these items, then plan on coming to the next Muzzle Loading Silhouette contest. We will point you to suppliers for powder, balls and support equipment.

Muzzle Loading Bullseye on July 5th, 2026

For our regular July event, held July 5, you will need to decide what firearm you want to use. You can choose to use a rifle, or if you have one, a tradegun. The courses of fire will be different, but league points will be awarded for each equally. The rifle course of fire will be 2 targets at 50 yards, shooting 13 shots on each target with the 10 best on each target counting for score. The tradegun course of fire will be 1 target with 10 shots at 50 yards and 2 targets at 25 yards with 5 shots on each. There are no "throw away" shots for the tradegun course of fire. The 10 shot tradegun target will also be our SPAR tradegun championship for 2026. The total tradegun course of fire will be the final Northwest Gun event of the series. You won't be able to shoot both rifle and tradegun, so you need to think about what you want to do and make a decision.

The scoring will be the same as always except there will not be any categorical bonus points since we don't have categorical competition with the tradeguns.

Following that competition, we will have our final cross sticks rifle event in that series. It will be our usual 5 shot, single target format and it will close out the competition for the X Sticks Series for this year. So, if you decide to shoot the regular trade gun event and also want to shoot in the X Sticks, be sure to bring your rifle as well as your trade gun.

Decisions, Decisions, Decisions....

We will be on the 150 Yard Range. Practice from 07:00 to 07:45 if you bring your own targets. There will be a Mandatory Safety Briefing at 07:45 and the contest begins at 08:00.

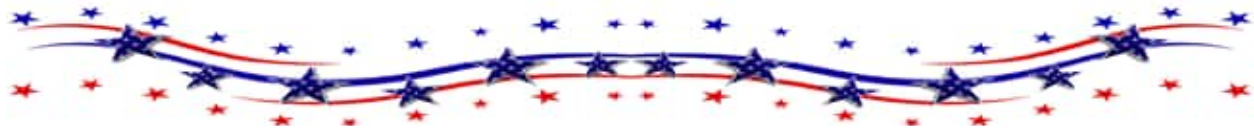
