Mark's Remarks

Hello Everyone

First of all, I would like to apologize for last month's Mark's Remarks because I forgot to mention 9/11.

I have been asked by several people why we do certain things at the range. I was given a list of five suggestions. Over the next couple months, I will try to address them, so everybody appreciates the value of doing them.

I was asked why we have life members. Unlike other organizations, clubs and associations, at EF&GA you have to earn and be elected as a life member. You cannot just purchase it out right. It is in our bylaws, that we can elect up to two life members every year. This is done by submitting a nomination to the Life Membeship Committee for a person that you feel deserves the honor. This committee is appointed by the president and all the members of the committee are life members. Candidates for life membership shall have been regular or senior members of the Association for at least 7 years prior to the candidate being nominated for life membership. They must have performed "outstanding service" for the Association. This outstanding service must have been performed over a period of time and must consist of more than one single act. It must be of such a nature that it can be documented by the committee for presentation to the Board of Directors. In addition, it is desirable that the candidate has performed outstanding leadership, such as serving as an officer, board member or chairperson of the Association.

If you would like to nominate somebody for life membership, put your nomination in an email. Name the person and explain why you feel they deserve to become a life member. The online course, alone, is NOT a qualification for a hunter education certificate. Once you have completed an online course, you will still need to attend a 4-hour follow up class with a certified Hunter Education Instructor. Access is permitted to the 4-hour follow-up class only after a student has completed the written Home Study or Online component of the class.

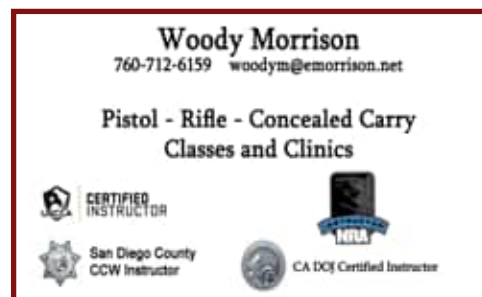
NRA Personal Protection in the Home 10/24/2026 (8 am – 5 pm)

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 11/7/2026 (8 am – 12 noon)

Class Description:

This class will provide the knowledge to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above date from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is “Hands-On” training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

Holster Draw and Rapid Fire

You have probably noticed that Holster Draw and Rapid Fire are taboo during casual shooting. Why then, are they allowed in certain sanctioned events?

The sanctioned events have safety protocols in place that significantly decrease the chance of a "Negligent Discharge". Here's an example of how it works:

Each squad has a team leader and at least one back up that has been approved by the Rangemasters. They serve as a one-on-one RO (Range Officer) for every participant in the match.

The RO's sole responsibility is to make sure the shooter understands the course of fire, loads and reholsters properly before beginning the course. During the course, the RO's eyes are solely on the shooter's hands and the gun. He is watching to be sure the muzzle is always pointed downrange and that the shooter's finger is off the trigger and away from the trigger well. He does not look for hits and misses. That is the job of the squad mates. The RO doesn't even look at the timer at the end of the course. He simply holds the timer up for the squad mates to read, while he continues to watch the shooter's hands and the gun. The RO instructs the shooter through the unload, show clear, hammer down and reholstering process before he takes his eyes off the shooter.

If the RO sees a violation of the muzzle pointed anywhere except downrange, he will yell, "Muzzle". Two muzzle calls will result in a DQ for the day. If the RO sees a violation of the trigger position, he will yell, "Trigger". Two trigger calls will also result in a DQ for the day.

This entire process is designed to prevent a negligent discharge. But...if a negligent discharge does occur, following these procedures will help to insure that you do not cause a catastrophe.

So...The moral of the story is, if you want to do holster draw and rapid fire, come join one of the sanctioned events that are authorized to oversee those activities. All events are listed on page 6 of this newsletter.

Someone asked me today about the coaching philosophy behind our Junior Marksmanship Program, so I thought I would explain it to everyone.

Our program operates around three priorities:

1. SAFETY

Safety has been, and always will be, our number one priority by far. Everything else comes after that. We will always run a safe range and teach our young shooters to respect firearms, understand the rules, and look out for one another.

2. FUN

The shooters need to have fun and feel good about what they are doing. If they aren't enjoying themselves, they aren't going to want to come back. We want them to leave the range proud of themselves and looking forward to the next event.

3. LEARNING

We want our shooters to learn much more than simply how to shoot. They learn firearm safety, responsibility, teamwork, discipline and respect—and we always throw in a little patriotism. As they gain experience, some will learn how to coach other shooters and give solid safety briefs. Those are leadership and communication skills that can benefit them long after they leave the range.

That brings me to something important about the Junior Program. Our goal is not simply to make great shooters. Our goal is to help develop well-rounded, responsible young citizens. We want them to understand firearm safety and responsible firearm handling and to recognize that a firearm is a tool whose safe use depends on the knowledge, judgment and actions of the person handling it. If they become great shooters along the way, that's a bonus.

Safety. Fun. Learning.

That's what the Junior Marksmanship Program is about.

Junior Trap

Last Junior Trap was amazing. We had 15 new shooters, 13 beginners and 9 advanced shooters. The advanced shooters shot both 5 stand and trap. Some of our trap scores were high 20's. We have some outstanding Junior Trap shooters. The next Junior Trap event is scheduled for October 10th. The safety brief starts at 5pm. If you have a youth age 10 through their 21st birthday, bring them out.

InterClub News

Many years ago, trap shooters from other clubs, associations and such wanted to get together and have a competitive and social event loosely based on the ATA (Amateur Trapshooting Association) format but with less structure and fewer rules. What came out of it was a standardized event that includes two rounds of Trap from the 16-yard line and another two games from a handicap distance based on your scores from the first two games. While we calculate the handicap distances and figure out the handicap squads, we all eat lunch that is provided by hosts of the event. At the end of the event, we declare a winner of each category (Men, Women, and Juniors under 18) as well as an aggregate score for each participating club (Association in our case). The 'Club Scores' are calculated by adding the top five scores from each club. Any tiebreakers are decided by which club has the most participants at the event.

When I first started participating in these events, there were six ranges that each hosted an event once per year. Now we are down to four clubs (Lemon Grove Rod & Gun Club, Maywood Sportsmen's Club, Redlands Shooting Park, and Escondido Fish & Game Association). We recently agreed to have each club host two events per year starting in 2027. Previously, we always hosted in August. For 2027 we will be hosting on 1/30/2027 and 5/29/2027.

We hosted the InterClub at our Range on August 29, 2026. There were 36 shooters and the top shooter was our own **Joe Goulart** with a 90. There were not enough women or juniors to have awards in those categories. We also won the Club Score with a total of 408. Besides winning the top shooter and the Club Score, we had a fantastic event. Lots of EF&GA members stepped up and helped score, load the machines, and serve food.

Old Frontier Day II
