How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as gualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

BLACK POWDER NEWS

Somebody was complaining to me the other day about the BP scores being posted a month in arrears. Sorry folks. The cutoff for the newsletter is the 18th of every month. Our BP contests are on the 4th Sunday of every month, well past the deadline. The BP Silhouette scores are always going to be posted a month and 12 days after the shoot. If you really need to know what you shot, call me or send me an e-mail and I will look at the shoot record. (BTW, the lead time for most commercial magazines is 90 to 120 days. Be thankful that we have volunteers to crank out our newsletter in a fraction of that time,....for free.

For those of you that are interested, I have compiled a shoot record for 2016. It includes who shot what at each contest, your average points per contest, per distance, etc.. This will be available for review at the regular BP Silhouette contest on the 4th Sunday of each month.

The April contest, (barring rain), will be the long course from 100 to 150 yards. If you hold the common belief that muzzle loading rifles are inaccurate beyond 50 yards, you should come out and see some of our better shooters consistently knocking over the Ram at 150 yards. The "ping" when you hit the long range targets is extremely satisfying,...once the smoke clears.

By the time you read this we should have completed our first Jr Muzzle Loading class. We hope this will generate some interest in new shooters giving black powder pistols and rifles a try at the range. I have had a number of regular members tell me that they have a BP pistol or rifle, that they have not shot it in years. NOW IS THE TIME. It's not hard, and it's not expensive. Our contests are low key and we are always willing to work with new, (old), shooters. Blow the dust off that rifle and get some practice time in now. We have an informal group of BP shooters on the 150 range almost every Thursday morning if you need help getting back into it, or just want to hang out with old guys that smell like Sulfur.... Feel free to contact me for the contest and category rules.

Our contest in May will be the Super Short Confidence Course. It's a perfect venue to get some use out of that under-utilized BP pistol or rifle hiding in your gun safe. New for the May contest will be a "Smoothbore" category. (Think primitive flintlock smoothbore shot-gun with slugs). We will have a Smoothbore category open at each of the Super Short Course matches. (May and Sept this year plus ANY rain dates). Super Short Course is 25-50-75 yds

February Black Powder Silhouette Contest - Well this was another rain contest. Three of the last four contests have been rain events and it's really getting old quick. Rain and Black Powder do not mix well. We were scheduled for the normal short course of 50 to 100 yards but, as advertised, on rain days we shoot the super short course, 25 to 75 yards), to allow the pistol guys a chance to shoot from the house. Six people shot pistol and nine people shot rifle. Scores are listed. New for this contest we had one, (New), Bear silhouette target welded up. Shooters who had finished their relays were invited to try and shoot it to see if .44 and larger calibers would have enough punch to knock it over. Looks like a winner as even low hits knocked it over with authority.
