## NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 5/3/2025, 7/5/2025, 9/6/2025, 11/1/2025 (8 am – 12 noon)

#### Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1<sup>St</sup> session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

Registration for the course can be done directly through the NRA website.





Rangemaster Sound-Off

#### **EF&GA Policy Review**

Periodically Escondido Fish and Game Association reviews our policies to clarify or change as appropriate. Rangemaster Sound-Off is highlighting a couple of those policies this month.

#### **Archery Policy**

Recurve, Longbow, Compound, and Crossbows are permitted on the Archery range with field/target tip arrows only.

#### **RSO Requirements and Obligations**

An RSO must be a Member of EF&GA for at least one year. They must perform five hours of range duty per month. They must have an NRA Basic Range Safety Officer Certificate of Completion. The NRA Basic Range Safety Officer Course will be offered for \$150. A red RSO hat is \$25 and a red RSO shirt is \$25. If the RSO completes twelve months of RSO duties they will be refunded \$200 for the course, hat and shirt. Members with an NRA Basic Range Safety Officer Course Certificate will be charged \$25 for a red RSO hat and \$25 for a red RSO shirt and will be refunded \$50 for twelve months of service. RSOs will receive reward credits for twelve months of service. RSOs must perform twelve months of service to be an active EF&GA RSO.

#### New Policy for CA CCW Holders at the Pistol Range

For reasons of safety and practical application of a standardized procedure, the following policy was put in place by the Board of Directors:

Drawing from a holster and firing is prohibited during casual shooting. A shooter that has a valid California CCW may unholster a firearm from concealment on the firing line and must immediately clear the firearm (remove the magazine and clear the chamber of any ammunition while the firearm is pointed downrange) before engaging in casual shooting. When the casual shooting session is completed, the shooter may reload and re-holster the firearm safely at the firing line before leaving the Range.

During casual shooting, the CCW holder must continue to follow all casual shooting rules (no rapid fire, no drawing and firing, etc..). The above policy only applies to retrieving and stowing the firearm.

#### **Members are RSOs**

Every Member of our Association is an RSO. If you witness behavior that is inconsistent of our rules and policies, you have the authority to address it. If you would like the Chief RSO to follow up on the violations, please include the name of the person and the date and time of the incident. Also specify... what transpired.

**SPAR Camp:** On April 19th. The **S**ociety of **P**rimitive **A**merican **R**iflemen will hold a camp event (in the campground) starting at 09:00. Events will include a Primitive Archery event (Long Plates on the Archery Range) starting at 10:00. **NOTE:** I will be **OUT OF STATE** from April 8th thru the 23rd. Tom Arendell will be present and indicates that he will have several programs available to share.

Time, range, and weather permitting we will also hold a "Treed" shooting event on the 150 range. From behind a barrier (roof pole) one shot standing offhand at a 75 yard B-100 target. Reload standing up. Shot #2 will be kneeling using the barrier for support. Reload kneeling. Shot #3 will be sitting using the barrier for support. Reload sitting. Shot #4 will be prone using the barrier for support. Reload while prone. Shot #5 will be prone, using the barrier for support. NOTE: I will be OUT OF STATE from April 8th thru the 23rd. I need a SPAR member to step up and run this event.

**Muzzle Loading Silhouette:** On April 27<sup>th</sup>. **This is our Annual TOP GUN contest. There is NO PISTOL EVENT THIS MONTH.** If you have won a contest in 2024, in the category of Open, Primitive or Master you are eligible to enter this event. There is a list of names to the right (in no particular order) of all the qualified potential entrants I can identify. Winning this contest moves you into Master Category. There is a mandatory safety briefing at 07:15. The contest

will start at 07:30. Starting positions will be established by a random draw from a hat by all contestants.

There will be 3 silhouettes at each range from 25 to 150 yards. Starting with a loaded rifle, you have 3 shots to knock down 3 silhouettes within 7 minutes. Once the 7 minutes are up, the targets are reset and you move to the next distance. This repeats until all shooters have shot the course. You get 1 point per silhouette knocked down. Once you shoot **and miss** a silhouette, it is a zero for that shot (e.g. If you shoot at # 2 silhouette and both #1 and #2 fall down, you only get one point for #2. You already missed #1.) Ren will explain the course of fire before the event. **NOTE:** This event is for replica percussion or flintlock rifles firing patched round ball ONLY. If your name is included to the right as a BPCR class winner you can shoot the event, BUT your score will not count. You can shoot and have fun, but not win competing with BPCR rifles against replica round ball rifles. There is NO entry fee for this event. First place wins a Trophy and a promotion to Master Class.

# Modern Military Rifle Added to CMP Match

Since 2017 we have been running an **As-issued Military Rifle** match on the morning of the 1st Sunday of every month. This match follows the rules and course of fire of the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Games Rifle Competition rulebook, and is limited to U.S. and foreign military service rifles of the WWII era and before. That same rulebook covers a **Modern Military Rifle** match as well, and I've had requests to include that category. It falls into a category that is broader yet, called **Special Military Rifle**.

Modern Military Rifles, as defined by CMP Games rules, are semi-automatic military rifles of U.S. or foreign manufacture or commercial rifles of the same type and caliber or commercial variations of military-type rifles. There are three categories, described to the right. Common key rules are:

- a) The exterior configuration of the rifle must be similar to that of the original military or military-type rifle.
- b) The trigger pull may not be less than 4.5 lbs.

#### **U.S. Modern Military Rifles must be:**

- a) based on the M-16 rifle or be based on an AR design.
- b) manufactured by a USA manufacturer.
- c) equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights.
- d) chambered for the 5.56x45 mm or .223 Remington cartridge.

#### **Standard Modern Military Rifles:**

- a) may be manufactured in another country.
- b) must be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights.
- c) may be chambered for any cartridge not exceeding 8 mm.

#### **U.S. Modern Military Rifles:**

Either of the above except they may have optical sights (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum magnification of 4.5X installed on the receiver.

The course of fire for Modern Military Rifle is the same as that for As-Issued except 60 seconds for rapid fire prone instead of 80 seconds: 5 sighters, 10 slow prone, 10 rapid prone, 10 offhand (standing). ## AS-ISSUED MILITARY RIFLE MATCH NEWS

#### M1917 and M24/47

Rifles and cartridges used by the participants in the February and March matches were: US M1, M1903, and M1917, .30-06; Yugoslavian M24/47 and M48, 7.92x57mm (8mm) Mauser; Swiss K31, 7.5x55mm; and British Lee-Enfield No. 4 Mk I, .303 British.

The "show and tell" in February, presented by **Colin McKim**, was on the United States Rifle, cal .30, Model of 1917, which also goes by M1917 Enfield, P17, and "American Enfield". It was an American modification and production of the British .303 caliber P14 rifle, developed and manufactured during the period 1917-1918. When the British Empire entered World War I, it had an urgent need for rifles and contracts were placed with companies in the United States. In the case of the P14 rifle, Winchester and Remington were selected. When the U.S. entered the war, it had a similar extreme need for rifles. Rather than re-tool completely, the factories, under the close supervision of the US Army Ordnance Department, altered the design for caliber .30-06. Winchester produced the rifle at their New Haven, Connecticut plant and Remington at their main facility at Ilion, New York and at a new plant in Eddystone, Pennsylvania. (The Eddystone plant was built by the Baldwin Locomotive Works to produce P14s and converted for their use after the war ended.) More M1917s were produced at Eddystone than at New Haven and Ilion combined. And even though the M1903 was the official service rifle of U.S forces, more M1917s were produced and used than M1903s. By the time of the Armistice in Novermber, 1918, about 75% of American Expeditionary Forces were armed with M1917s. The rifles were re-issued in WWII to troops in certain occupations.

The M1917 has a two-lug cock-on-closing bolt and a stripper clip fed magazine that will hold six rounds, rather than the typical five, because the .30-06 Springfield cartridge is smaller in diameter than the .276 Enfield that its predecessor was originally designed around. The sights consist of a fixed post front sight and a rear receiver aperture battle sight calibrated for 400 yards with an additional ladder aperture sight that could be flipped up and was calibrated for 200–1,600 yards. The ladder aperture sight moves vertically on a slide and is not correctable for wind drift. The M1917's barrel had a 1 in 10 in. twist rate and retained the 5-groove left hand twist Enfield-type rifling of the P14, in contrast to the 4-groove right hand twist rifling of the M1903 Springfield and other US designed arms. The M1917 had a 26-inch heavyweight barrel compared to the lighter 24-inch barrel of the M1903 Springfield. With the longer sighting plane, the M1917 proved generally more accurate at long distances than the M1903, at the expense of greater weight.

Interestingly, since the M1917 was never adopted as the standard-issue rifle by the U.S. Army (the M1903 being succeeded by the M1 and M1903A3), and despite the quantity built and used, the Civilian Marksmanhip Program (CMP) Games rulebook does not have a separate competition category for them, instead lumping them in with U.S.-issued Krags and foreign military rifles.

The "show and tell" in March was on the Yugoslavian M24/47. Yugoslavia emerged as an independent state following the fall of the Austro-Hungarian Empire after WW I and adopted the M24 rifle, a "knockoff" of the Gewehr 98 built by Mauser for Germany. M24s were built by the Kragujevac Arsenal (now renamed "Zastava") beginning in 1924. The M24/47 rifle is a bolt-action carbine produced by the Kragujevac Arsenal after WWII by rebuilding older M24 rifles with new, shorter barrels and new stocks.

The M24/47 has a Mauser-style action with a straight bolt handle, a three position safety and a tangent rear sight graduated from 200 meters to 2000 meters. It is chambered in 7.92×57mm (8mm). It features a five- round, fixed, internal magazine that can be fed with stripper clips. The stock has a semi-pistol grip, upper hand guard and sling swivels on the rear barrel of the butt rather than on the side like German K98s. A cleaning rod is stored under the barrel.

Most M24/47s saw no service use, as they were immediately replaced by the M48. After being in storage for decades, many were imported to the U.S. in the late 1990s and early 2000s and sold through surplus arms dealers and outlets such as Big 5.
