I was having dinner with a few friends from the Association and we started discussing all of the tasks that need to be done to keep the Range operating. After a bit of conversation, we came to the conclusion that the Association has many 'moving parts'. We all agreed that as an Association, we get a lot of things done with mostly volunteer work. I consider it an honor to be counted among the members of this great Association.

The first group that comes to mind are the Shoot Chairs. These people each put countless hours of effort into planning, preparing, and maintaining equipment and consumables for their respective events. Then, they run the events and make sure that they remain safe, fun, and on schedule. After the events, they store the equipment and make notes of any required maintenance that needs to be done before the next event. Finally, they fill out the required accounting paperwork for submission with the bank deposit for the proceeds from the event. It is a daunting task that when done properly, makes the participants think that it is all easy and routine. When shoot chairs get volunteer assistance for any of the steps of the process, they really appreciate it.

Next is the maintenance of the facility. We do have a paid maintenance person (**Pete Olson**) but the task is much bigger than one part-time employee. Besides basic grounds keeping and Range maintenance, he keeps the equipment in working order and repairs minor plumbing and electrical issues around the property. Part of his job is working with volunteers to manage the maintenance tasks that need to be done. If you need to get volunteer hours completed, he is a great resource to use. He can usually be found At the Range on weekday mornings.

Four times per year, we hold a Work Party where we knock out large maintenance tasks. We remove the broken targets from the hill, clear any brushfire fuel, and execute projects that can only be done while the Range is closed. The next scheduled Work Party is Sunday, August 15th, 2021. If you want to participate, I highly recommend it. The work is not glamorous but we all know that it needs to be done. I always find these events very rewarding because we always get lots of work done in a relatively short period of time. Most of us get there before 8am (before it gets hot) and we are usually mostly finished before lunch. The food is always fantastic and after lunch there is a no-cost raffle. Members and guests of all ages are welcome!



BLACK POWDER NEWS

Covid -19 Update: This event is open to members and the public. No current restrictions are in place.

August 1st BullsEye League Contest: This will be an NMLRA (National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association) Offhand Rifle Aggregate event. A safety briefing will start at 7:45 and the contest starts at 8:00. **Contact Patrick Watson at 760-522-3912 or patwatson1969@hotmail.com** for details.

August 1st Traditional Archery: This will be a "Long Plates" course of fire. The contest will start following the rifle contest outlined above (10:00 ish) in the campground. **Contact Dave Premetz at 760-489-1082 or slixgunr@yahoo.com** for details.

August 22nd Top Gun Muzzleloading Silhouette: Because of Covid, we missed the Top Gun event for 2019 (would have been held April 2020). This year we are going to combine the 2019 and 2020 Top Gun event into one shoot scheduled for August 22. If you won a BP (Black Powder) Silhouetted Contest in the category of Open, Primitive or Master during the 2019 or 2020 season, then you are eligible to enter. There is no entry fee. There will be a safety briefing at 7:15 and the contest starts at 7:30 sharp. Because of this event, there will not be a pistol contest at the August Silhouette shoot. The regular Long Range rifle shoot will start at 10:00 or as soon after that as needed to finish the Top Gun Shoot. The people listed below are eligible to shoot the Top Gun event: **Tom Arendell, Dan Crane, Ren Everett, Dan Hannah, Elwanda Hannah, Josph Jelinek, Brian Kowalski, Kazik Lewak, Alex Luz-Olson, Elvio Marchi, Tim Morrow, Scott Rueter, Patrick Russ, Bud Smith, Smitty, Brad Speer and Garth Warner.**

Seventeen of the most villainous, scurvy crew you would never hope to meet.

Da Rules: Starting targets will be assigned by a random drawing. Starting with a loaded rifle, you have 7 minutes to knock down 3 silhouettes. You can only shoot 1 Time at each of the 3 targets. If you miss the first target, you move on to number 2, etc. Shooters receive 1 point for each target knocked down. If you hit the frame on your first shot and all 3 targets fall over, you get 3 points.

If you miss number 1, but hit the frame when shooting at number 2 resulting in all 3 targets falling down, you only get 2 points. You can not make up points for targets you missed on your first attempt. Frames will be set at 25, 50, 75, 100, 125, and 150 yards. Shooters will rotate to the left 1 frame after each relay is called. If we have more than 6 shooters we will run 2 rounds, until everyone has had a chance to shoot the course of fire. A maximum of 18 points is possible. The 7 minute time limit will be strictly enforced. Time remaining will be called every minute, every 10 seconds for the last minute, and every second for the least 30 seconds. Shots taken on the final command of "TIME" or after, will not be scored.

August 22nd Muzzleloading Silhouette: This will be a Long Range course of fire with steel targets at 75, 100, and 125 yds. The event will start at 10:00 or as soon after that as needed to finish the Top Gun Shoot and reset the field. There will be no pistol competition this month due to the Top Gun Contest outlined above. **Contact Garth Warner at 760 420-7550 or gwarner@cox.net** for details.

When dove hunters are out in the field with a lot of distance from other people, general safety practices are very different from how we behave at our range with a lot of people in close proximity.

Please help to remind the newcomers of our practices and procedures in order to keep our range safe. Please be polite and thoughtful as our goal is to have a safe and fun day of trap shooting, not to embarrass the new guys. The main rules that they usually don't know about are walking with an empty chamber with the action open. Pump and semi-automatic shotguns are to be carried with the muzzle up and the chamber open. We also do not want to see people picking up shells from the ground with a shotgun in hand so pouches are mandatory. I always keep a few spare pouches in my vehicle for just such an occasion. If we all work together we will all have a great time with minimal safety issues.

M1 “Garands” from the CMP

Last month I wrote about the As-Issued Military Rifle match and mentioned using the U.S. Rifle, Caliber .30, M1, popularly dubbed the “M1 Garand” after its inventor, John C. Garand. Occasionally I get questions from EF&GA members about how to acquire an M1 from the Civilian Marksmanship Program, or CMP (<https://thecmp.org/>). The CMP was formerly the Department of Civilian Marksmanship (DCM) of the U.S. Army and is now an independent, federally chartered 501(c)(3) corporation. They are dedicated to training and educating U. S. citizens in responsible uses of firearms and airguns through gun safety training, marksmanship training and competitions. One of their activities is U.S. military surplus rifle sales, mostly limited to M1s. Each M1 Garand rifle sold by the CMP is an authentic U.S. Government rifle that has been inspected, headspaced, repaired if necessary and test fired for function. The rifles are graded and priced according to their muzzle and throat wear, condition, and originality of parts. Until recently, the best choice for a good “shooter” value was a Service Grade, but those are now listed as “Sold Out”. The Field Grade is available in a nice case for \$650. The CMP will ship it free to an FFL of your choice where it will be processed like any other California firearm sale. The supply is rapidly dwindling. See <https://thecmp.org/sales-and-service/m1-garand/>

There are a few qualifications you must meet to buy an M1 from the CMP. First, you must be a member in a CMP affiliated organization. If you are an EF&GA member, you have already met that requirement. Second, you must provide proof of participation in a marksmanship related activity. Contrary to rumors, you do not have to shoot an M1 in the NMC (National Match Course) or AIMR (As-Issued Military Rifle) match to meet this requirement. Your marksmanship related activity does not even have to be with highpower rifles. It can be with smallbore rifles, pistols, air guns or shotguns, but it does have to be documented. Participating in an event and getting your name and score listed in our newsletter is considered documentation. There are other ways to meet this requirement including military service, law enforcement service, live-fire training and certifications. Additionally, if you are over age 60, proof is not required. Full details can be found on the CMP website at https://thecmp.org/cmp_sales/eligibility-requirements/

In General George S. Patton’s opinion, the M1 is “the greatest battle implement ever devised”. Purchasing an M1 through the CMP will ensure that it will be functional and safe, and the price is generally better than you will find on the resale markets. While the M1 may not be as popular as it once was, it still has a wide following among collectors, competitors, and recreational shooters that makes it hold its value.

If you’ve never shot an M1, come to an NMC or AIMR match where you will be able to use one of the club guns for a modest fee. Since the M1 has a unique loading method, some training in advance is highly recommended. Contact me, **Jim McKim** at jamesemckim@gmail.com, for the training. Come out to see what all the fuss is about. M1s are fun!

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader.

There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, ‘For Sale’, ‘Wanted’, or ‘Lost & Found’.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, “\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades”

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
