Black Powder Herftage Lee Teter Print

At the November General Meeting **Ray Bucholz** and **Bud Smith** unveiled a very special gift for the members of Escondido Fish & Game Association. One of our previous members, **Denny Martin**, had been presented with an authentic signed and numbered print titled The Defender by the artist himself. The artist, **Lee Teter** presented this print to Denny in recognition of his work in helping to establish the Black Powder Heritage programs at Escondido Fish and Game. When Denny passed away, his wife, Susie, brought back many of his items from North Carolina to give to Bud and Ray. Among them was this signed picture from the artist which will hang in the meeting hall at Escondido Fish & Game.

Lee Teter is known primarily for his series depicting early Indian and settler life in the 1700s. The subject of this picture is Lewis Wetzel who became a vigilante Indian fighter in the Ohio Valley Indian wars after a Wyandot raid killed members of his family. It was said that he could load a rifle or musket with powder from a powder horn, round ball, pack it and fire with expert marksmanship while running at full speed. The Indians called him "Death Wind".

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 12/7/2024, 1/5/2025 & 3/1/2025 (8 am – 12 noon)

Ammunition is hard enough to find and expensive enough. Is there any better reason to learn to reload your own ammunition? **Class Description:**

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands-On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (e.g., cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$15 surcharge.

Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 nonrefundable deposit is required to secure a place in this limited class.

Bow Hunter Education Class 12/14/2024 (8:00 am – 4 pm)

Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

Hunter Education Class 1/11/2025, 2/8/2025 & 3/8/2025 (8 am – 4 pm)

Class Description:

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

Safety First

If none are available, the situation can be reported to Gary (gfukuda@escondidofishandgame.com or 760-420-7488) or Mark Baldwin, Assistant Chief Range Safety Officer (760-715-1871 or mlbofsm@cox.net).

Every incident is followed up with an "After Action" review. Measures are taken to provide appropriate discipline or guidance to the parties involved. As we run into the end of the year, Gary has issued a 30 Day Challenge: He would like to see no reportable incidences for the next 30 days. Let's not disappoint Gary and our fellow members.
