JANUARY ATTENDANCE WINNERS

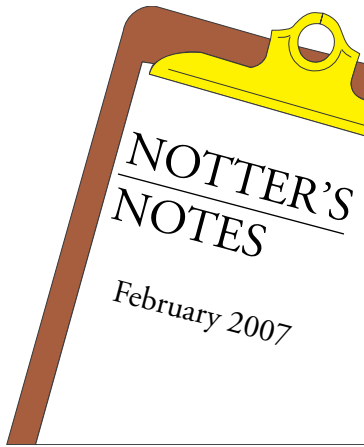

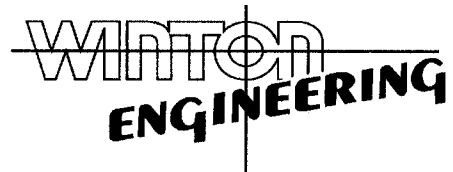

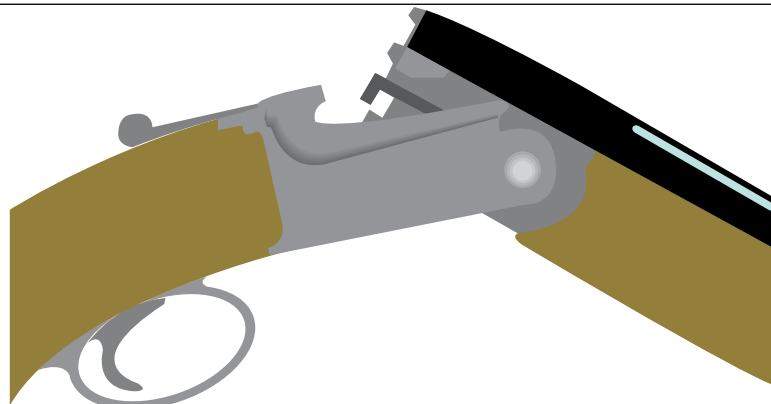
