Work Party (2/18/2018)

There are many tasks that need to be done. Some jobs require a strong back and a weak mind and others do not. We will remove the broken clays from the Trap range as well as cleaning of the Pistol and Rifle ranges. If you want to learn how to properly grow and maintain roses, there will be free training and lots of practice. After lunch there is always a great no-cost raffle with great prizes for evervone.

NRA Basic Rifle Course (2/17/2018)

The course sessions cover safety, rifle components, the different types of actions with instructions on loading/operating/unloading for each, ammunition components and types, the firing sequence, the different types of sights/optics and related topics. The students also learn the fundamentals of taking a shot, determining eye dominance, the mental preparation of items to check when making a shot, the different shooting positions and variations within each. Also covered are legal concerns involving the proper handling, use, storage and transportation of firearms. Information on selecting a firearm, the various NRA shooting venues and advanced rating criteria, and proper cleaning equipment and procedures are covered. Additional topics include muzzleloader rifles, air rifles, and using shotguns as a rifle.

A live-fire exercise is performed near the end of the course. All

students will demonstrate that they can fire groups. The exercise is slow fire, using single-round loads from the bench rest position. Students are encouraged to bring their own rifle and ammo. 50 rounds of ammunition are adequate for the live fire exercise and practice. Let the instructor know if you do not have the items so they can be made available.

Upon completion of the course, students will be awarded the NRA

Basic Completion Certificate.

To register for a course, register through the NRA training website link or the link on www.escondidofishandgame.com under Training -> NRA Basic Rifle Shooting Course.

✓ NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (3/3/2018) Although ammo has plentifully come back to the market there are California restrictions (Prop. 63) that have been generated to hinder such purchases both in-store and online. The opportunity to learn reloading techniques that will allow you to produce timely, consistent, accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available on March 3rd, 2018. The First Part is strictly academic in structure and conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session (8:00 AM 3/3/2018) will last until approximately 12 noon. The Second Part is a "Hands On" reloading bench experience. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your personal reloads. Scheduling the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session. **The cost is two tiered:** EF&GA members = \$100; nonmembers = \$110. For those individuals beginning and are without any reloading supplies (empty cases, powder, primers, etc.) a \$10 surcharge will be applied. Prior registration and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this class. Registration is necessary and limited. For more information, contact Elvio Marchi at elvio1@cox.net or 760-734-3942

Top Gun Contest Announcement: April 22nd is the scheduled date for the 2017 Top Gun Contest. If you won an Open or Primitive rifle contest in 2017, you are qualified to enter. Start time is 07:00 sharp. The Top Gun contest will be immediately followed by the normal pistol and (long range, 100yd to 150yd), rifle contest. Next Contest: February 25th. This will be a normal pistol and (short range 50yd to 100yd), rifle contest. Last Contest: Dec 24th, Christmas Eve. Clean Your &%\$(# Black Powder Firearm

One of the biggest problems we deal with on contest days is black powder firearms that don't go bang when you pull the trigger. Much of this can be directly attributed to improper cleaning and maintenance, both before and after the contest. I know many of you will plink with a 22 or an AR, then go home and park it in your gun safe for a couple of days before cleaning it. That kind of treatment is a guarantee for failure in a black powder rifle. Every time you fire a black powder firearm you are adding a layer of carbon and burned black powder by-products in the barrel and action of your firearm. This layer builds continuously until it blocks the flash hole or nipple channel in your rifle. It can also build up to the point where it can become impossible to hammer a ball down the barrel for the next shot. When this material "sets" it becomes like concrete. To make matters worse, burned black powder residue contains sulfur acids that can, and will, attack the metal of your bore causing RUST. This chemical reaction will start eating your bore almost immediately after firing. It needs to be neutralized as soon as possible after you're done shooting for the day. There are a variety of black powder cleaning solvents on the market, all of which work to a greater or lesser degree. These can get you through a contest or casual shoot, but at best they only clean the bore and do not address the flash channel or nipple holes. Some, not all, of the commercial products designed to remove black powder residue, also contain chemicals that, (if left in long term contact with your barrel), can also promote rust. Cleaning agents are not preservatives or rust inhibitors.

How to Clean your hook breach, (Hawken), rifle. Get a regular bucket and fill it with HOT water. Add about a teaspoon of your favorite dish detergent. Remove your barrel from the rifle and submerge the breech end in the HOT water. (Leave the nipple on for now if it is a percussion rifle). Using water wetted patches, swab the barrel repeatedly, replacing patches as needed. Use a caliber correct bronze or nylon bore brush and swab some more. Fill the bore with hot soapy water and force water out the flash hole or nipple. Your cleaning patches should be coming out clean and the water in the bucket should be black. Repeat all of the above with a bucket of clean HOT water without the soap. When done drain the barrel and run dry patches down the bore to remove any water residue. I like to swab the bore with WD-40 at this point and then swab out with more dry patches. Now you can inject your favorite oil or preservative into the nipple channel, flash hole and bore. Before you shoot again, remember to dry patch out the barrel before loading your first shot of the day. It also helps to fire a couple of percussion caps down range before you load. This should blow out any oil accumulation in the nipple or flash hole. Now your rifle should be more consistent and you can spend time shooting instead of trying to fix the rifle that won't shoot.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to <u>newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com</u> and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
