Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (3/16/2019)

Now is a great time for beginning to acquire the skills and knowledge to load your own ammunition and not be limited to market and political vagaries. Although ammunition has plentifully come back to the market there are California restrictions (Prop. 63) that have been generated to hinder such purchases both in-store and on-line. The opportunity to learn reloading techniques that will allow you to produce timely, consistent and accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available at EF&GA.

The First Part is strictly academic in structure and conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session will be held at 8AM on Saturday, March 16th, 2019 and will last until approximately 12 noon. The Second Part is a "Hands On" reloading bench experience. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your own personal reloads. The scheduling of the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be arranged at the first session during the classroom session.

The cost is two tiered: EF&GA members = \$100; non-members = \$110. For those individuals without any reloading supplies (empty cases, powder, primers, etc.) a \$10 surcharge will be applied and materials will be provided. Prior registration and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this class. Registration is necessary and limited. For more information,

To commemorate and preserve the personal wartime and military experiences of US veterans for history, the Folklife Center of the Library of Congress has created the Veteran's History Project. This project is maintained and funded by the Library of Congress under Public Law 106-308 and is administered locally by the Veterans Museum in Balboa Park. The goal of the project is to provide a video record of the activities of US veterans on behalf of our country. The video record is produced at no cost to the veteran and maintained in a publicly available repository by the US Government. All video tapes are filed with the Library of Congress. A copy of the video tape is provided to the Veterans Museum in Balboa Park and a copy is provided to the Veteran.

The program is available to all veterans of any US war or conflict, and is also available to civilians who have been engaged in activities that support the US military. Personal wartime engagement is not a prerequisite to participate in this project. A veteran's recollections and experiences will be recorded by a professional videographer and a copy provided to the participant for personal use. A second copy will be filed with the Veterans Museum in San Diego, CA and a third copy will be filed with the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C. for later generations to view. The process is completed at no cost to the veteran and requires a time investment of approximately one and a half hours.

Mr. Smith - a World War II veteran - will provide appropriate release paperwork and schedule an appointment for video taping at your convenience. The interviews are conducted in a comfortable, living room atmosphere. For candidates with travel difficulties, arrangements for an in-residence interview may be made.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

am happy to report that there have been no reported incidents of members or guests having any issues with any new holiday firearms. Maybe they actually read the manual!

I would like to continue from last month with Range Safety Rules to refresh everyone's awareness.

General Range Safety Rules

// 1

- 1. Always keep firearms pointed in a safe direction.
- 2. Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot (sights on-target).
- 3. Always keep your gun unloaded until you are at the firing line and the range is declared "HOT." Firearms must be safe (unloaded) when entering or exiting the range.
- 4. Cease Firing: Immediately stop shooting when anyone calls "Cease Fire!"
- 5. COLD Range: Shooters must check with others to ensure firearms are unloaded, actions open and firearms laid down on the shooting bench before going down range. No one is permitted to handle firearms or stand at the firing line while there is a cold range.
- 6. HOT Range: Shooters must check with others to ensure there is no one down range; when the range is declared "HOT" shooters are permitted to commence firing. Shooters may move safe guns to and from the firing line only when the range is "HOT."
- 7. All shooters are responsible for their rounds staying within the confines of this range and impacting the bank. Shooters may shoot only from the firing line at the target in line with their position. Shooting at items placed on the ground or at targets not posted at the appropriate height on the target frame enables rounds to escape the range or not impact the bank.
- 8. Respect the Range: Please place your trash into the trash receptacles and your spent brass into the recycling receptacles. Tracer, armor piercing and incendiary ammunition is prohibited.
- 9. Respect Yourself: Wear eye and ear protection. You should also wash your hands and face after shooting to reduce lead exposure.
- 10. Respect Others: Be aware of other shooters, you are not the only one on the range.

With all the rain that we have had the hillside is now full of nice green grass, please keep your eyes open for Deer and Turkeys on the range and camping area. Remember we are a game preserve and there is no game hunting, but you may shoot as many *pictures* as you want.

If you see wild life on the range or hillside do not hesitate to call the firing line COLD until they move on. Also it is not OK to shoot around the deer on the hillside to scare them off... Also, Also it is not OK to run up the hillside to scare off the deer, especially if other ranges are HOT...

Members Only are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:**

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

As I write this, the Black Diamond Silver Challenge, (revolver contest), has ended. To no one's surprise, it was won by Ilwanda Hannah. Named the First Lady of Black Powder by Ray Bucholz, Wanda attended the January club meeting to receive her prizes. Wanda won a NIB Traditions Silver Remington Cap and Ball revolver, as well as a Black Diamond Buffalo Beer Stein. Wanda scored 53 out of 108 possible points over six months to end up in first place. The next nearest competitor was 23 points behind her. Scores for the top five are listed below. Good shooting Wanda.

New Contest Announcement: Starting in January we are going to run a Black Diamond Six Month Rifle Challenge, in conjunction with our normal rifle contests. There are two parts to this competition.

1. Trophies: Trophies will be awarded for first, second, and third place based on your total cumulative score over six months. Classifications of OPEN and PRIMITIVE will be combined for this cumulative event. BPCR's will not be eligible.

2. Rifle Prize: EVERYONE who enters ANY rifle category, (in cluding BPCR), will earn one ticket per entry, at each contest... At the end of the contest in June, all of the tickets earned will be placed in a hopper. One winner will be chosen by a blind drawing. The prize will be a Muzzle Loading Rifle sponsored by Ray Bucholz.

If you enter six contests you earn six tickets, three contests, three tickets, etc. The more you play, the better chance you have to win. I will describe this in detail at the next contest.

Where to Find Stuff Announcements: Joann's fabric on East Valley Pkwy in Escondido has a limited supply of .18 and .22 pillow ticking, (patch material), back in stock. Wal-Mart East in Escondido also has a small supply of .15 and .18. Take your micrometer and check it to be sure it is what you want. Cutting your own patches is cheaper than buying pre-cut patches.

Harbor Freight carries Pittsburgh Digital Micrometers for measuring patch thickness or ball diameter. They are available in mechanical or electronic versions. I consider this an essential tool for Muzzleloaders. <u>https://www.harborfreight.com/digital-micrometer-63647.html</u> Track of the Wolf has a (very) limited supply of Green Mountain 1-66 twist drop-in percussion barrel replacements for Thompson Center Hawken rifles. Check the web page and look closely for the "in stock" or "back order" notifications. There are NO back orders. When they are gone, they are gone. Using a Green Mountain barrel on a TC Hawken is almost like cheating.

Truth or Fiction? The story I got was that Track made a special run order from Green Mountain for 1-66 twist barrels, instead of the standard Green Mountain twist of 1-70. Green Mountain still makes muzzleloading barrels, but stopped making TC drop in barrels a while back. I shoot Green Mountain barrels on my rifles and think they are very good. I ordered one of these from Track and will be testing it before the February contest. Contrary to popular belief, muzzle loading barrels don't last forever. I have retired the first Green Mountain barrel I ever bought after 35 years and approximately 10k rounds downrange. It's just plain shot out.

Single Shot Muzzle Loading Pistol Short Course starts at 8:00 AM.
