In February, we celebrate Valentine's Day and we are all reminded to appreciate our significant others. People who know me well understand that I absolutely cherish my beautiful wife and to this day I am still smitten. I frequently tell her that she is 'just right for me' and I mean it every time that I say it. She understands my quirks and puts up with my time at the Range. I appreciate her passions and appreciate her commitments to her friends, charities, and shoes.

I also want to make a point to thank **Ray Bucholz** for making sure that I have roses handy to give her for no particular reason. She really appreciates it and I like having the feature at the Range because it sets us apart from other average ranges.

Decisions

We are very fortunate to have a facility with some beautiful ranges and lots of infrastructure to support them as well as facilities to support events like meetings, classes, barbecues, and other fun stuff. We are constantly investing in improvements to make the facilities better. Last year, the MOAPL (Mother Of All Project Lists) combined lead recycling with improvements to the Pistol, Trap, and 100-Yard ranges. Before that we replaced and expanded the badge system to include not only the gate, but also the Meeting Hall, Trap Ramada, Shed, and Storage Lockers as well as adding an alarm system. A few years before that, we replaced the kitchen, roof, and doors of the Meeting Hall. Before that, we replaced the Trap Ramada with a new structure. This goes on and on and it is part of our legacy.

Looking forward, we have two more major improvements to consider. The 100-Yard Ramada and the Meeting Hall. Both are old structures in need of some serious investment and improvements. Right now, we are focusing on the 100-Yard Ramada. We want to add four more shooting positions (15 feet) and modernize the structure so that it fits in with the quality of the rest of the structures around the Range.

The Board of Directors has been researching this project for a few years now and we have had many interruptions along the way preventing the launch of the project. Between the pandemic, materials shortages, and contractor issues, just getting accurate estimates has become very difficult. Now that the excuses are out of the way, we need to get down to brass tacks and get this rolling.

In the bylaws (Section 13) it states that any Range Improvement Fund project over \$50,000 requires a vote of the EF&GA Membership to approve the expenditure. Personally, I like this because it should not be easy for the Board of Directors to just spend the Association's money. We are not government so we should not be able to spend without restrictions. This is a critical key to the financial stability of the Association.

If you are a voting member of the Association (Youth over 18, Standard, Senior or Life Members), you will soon be receiving a ballot in the mail with a return envelope. Please mark the ballot as you see fit and mail it back using the enclosed return envelope. You will need to put appropriate postage on the envelope to get your ballot back to us to be counted.

Your vote is very important to the stability, longevity, and future of the Association so please do not underestimate its value.

As-issued Military Rifle Match News

Japanese Arisaka Rifles

Rifles and cartridges used by the participants in the January match were: US M1, .30-06; Czech vz.24, 7.92x57mm (8mm) Mauser; Japanese Arisaka Model 38, 6.5x50mm; and British Lee-Enfield No. 4 Mk I, .303 British.

The topic of historical discussion this month was the Japanese Arisaka rifles, presented by Alex Luz-Olson. The Arisakas replaced the out-dated Murata rifle, with the first model being the Type 30 designed by Colonel Arisaka and adopted in 1897. The Type 30 was not liked by the Japanese military, citing jamming, a porous action, weak extraction and breakages, and complicated bolt disassembly. The improved Type 38 Arisaka was the product of Major Nambu, the "John Browning of Japan". Nambu was obsessed with simplifying and sealing the rifle due to the conditions in which Japan expected to fight. His five tenets of rifle design were: simplicity, minimal parts required, ruggedness, reliability, and handsomeness. Nambu had his plans finalized in 1905, the 38th year of the Japanese current period, hence its designation.

Original Type 38 long-rifles have 31.25" barrels, carbines have a 19.6" barrel, and cavalry carbines have a 19" barrel. The Types 30 and 38 fire the semi-rimmed 6.5x50mmSR cartridge ("6.5 Japanese") with a 140 gr spitzer bullet at 2500 fps. The Japanese sniper program began in 1937 using primarily factory-selected Type 38s which then became Type 97s using a 2.5x power scope on an integral mount. Scopes were zeroed and matched to each rifle.

In 1939 the Type 99 rifle was introduced to fire a more powerful rimless 7.7x58mm round ("7.7 Japanese") with a 178 gr spitzer bullet at 2450 fps. It has a 25.9" barrel and the original models have folding monopods (or the mounting plate for such) mounted under the barrel halfway between the muzzle and trigger-guard. An unusual feature of the Type 99 is the folding anti-aircraft rear sight "wings", used to determine the speed of the targeted aircraft.

The Types 30, 38, and 99 all have a Mauser design at their hearts, and this is reflected in their shape. The entire action is designed around user safety, preventing gas or bolt from injuring the soldier. They have holes drilled into the top of the action for gas release in case of faulty ammunition: two smaller holes for the Types 30 and 38, and a single larger hole for the Type 99. The safety knob is large and visible at the rear of the bolt, and has a visual indicator for the user to know if the safety is on or off. The safety only works with the bolt closed and the hammer cocked. It is only usable with a potentially "loaded and ready" rifle because the safety spring is also the main spring. The safety knob also acts as a redundant user-

safety gas shield. All have two-piece buttstocks due to wood quality concerns. The dust cover is a removable piece that does its job effectively.

Overall, ~3.5 million Type 38s were manufactured over a 40 year period, with another ~3.5 million Type 99s in just 6 years during WW2. Late-war "last ditch" production of 99s took many shortcuts and they were more crudely made. The receivers of all Arisakas were stamped with the Imperial Seal of Japan, also called the "Imperial Chrysanthemum". Most G.I. "bring back" rifles still bear this marking, whereas it was ground off of rifles that went through the official process during the defeat of Japan.

THE SOCIETY OF PRIMITIVE AMERICAN RIFLEMEN

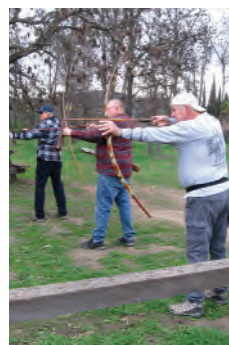


What is SPAR? The Society of Primitive American Riflemen is a collective of individuals dedicated to the preservation of a proud heritage formed during America's frontier period, that of the American rifleman. We were founded, in thought and original conception during 2009, but adopted a constitution (our Code) in 2010. The best way to describe our members is to say that we are active historians. We study the early frontiersmen of the period prior to 1850, and then try to emulate that lifestyle during our activities. We don't consider ourselves "reenactors" as such, because we aren't trying to portray people of the past and we are not acting for the benefit of those who might observe us. By living the lifestyle, even briefly, we reach a better understanding of it for ourselves.

What activities are involved? We host 4 seasonal camp gatherings where we do "hands-on" research into the life style of America's longhunters, mountain men and pioneers. We also sponsor several target competitions, categorical qualifying sessions and annual SPAR championship trophy events. Our Code lists 4 priorities:

1. Shooting Events
2. Historical awareness
3. Primitive lifestyle experiences
4. Trek and exploration opportunities

At the January camp, we held a primitive archery competition and a hawk and knife throw competition.



What do we do at these camps? The best answer to that is – we learn. We have organized classes on various skills, often followed by an opportunity for practice. We usually wind up in some type of discussion that provides exposure to an historical element or some aspect of the muzzleloading lifestyle. Some of the skills classes are flint and steel firemaking, flint knapping, knife sharpening, finding and utilizing natural food sources, orienteering and compass navigation, tanning a deer hide and many more.

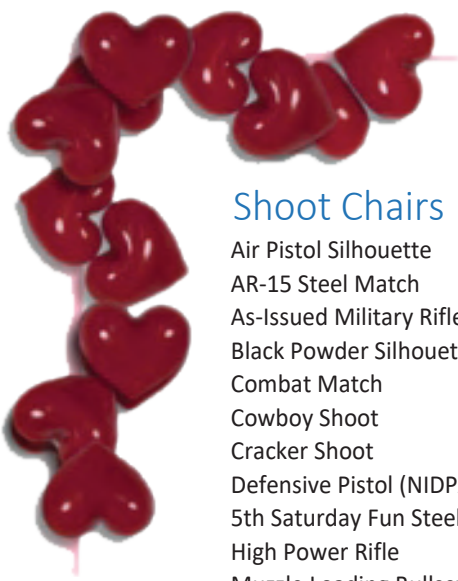

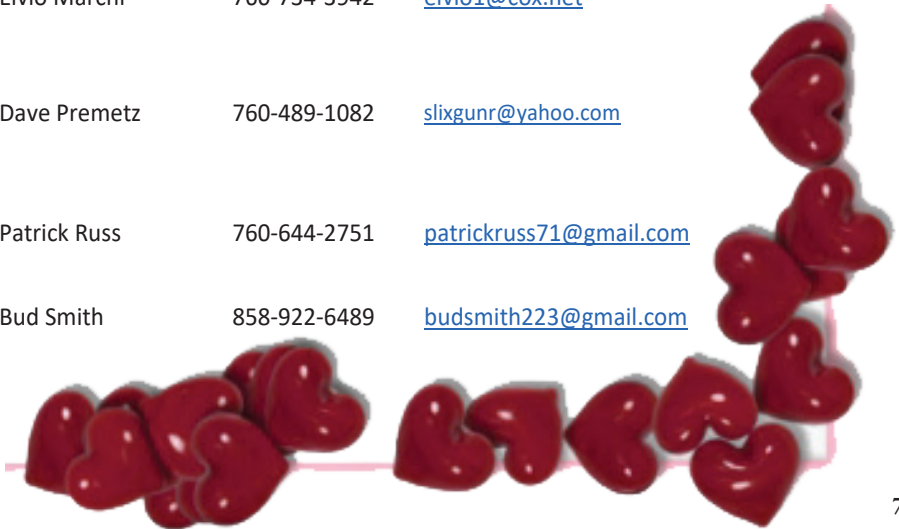

When you arrive at one of the ranges, the first thing you should do is sign the Green Sheet. After doing so check to see if the Blue Blinking Lights (if applicable) are on or off. If the Blue Blinking Lights are on please do not unload your firearms from your vehicle as the range is cold. Only unload your firearms from your vehicle when the Blue Blinking Lights are off. When uncasing your firearms please uncase them on the firing line not on the seating benches or tables behind the firing line. If this applies to sanctioned events, please follow the same procedure.

Please make sure you take your firearms home with you. Last month there was a rifle that was left behind. It was claimed a few days later.

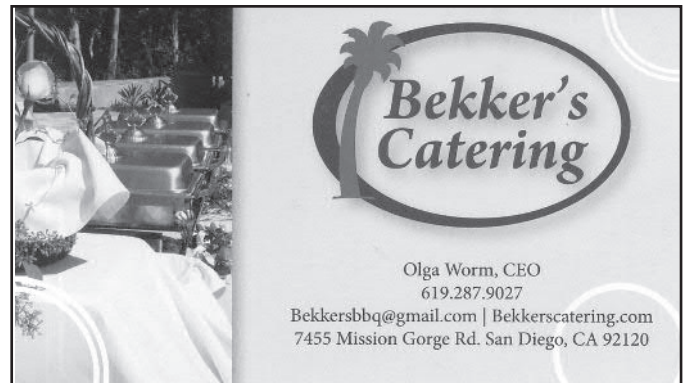

RSO OBSERVATIONS

Fellow EF&GA members, RSO Steve Baran here asking for your assistance. For those shooting pistol, a reminder that the green frames are ONLY for 5,7, and 10 yards. This is to ensure the rounds go where we want them into the hillside and not tearing up or possibly deflecting off the berms.

Please take note of the target below (left). This is NOT acceptable. On the green frames it is to be one 12" by 12" target centered in the backer board. While the center target is acceptable, the four orange dots are not. Please note that we have plenty of placards that state this both on the pillars and the benches.



The target in the left column (right) was on the 100 yard range. The rules are that only slugs may be used on the 100 yard and 150 yard ranges.

Please assist us in maintaining a safe and well maintained club. These targets take quite a beating with normal wear and tear. We are doing our best to keep them maintained and ask that you do your part as well. Please remember to pull down your targets and take them home with you for disposal. We are still finding quite a few in the trash. We don't need additional oversight from any agencies that have either instructed us or asked for our cooperation.

I look forward to seeing you at the range and enjoying our great facility!
