Bow Hunter Education Class

2/11/2023 & 6/10/2023 (7:00 am – 3 pm)

Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills, and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 3/4/2023, 5/6/2023, 7/1/2023 (8 am – 12 noon)

It seems as if the ammo drought is starting to decrease slowly. Even so, it is still on a limited scale. Need or want ammo but can't find any? You're left with the old American skill; self-sufficiency and creativity...MAKE YOUR OWN!

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed to time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (ie: cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$15 surcharge.

RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello everyone,
You may have noticed that you often see the same points discussed in this column. That's because the same mistakes continue to happen. It's reasonable to assume that those of you who read the newsletter are probably not the ones making the mistakes. You can help, though, by reminding others when you see something. We're all responsible for the safety of our range.

Unbagging Your Firearms:

When you arrive at the Pistol Range and it is safe to unload your firearms and gear, do not unload and handle your firearms on the seating benches or the tables in the middle. Bring your firearms up to the shooting bench and unbag them on the shooting bench with the muzzle pointing downrange.

Don't Leave Firearms Unattended:

NEVER leave firearms unattended. If you need to leave a particular range for any reason (ie: bathroom), make sure your firearms are locked and put away. You are responsible for keeping your firearms out of the hands of unauthorized people.

Drawing From Holster:

Drawing from a holster is not permitted for Casual Shooting. Drawing from a holster is only allowed at Sanctioned Events. Sanctioned Events are specific organized events like the Combat Shoot, Sheepdog Academy and certain authorized training classes. These events have been authorized by the Board of Directors after an extensive vetting process. Safety is our primary concern.

Rapid Fire:

Rapid Firing is also not permitted for Casual Shooting. Rapid firing is only allowed at Sanctioned Events. Again, safety is our concern.

Responsible For Your Guests:

Members bringing guests to the range need to have their guest(s) with them at all times except for when using the restrooms. You are responsible for your guests. Make sure they know the rules.

The Green Sheets:

Sign the Green Sheets as soon as you arrive at the range, before you unload your equipment. Make sure the "Date" and "Range" information is filled in. There are Green Sheets being turned in with no "Date" and "Range" information filled in.

Target Clean Up:

When you are finished shooting, please remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. This is just common courtesy toward your fellow members. Also, because of current hazmat rules, we can not dispose of used targets here at the range. Please take your used targets home with you. You can dispose of them there.

Do You Have Everything You Brought With You?

Before you leave the range, double check that you have everything you brought with you.

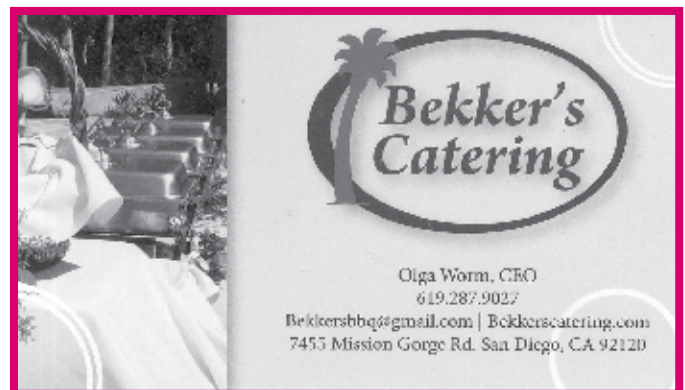
- Blue Blinking Lights **ON**



Trap Shooting in Wet Weather

4. **Know** your target and the surroundings



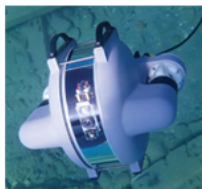
