Darrin's Dissertation

100 Yard Range Upgrade

Now that the original project is complete, we wanted to add a sunshade to the target-facing side of the structure. Especially in the winter months, when the sun is low in the sky, a sunshade will make shooting easier and more comfortable. **Dave Robertson** came up with an ingenious design to bolt the shade structure to the existing truss bolts of the main canopy. This requires no additional drilling of holes in the structure that would compromise the warranty. After building the prototype, the response from the Membership was all positive. The Board voted to use the design with minor changes and continue it the length of the structure. At the General Membership Meeting on January 11th, we asked for volunteers to clean and prepare the steel for welding (remove rust and oil from the material). A few people agreed to take it on and get it done. **Dave Robertson** is continuing with the engineering, machining, welding, and assembly of the project. Kudos to all who volunteered to make the project excellent for a reasonable cost.

Kitchen Improvements

The propane stove in the kitchen has been problematic for quite some time now. We don't use it very often, but when we need it, we really need it to work. Junior Rifle, Women on Target, and other events service a bunch of people that we need to feed, and the old range appliance was not reliable. The Board voted to replace it with a newer model and to include a new vent hood above it. This sent me down the rabbit hole. I had to get a new range for the Range. After some shopping around, I found a range of ranges to choose from for the Range. Then, I had to arrange the range of ranges for the Range and categorize them by cost, quality, and availability. At the time of this writing, the hood has been purchased and the range for the Range has been ordered and delivery will soon be arranged. I want to publicly thank the Kitchen Committee for making my role in this whole process a lot easier — **Lucy Nelson, Linda Linaker,** and **Tracie Sheldon.**



Class Description:

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. 

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 3/1/2024 (8 am – 12 noon)

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1St session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands-On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (e.g., cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$15 surcharge.

Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this limited class.

Bow Hunter Education Class 3/9/2024 (7:00 am – 3 pm)

Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic

first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

NRA Basic Shotgun Class 3/10/2024 (8 am – 4 pm)

Class Description:

This class covers firearm safety and basic skills of Shotgunning. It is also designed to train the student with the proper skills required to hit a moving target. The NRA Certified Shotgun Course teaches stance, gun ready position, swing to target, trigger pull and follow through. The class consists of classroom exercises and hands-on instruction including live fire exercise through which students will learn and demonstrate safe and proper shotgun shooting procedures and technique. Hands-on range time will include techniques required for shooting moving targets (Trap). Upon successful class completion students will receive the NRA Basic Shotgun Certificate. Classes are limited to 12 students and a deposit is required to secure registration.

Speak Softly and Carry a Big Stick

We Are All RSOs

We are all responsible for the safety of our range. To that end, it is incumbent on us to help other members remember their commitment to the Range Rules. It is never comfortable to have to remind someone of a discretion, but it is sometimes necessary. Approach the situation with respect and hope that the other party does the same. Unfortunately, that doesn't always happen. Recently, there seems to be an increase of push-back against rule enforcement. It is never acceptable to dismiss an RSO or another member acting in good faith. "Yeh, Yeh, Yeh" is not a proper response. A response like that suggests that you KNOW you are in violation and you don't care. Remember that members can and have been suspended, even expelled, for flagrant violations. Don't be one of them.

Frequent Transgressions

Frequent transgressions include: rapid fire, fiddling with firearms when the range is cold, casing and uncasing firearms anywhere except at the firing line.

Rapid fire is not permitted during casual shooting. It is reserved for sanctioned events where every shooter is closely monitored by an RSO.

Range is Cold (Blue lights ON) requires everyone on the range to be behind the yellow line and NOT handling firearms unless they are going down range. Imagine if you are down range and you look back and see someone fiddling with their firearm.

Case and uncase your firearms at the firing line only. No one should be walking around behind the yellow line with a firearm.

A full set of rules is available at the kiosk for each range.

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- DO NOT Handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep Up Brass Behind the Yellow and In Front of the Red Line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red Line Only

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

The RSO On Duty Is ALWAYS Right, Even If He Is Wrong!

Perhaps that sounds inconsistent. The point is, there should be no arguing at the firing line. If you are convinced that the RSO was incorrect, you can both present your case to the Board of Directors for a final determination.

First Aid

We have begun to take inventory of the First Aid Kits on the range with an eye toward restocking and updating them. We will be purchasing some "serious injury" kits and begin offering First Aid Training for our RSOs. Stay tuned to the Rangemaster Sound-Off page for more details.



Sunset LaRue and Double Diamond.


