### 100 yard High Power Rifle Shoot





The course layout was set up for "Stupid Super Short Range" for pistol. Targets were placed at 15, 25, and 35 yards. 

# THE CLASS IS BACK! NRA METALLIC CARTRIDGE RELOADING COURSE

2/5/2022, 3/5/2022, 5/7/2022, 7/2/2022 (1st Session 8 am - Noon)

#### **Class Description:**

Did anyone expect this ammo shortage to last this long and affect us so seriously? Need or want ammo but can't find any? You're left with an old American skill; self-sufficiency and creativity...Make your own!

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

#### The class is structured in two sessions:

**1st session** – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall.

**2nd session** –This is "Hands On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed to time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$10 surcharge. Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this limited class.



### **As-issued Military Rifle Match News**

Rifles and cartridges used by the participants in the November match were: US M1903-A3, .30-06; Japanese Arisaka Model 38, 6.5x50mm; British Lee-Enfield No. 4 Mk I, .303 British; and US M1 Carbine, .30 Carbine.

The topic of historical discussion this month was the Russian Model 1891/30, presented by Mark Dambkowski. The Model 91/30 was an updated and improved version of the Model 1891 and was the main battle rifle used by the Soviets in WWII, or the "Great Patriotic War" as they called it. The M1891 was adopted by tsarist Russia as their first "modern" infantry rifle utilizing a smokeless powder cartridge in 7.62mm (.30 cal), or "3-line caliber" as they referred to it in the measurement system in use in Russia at the time, where one line equaled 1/10 of an inch. It was first used in combat in the Russo-Japanese War (1904-1905), in which it proved to be sturdy and reliable.

The Models 1891 and 1891/30 are commonly referred to in the West as the "Mosin-Nagant" rifle. Sergei Ivanovich Mosin was a Russian small arms factory director and army captain. Leon Nagant was a Belgian weapons designer. Both submitted rifle designs to the commision that was responsible for selecting a repeating rifle that would keep Russia at least even with the rest of Europe and Asia. The design ultimately decided upon was a blend of the two submissions: Mosin's rifle with Nagant's feed system.

Production of the two models, plus various sub-models and foreign variants spanned from 1892 to the 1960's. The Mosin-Nagant is one of the most mass-produced military bolt-action rifles in history, with over 37 million of them having been made. During WWII alone, the Soviets made more than 20 million of them. The basic design has been manufactured in Russia, China, Poland, Hungary, France, Finland, Czech Republic, Romania, and the USA! (Russia could not produce them fast enough during WWI, so contracts were let to Remington Arms and New England Westinghouse, which came to a grinding and financially-damaging halt by the 1917 October Revolution.) As such, and despite millions of them being lost on the battlefields of two wars, it may be the most commonly owned milsurplus rifle in civilian hands, not that long ago being sold in retail sporting goods stores for well under \$100.

The Models 1891 and 91/30 fire the 7.62x54R cartridge, where the "R" stands for "rimmed", not "Russian". Originally using a 210 grain round-nosed bullet, it was updated in 1908 to use a 148 grain silver-tip "light" spitzer bullet, much like how the US .30-03 was updated to the

.30-06. The 7.62x54R is used in numerous other small arms and machine guns even today, and is the second-oldest cartridge still in regular combat service, being only two years younger than the .303 British. Performance-wise, it is quite similar to the 7.62x51 NATO M80 round. There is also a 174 grain yellow-tip "heavy" version, akin to the NATO 175 grain M118. Your shoulder will certainly know the difference between a silver-tip and a yellow-tip!


