NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 1/7/2023, 3/4/2023 & 5/6/2023 (8 am – 12 noon)

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8 am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed to time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (ie: cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$15 surcharge.

Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this limited class.

Class Description:

This class covers firearm safety and basic skills of Shotgunning. It is also designed to train the student with the proper skills required to hit a moving target. The NRA Certified Shotgun Course teaches stance, gun ready position, swing to target, trigger pull and follow through. Class Description:

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills, and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

Defensive Pistol / Home Firearm Safety / Personal Protection Inside & Outside the Home San Diego County CCW



Entering and Exiting the Front Gate at the Range:

Hopefully, when you arrive at the front gate to the range you have your Range ID Badge so you can swipe your Range ID Badge and enter the range. After entering the front gate pull forward to the stop sign located on your right hand side. Wait for the gate to close before proceeding on. If someone comes in behind you, make sure they show you their badge. The speed limit on the range is 5 miles per hour which is a dustless speed. When exiting the range pull forward past the gate and up to the road, stop and wait for the gate to close.

Responsible for Your Guests:

Members bringing guests need to have the guests with them at all times except for when using the restrooms. You are responsible for your guests. You must make sure they understand the rules.

Safety Down Range:

Be aware of the activity on other ranges. If you are far down range on any of the shooting ranges, you could be in the line of fire from the other ranges. Always coordinate "Cold Range" protocols with shooters on the other ranges if you must go far down range.

The Green Sheets:

There are Green Sheets being turned in without "Date" and "Range" information. When you sign the Green Sheet make sure the "Date" and "Range" are filled in. Sign the Green Sheets as soon as you arrive at the range, before you unload your equipment.

Target Clean Up:

When you are finished shooting, please remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. Take your used targets home with you. Current Hazmat rules do not allow us to put them in the trash cans at the range.

Lost and Found is Growing:

As you leave the range, look around and make sure that you are taking everything home that you brought with you.

Cowboy Action Shooting Orientation Day January 28, 2023

We have scheduled a new shooter's orientation for anyone interested in shooting Cowboy Action Shooting (SASS). The orientation will be held at the 150 yard range and begins at 8 am. We can accept up to 20 shooters. The cost will be \$10/person.

What is **SASS**? The **Single Action Shooting Society** is an international membership formed in 1987 to preserve and promote the sport of cowboy action shooting. SASS serves as the governing body ensuring safety and consistency in the sport. SASS members share a common interest in preserving the history of the old west and competitive shooting in a safe, fun, family friendly environment.

You do not need all of the required equipment for this orientation. If you already have SASS approved firearms, ammo, leather, etc., please bring them. We will have an assortment of pistols, rifles, shotguns, and ammunition commonly used in SASS.



This orientation will prepare the new shooter to be able to successfully shoot a SASS match at any of over 350 national locations as well as 14 other countries. Japanese Arisaka Rifles

The topic of historical discussion this month was winter-useability features or adapters for various military service rifles. This was spurred by someone sending me a link to a video showing the M1 Garand Winter Trigger <u>https://tinyurl.com/p55zjmja</u>. This is a bell-crank device that pivoted in a hole in the rear of the trigger guard and put the shooter's point of contact under the pistol grip rather than inside the trigger guard. This was developed during the Korean War when American forces encountered frigid conditions but at least were issued cold-weather clothing, unlike in WWII. (The M1 trigger guard is not big enough to accommodate a heavily gloved finger.) Astute observers will quickly realize that the rifle now has a completely unguarded trigger, and being a semiautomatic, things could get interesting really fast! Since the safety on the M1 is at the front of the trigger guard and requires the shooter to insert his finger into the guard to push it forward to the "FIRE" position, it's difficult to see how this "winter trigger" had any practical application. The CMP considers them an "interesting historical novelty but HIGHLY DANGEROUS".

Other colder climate countries had implemented features much earlier on their service rifles that facilitated operation with gloved hands. Swiss rifles, from the 1889 Schmidt-Rubin to the K31, employed a large ring pull-and-twist safety. The Japanese Arisaka Type 30 used a similar, but hook version. Later Arisaka Type 38s and 99s have large knurled push-on/pull-off safety knobs designed after soldiers complained that in the autumn and winter conditions in Eastern Russia in the Russo-Japanese War (1904-05) the Type 30 safeties were too difficult to operate with gloves. Russian Mosin-Nagant M1891 and derivatives employ a similar knurled safety knob but must be turned 90° like the K31. They also have a trigger guard with a generous amount of space for a gloved finger and controls that are easy to operate with gloved hands, as does the SKS carbine (1945). Examples of these rifles were on hand for match participants to see and compare the different approaches, but since the day was warm and sunny no one did any testing in cold-weather gear!
