Happy New Year

The new year is upon us and we can start fresh with a list of resolutions and expectations. For many reasons I anticipate 2025 to be much better than 2024. I plan to spend more time with family and friends and less time at work.

December General Membership Meeting

Back in 2023 we tore down and replaced the old shade structure on the 100 Yard Range with a taller, wider, deeper, and structurally better new shade structure. This new structure added four additional shooting positions, room for a Spectator Zone (behind the blue line), modern electrical infrastructure, and lighting.

After walking around in the new structure one evening with some friends, **Jack Starlin** had an epiphany – We should hold the December General Membership meeting in the new space. **Patrick Russ** and I took the idea and ran with it. We hung tarps around the exterior of the structure and put three propane outdoor heaters inside along with lots of holiday lights strung from the trusses and an improvised P.A. System. The meeting was held with 30% more space than the Meeting Hall. It went well but we identified some items to improve. The space was cold, the P.A. only put sound to the East half of the space and the entrance to the space was where two tarps came together (like an old circus tent).

This year, we improved the tarp structures at the ends of the space. We extended the distance between the P.A. systems. We added a fourth propane space heater. While **Patrick Russ** and I were standing in Lowe's, we had the idea of adding a pre-hung door to better contain the heat in the space and improve the entrance. The one thing that made the whole process 1000% better was the fact that people stepped up and volunteered to help set it all up and make it work. After the meeting was finished, more members stepped up to help tear it all down neatly and properly. I will let Scotti describe the details of the meeting itself, but the setup and teardown were also spectacular in my opinion thanks to all who participated.

New Flag for the Meeting Hall

Elvio Marchi donated a flag to the Association that we will use for the Pledge of Allegiance at EF&GA meetings for the foreseeable future. When he approached me with the idea, I was surprised and honored that he was willing to part with this piece of history. It came with a certificate of authenticity that includes the following:

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class



RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello everyone. Welcome to the new year. As you review the range rules, you'll notice that most of them are geared toward either safety or courtesy for your fellow members. Let's start the new year off right focusing on those two concepts.

Safety

- 1. Do not handle or even unload firearms and gear from your car while the Blinking Blue Lights are on. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot. Make sure there is Date and Range information filled in on the sheet.
- 2. Rapid Fire and Holster Draw are not permitted during casual shooting. These activities are only allowed during sanctioned events when each shooter has a "One on One" RSO less than an arm's length away watching every move.
- 3. Pay attention to your guests. Make sure they know and follow all rules. You are responsible for them.

Courtesy

- 1. Do not shoot Birdshot or Buckshot shotgun shells on the 100 yard or 150 yard rifle ranges. It destroys the target frames and costs the members money to replace. You may shoot Slug shotgun shells only.
- 2. Remove your targets from the target backers and take them home with you. Do not put them in the trash on the range. Put your target frames back in the designated area.
- 3. Watch for wildlife on the range. We exist in a wildlife preserve. If we were to accidentally shoot an animal we risk being shut down.

For YOU

- 1. Look around for all your guns and gear before you leave. Last month we had a couple of incidences when the RSO found boxes of ammo left behind.





BLACK POWDER NEWS

by Garth Warner

January starts the reset for a new year of Black Powder Shooting. Whether you like knocking down steel or punching paper targets, we have something to offer you in 2025.

Many of you have told me that you have a Black Powder Gun that you have been meaning to shoot, but instead it has become a "Safe Queen". January is your opportunity to start at the beginning of the cycle for both steel and paper targets this year. This is where you start your journey to the "Dark Side" with Black Powder. The following is what we offer...

Muzzle Loading Bullseye: January 5th is our first ML rifle event of the year on the 150 range. It will be a **short range rifle** event. There will be two B-19 targets at 50 yards. Fire 13 round balls at each target. Your best 10 count for score. Participants shooting for score must use an original or replica rifle (flint or percussion), **firing patched round balls** with fixed open iron sights. (Adjustable open sights must be locked in place for the duration of the contest.) All contestants must use black powder or BP substitute (Pyrodex, 777, etc). All rounds are fired "Off Hand". Contestants can load from the bench. We do not use Black Powder Cartridge Rifles for this event. Subsequent events during the year will include long range rifle, short and long range pistol (flint or percussion, single shot pistol, firing patched round balls only) and Trade Gun (Smooth bore Flintlock with a bead front sight and no rear sight).

We also will schedule a Cross Stick and a Benchrest Contest during the year.

Entry for each contest is \$5 for EF&GA members and \$10 for non-members. There is a **Mandatory** safety briefing at 07:45 and the contest will start at 08:00. Check the newsletter each month for the upcoming months event category. This event runs pretty quickly so we can all go over and participate in **David Premetz's** Traditional Archery event which follows each Bullseye contest.

Muzzle Loading Silhouette: January 26th is our first ML Silhouette event on the 150 range. For this month we start with a "Super Short Course". Rifle targets are set at 25, 50 and 75 yards.

The course of fire requires 18 rounds for 3 relays of 3 targets. All shooting is "Off Hand". We start the morning with steel silhouette set-up starting at 06:30.

A Pistol course is shot at 15, 25, and 35 yards starting at 08:30. We shoot Percussion revolver or Single Shot Pistol **firing patched round balls**. Following Pistol we move the steel to set up for the rifle event of the day. Each month the steel gets moved out another 25 yards. January = Super Short 25-50-75 yards. February = Standard Short 50-75-100 yards. March = Mid-Range 75-100-125 yards. Finally April = Long Range 100-125-150 yards. In May the cycle repeats. Rifle starts at 10:00 and runs roughly 2 hours. You need 18 rounds to complete the course. Rifle is fired in four categories as follows. All equipment must use Black Powder or BP substitute (Prodex, 777, etc).

Open Rifle: Any original or replica muzzle loading rifle (flint or percussion), **firing patched round balls**, any sights. Load from the bench.

Primitive Rifle: Any original or replica muzzle loading rifle (flint or percussion), **firing patched round balls**, open fixed iron sights and load from a pouch (not the bench).

Master Rifle: To shoot "Master Rifle" you need to have shot a perfect previous MLS contest or have won a "Top Gun" contest. A Master Rifle is any original, replica or home made replica muzzle loading rifle (flint or percussion), **firing patched round balls**. Open fixed iron sights are required. Load from the bench or from a pouch.

BPCR = Black Powder Cartridge Rifle: This is any original or replica Black Powder Cartridge Rifle with any sights. Load on the line. This could be a Sharps, a Henry, a Winchester, Cowboy Action Rifle, etc. COWBOY ACTION GUYS - COME OUT AND SHOOT "slowly" at MORE THAN 10 FEET - You might like it. Any ML Rifle firing Conicals will shoot in BPCR class.

Entry for the Pistol contest is \$1 for EF&GA members and \$2 for non-members. Entry for the Rifle contest is \$5 for EF&GA members and \$10 for non-members.

Muzzle Loading Silhouette 11/24/2024

This started out as a rain day event as the rain was coming down light, but steady between 06:00 and 7:30 am. November 24th was listed as a "Fun" shoot. That means the Shoot Chair can think up evil ways to confuse and challenge the shooters.

Pistol targets were set out at 15, 25 and 35 yards. Rifle targets were set out in reverse, non-standard order. Rams were set up at 55(ish) yards on the left. Standing Bears were set up at 70(ish) yards in the center. Pigs were set up at 45(ish) yards on the right.

Because of the low light conditions (rain), we started out with White Rams, but switched to Black as the clouds cleared and the sun came out (briefly). Southwest wind at 8 to 10 MPH came up by 10:00.
