## In Memory of Mike Lange

Mike Lange was a humble man and as surely as I write this, I know he would be telling me to stop. So this simple tribute is not for Mike, it is for all of us left behind, for all of us whose lives he touched while he was here among us.

Most of us are aware that Mike was an incredible marksman and usually won every competition he entered regardless of the type of firearm. We are also aware of his highly successful hunting ability both here and abroad. Most are aware of his great love for the outdoors. Probably fewer are aware of his influence during the formative years of the Escondido Fish and Game Association. Mike was instrumental in many of the programs we currently enjoy at our association - a single example would be the black powder activities available today. In April of 1979, Mike and his close friend, the late Ron Moran, introduced the first black powder silhouette match at EF&GA. That competition continues to draw an enthusiastic following 33 years later, and has spawned other related events which are a part of our annual calendar of events.

The true measure of this man can best be seen in the number of lives he touched throughout the years. His long career as a public educator meant that countless young people were influenced by him, and taught life lessons extending far beyond the subject matter of his curriculum. He continued to teach beyond the classroom as he helped many of us at the range either directly or indirectly, and he was always willing to assist if someone asked for guidance. Mike was an inspiration and he will be missed by all who knew him - and I know I speak for so many of us as we wish him Godspeed on his journey. Like it or not Mike, on many occasions we will be lifting a glass to salute you.

Mike is survived by his wonderful wife Joanne and the son he was so proud of, Jeff.

# RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Thursday night, 14 June '12, at the General Meeting, the new Board of Directors' were inducted. It looks to be an interesting year in the works. Let us all support our new Board of Directors'.

Several members have asked me when the new membership year code stickers will be mailed. Ms. Juli Everett, our Association Clerk, noted that she will begin mailing them in the next couple of weeks. If you receive an envelope from The Association that appears to be empty, look harder inside the envelope. The code sticker may have moved into a corner and become hard to see, as has happened in the past and the envelope with the sticker has been trashed.

Also at the General Meeting. Mr. Norm Porst reviewed the new method for entry into the range and member identification. The new method will be a card swipe

system in place of the four digit keypad entry code. The swipe cards will be color coded for Youth, Junior and Adult members. They will also have a photograph of the member under the laminate cover. This new card will help in identifying members on the range and will be phased in during the upcoming membership year. Norm and Juli Everett will be setting up a camera system to take your photograph for the swipe card, so watch for that information in upcoming bulletins.

The equipment for the swipe card system will be installed in the next few months and the new card swipe system will run concurrently with the key pad system. The key pad system will remain in place along with the swipe card reader. There are several uses for the key pad that require it stay.

I receive several calls each month inquiring about various sanctioned shoots that are held monthly at the range. I advise the callers and you folks as well, to check the monthly bulletin. On the next to last page of the bulletin is a listing of each activity Shoot Chair. You can call the Shoot Chairs and they will be happy to answer all of your questions and sign you up for the shoot as well.

I also receive questions regarding how long our target backings and frames last. Last February we started using the polymer target backing in place of the cardboard and they were received with positive reviews. The polymer backings are a bit more expensive but last much longer than cardboard. We use approximately 14 polymer target backing sheets a week. The majority by far are used on the pistol range. I do not have any usage numbers for the cardboard target backing, but it was much higher than the new polymer backing.

That brings me to the target frames themselves. It is hard to get a real number on frame usage, but it is somewhere around five a week, four of which are on the used up pistol range. By used up I mean shot up beyond repair. Some pistol range shooters are real hard on our target frames and "shoot'em up quick".

**Range Safety Tip of the Month.** Know your target and what is behind it. And in our case, what is around it. "What is around your target" is really important on the pistol range in keeping our target frames whole (no pun intended). It is almost as if there are pistol shooters, and in some cases rifle shooters, that intentionally targeting the frames.

**Second Safety Tip of the Month.** While shooting on the 100 yard range at fifty yards and greater, and on the pistol range at 50 yards, check the trap range to make sure that it is safe to go "down range" and service your targets. There have been several instances in the past few months where someone walked into the line of fire of the trap range. Getting hit by shotgun pellets is uncomfortable at best.
