From the Second Seat


Well, as you all know the election for Board of Directors is finished. I would



MORE ACTION BY YOUR CALIFORNIA LAWMAKERS

Senate Bill 396 (Hancock) BANS the POSSESSION of any magazine with a capacity to accept more than ten cartridges, including currently legally possessed "grandfathered large capacity" magazines. SB 396 passed in the state Senate by a 25 to 14 vote.

Senate Bill 53 (DeLeon) requires persons to buy an annual ammunition purchase permit, requires the registration and thumbprint of the purchaser for each ammunition purchase, and bans online and mail order sales of ammunition to Californians. SB 53 passed in the state Senate by a 23 to 15 vote.

Senate Bill 293 (DeSaulnier) BANS the sale of conventional handguns, if the

state Department of Justice approves the sale of "Owner Authorized – Smart" handgun technology. SB 293 passed in the state Senate by a 22 to 14 vote.

Senate Bill 108 (Yee) requires mandatory locked storage of firearms in a locked house regardless of whether anyone is present. SB 108 passed in the state Senate by a 21 to 17 vote.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

One of the things I was a bit concerned about when I agreed take on the position of Chief RSO was how do I come up with enough material to write a page every month in the newsletter? Turns out not to be a problem so far! There is constantly something going on at the range that the RSOs or other members need to be informed about.

Most of the RSOs have internet access. When you are on duty and an issue comes up I encourage you to go to the comments section and write it up. The issue may not rise to the level of a reportable offense, but it could be a comment on how you handled a particular situation and another RSO might benefit from reading about it. It might also be a request for input on how you might have handled the situation better.

There was a report that clay bird fragments were found on one of the pistol berms. There is absolutely no excuse for this. First the berms are there to prevent bullets skipping; they are not intended for any other purpose. A second reason for not shooting clay on the pistol range is that you are not allowed to shoot at objects on the ground. A third and final reason is that any RSO catching you shooting clays on the ground is fully authorized to pull your range I.D card. You can then talk to the Board of Directors about the prospects of getting it back.

Have you left anything behind? There is a growing of jackets etc. that have been left on the range. We won't delve into why, but if you left an item be sure to check the basket by the door just inside the club house. If the item has some value such as a scope or a rifle (yes, they have been left behind) the RSO on duty will see that it is placed in a secure place to await your retrieval.

Black powder shooters normally consider a weapon to be unarmed until it has been primed. As such it is common to load behind the firing line and prime the weapon just prion to firing. Do not load black power pistols behind the bench then move to the firing line to fire. Load, prime and fire from the bench. We do not want handguns to be handled behind the firing line.

That is all for now. Trust me there is more to come!
