This is a private membership association were we have tried to make sure that members meet our high standards for safety and trustworthiness.

# **BLACK POWDER NEWS**

Our June contest was scheduled to be a standard short range contest. Due to medical problems I was not able to attend. My thanks to those that stepped up and hosted the event to maintain our unbroken string of Muzzle Loading contests for many years. The July rifle contest is scheduled to be a Mid-Range contest with steel targets at 75, 100, and 125 yards. As always, we shoot Pistol at ranges of 25, 50 and 75 yards.

Note that July is the first shoot of our Black Diamond Silver Challenge for Cap and Ball revolvers. Your cumulative score for July through December makes you eligible to win a silver presentation Pietta revolver hosted by Ray Bucholz. Highest cumulative revolver score for the six contests wins.

### 2018 Guejito Rendezvous

Every year in June, the Escondido Fish & Game Association hosts a Mountain Man Rendezvous. The Rendezvous is a multi-gun event over two days to determine who is most skilled in a variety of disciplines. Participants use period correct firearms, firing patched round balls only. Tomahawk and Knife throwing skills are also tested. This year's event consisted of a rifle walk-thru on Saturday against 10 steel targets at "unknown" ranges from 15 to 125 yards. All the participants get two shots at each target for a possible 10 target score of 20 points. In the afternoon, there is a pistol walk-thru against 10 steel targets at "unknown" ranges from 25 to 70+ yards.

During the day, each participant has the opportunity to make 10 throws with the tomahawk and 10 throws with the knife. Depending on your throwing style, ranges are from 5 to 7 paces. Knife and Hawk must make 1 revolution to count for score. Each "Stick" earns 1 point. Each target has a playing card stuck to the center. Hitting the card earns an "X" to resolve ties.

On Sunday morning the participants shoot the Trade Gun category. Trade gun is a period correct smoothbore flintlock firing patched round ball. Sights are restricted to a bead or blade front sight and NO rear sight. 5 targets are set out at ranges from 25 to 70+ yards. Two shots are taken per target for a possible score of 10 points. For this contest, awards are given per category, as well as a Guejito Rendezvous award for top combined scores. With the above challenges defined please check out the scores on page 5. (Note, because of space limitations only the first three in each category are listed.)

# How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

**Description** – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

**Price** – A specific dollar amount as well as gualifiers give the reader important information. For example, \$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

**Contact Info –** This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

# **RULES TO LIVE BY**

- 1. Treat every firearm as if it were loaded
- **2. Never** point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot
- **3. Keep** your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire
- 4. Know your target and the surroundings

## A Proper Safety Brief by Patrick Russ

How many of you think that you could give a good safety brief, before a shooting event? The brief would have to include the four main safety rules, otherwise known as the "Rules to Live By", all rules pertaining to wild life, the use of eye and ear protection, the meaning of the different color lines, the meaning of and what to do when "Cease Fire" is called, as well as any particular rules pertaining to the event. It can be

a lot tougher than is sounds, especially if you're a Jr Shooter. As some of you know, that is exactly what the Jr. Program is teaching the kids to do. Under supervision from a responsible adult, the kids are taught how to give a proper safety brief. This includes knowing the material to the point that any notes that are used are only as a reminder, they do not just read from a script. They are expected to talk to their audience not just at them. They must show some personality, be loud enough for everyone to hear and they must keep everyone engaged in the brief. We teach them that, during the safety brief, they are in charge of everything that happens on the line. Including when people are talking during the brief, they know that they must, politely, ask them to be quiet and pay attention to the brief, if they continue to talk or disrupt the brief, that person will be asked to leave.

Most recently, one of our up and coming Jr Shooters did a safety brief for Jack Bryson's Basic Pistol class. Miss Kestrin Walsh (11yrs old) immediately took control of the group by asking everyone to stand behind the yellow line so that she could see everyone. At which point, she was able to give a great safety brief that included everything that was mentioned above. By immediately taking control, she got everyone's attention and by doing so she was able to make sure that everyone understood exactly what was expected of them. She then went on to out shoot everyone in the class. And, while Kestrin has excelled in giving the safety briefs, she is not alone. The Jr Program has been fortunate to have kids that are willing to work through their fear of public speaking and have become very proficient at doing so. Do they make mistakes? absolutely, but they are taught how to recover from those mistakes and make them a useful part of the safety brief. This is, at the very least, a challenge to anyone, including most adults; it can be terrifying for a young adult. But these kids are doing it and it is giving them invaluable skills that will last a lifetime.

So, I will ask again, after reading what you just read, how many of you think that you could give a proper safety brief?

The Jr program is extremely proud of Kestrin for stepping up to the challenge of doing a great safety brief to a class of adults. She is setting an outstanding example for her fellow Jr shooters to follow. This is what a future leader looks like!
